I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum / Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) <u>Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee</u> (BPAC) was called to order at 3:07 p.m. by Interim Chairperson A.J. Devies. [NOTE: Ms. Devies volunteered to serve as Interim Chair in the absence of the elected Chair and Vice Chair.] The roll was called and it was determined that there was a quorum.

II. Public Comment/Participation

No public comment.

III. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of October 10, 2012 BPAC Meeting Minutes

Mr. McCord stated the word "come" should be changed to "some" in the last sentence of Page 8.

MOTION: A motion to approve the amended October 10, 2012 BPAC meeting minutes was made by Ms. Grenham. The motion was seconded by Ms. Nicoulin and carried unanimously.

B. Review and Recommend Approval of the draft Urban Attributable (XU) Bicycle/Pedestrian Project Proposal Requirements and Scoring Criteria

Ms. Carter expressed concern about assigning cost overruns on the state highway system to FDOT, suggested omitting the reference on Page 2 of the XU Bicycle/Pedestrian Project Application.

Mr. McCord suggested including a statutory reference to hazardous walk/bike zones on Page 5 of the XU Bicycle/Pedestrian Project Application.

Ms. LaValley stated walk/bike zones should be defined by the applicable school district.

MOTION: A motion to recommend approval of the amended draft Urban Attributable (XU) Bicycle/Pedestrian Project Proposal Requirements and Scoring Criteria [with changes suggested by Ms. Carter] was made by Ms. Mason. The motion was seconded by Mr. Mostert and carried unanimously.

C. Review and Recommend Approval of a required Local Match for Urban Attributable (XU) Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects

MOTION:

A motion to recommend approval of a 10% required Local Match for Urban Attributable (XU) Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects was made by Mr. Mostert. The motion was seconded by Mr. Walters and carried unanimously.

D. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2012-XX amending the FY 2012/13 to FY 2016/17 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Keeth stated the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan amendment included in the FY 2012/13 to FY 2016/17 TIP amendment package has been withdrawn.

Ms. Carter stated the amendment for the Volusia County Schools Bicycle Safety Training is for the purchase of bicycles, two utility cargo trailers and various safety related items. Volusia County Schools intends to use the equipment for bicycle safety education programs. Total project cost is \$57,420.

MOTION:

A motion to recommend approval of Resolution 2012-XX amending the FY 2012/13 to FY 2016/17 TIP was made by Ms. Mason. The motion was seconded by Ms. Grenham and carried unanimously.

E. Cancellation of the December 12, 2012 BPAC meeting

MOTION:

A. Presentation on Bicycle & Pedestrian Safety: Award-Winning Public Service Announcements Created by Students in Volusia County Schools

Mr. Harris stated the Public Service Announcements (PSA), created by students attending University High School, won awards in a contest sponsored by Volusia County Schools Safety initiatives Committee. Each PSA was a maximum of 30 seconds long and based on the theme: "There's no APP for Patience: Patience can save a life."

B. Discussion of the BPAC'S role in ranking Transportation Alternatives Project Applications

Mr. Harris stated the TIP Subcommittee, made up of members of the BPAC, CAC and TCC, has been working on new project criteria for Transportation Alternatives. They will be evaluating and ranking project applications submitted in the next Call for Projects. The BPAC Project Review Subcommittee will be evaluating and ranking project applications submitted for XU funding.

(Adopted on January 26, 2010)

PREAMBLE

The following sets forth the bylaws, policies, and procedures which shall serve to guide the proper functioning of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC), a committee serving in an advisory capacity to the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO). The intent is to provide procedures and policies for the BPAC for fulfilling the requirements of the Federal Highway Act of 1962, as amended, and subsequent laws setting forth requirements for transportation planning for all modes of travel and to ensure the accomplishment of the planning tasks within a cooperative framework properly related to comprehensive planning on a continuous basis.

SECTION 1.0: BYLAWS OF THE BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE (BPAC)

This document serves to outline the organization and functions of the BPAC as well as the mission and goals of the committee. The mission of the BPAC is as follows:

"Create and implement a regional plan for the continuing enhancement and expansion of the bicycle and pedestrian network. We will support activities that encourage and provide for a safe and balanced transportation system that promotes connectivity, mobility, health and an improved quality of life."

The Goals of the BPAC have been divided into Plan Implementation and Community Outreach/Public Awareness and Safety and are as follows:

Plan Implementation

- To identify and map existing and proposed facilities.
- To develop a prioritized list of projects into a TPO wide implementation program for improving the bicycle and pedestrian network.
- To formulate, review and identify opportunities for the use of alternative transportation modes.
- To encourage the implementation of uniform design standards.
- To recommend funding/implementation strategies.
- To promote coordination among governmental and non-governmental agencies as well as other organizations to implement the mission.
- To provide for the safety of all users and conform to ADA standards.

Community Outreach/Public Awareness and Safety

- To promote an ongoing education program that will raise awareness, encourage a
 heightened recognition of safe practices, and improve perceptions and attitudes of
 motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- To promote the importance of bicycle and pedestrian mobility for transportation, recreation, health and wellness.

- To promote coordination among governmental and non-governmental agencies as well as
 other organizations to foster public awareness and safety.
- To cultivate partnerships that assist in the funding, planning, development, and implementation of the community outreach, public awareness, and safety programs.
- To promote the enforcement of existing traffic laws as related to bicycle and pedestrian safety.

SECTION 1.1: MEMBERSHIP APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATION, AND TERMS OF OFFICE

A. The BPAC shall consist of 19 voting members made up of private citizens; non-voting members shall consist of City representatives, highway and transportation planners, professional engineers, and those technical personnel made available by the various municipalities. The membership shall include, but not be limited to, the following members:

VOTING MEMBERSHIP:

1. TPO Appointees - Each voting member of the TPO Board appoints a citizen that is not a member of City or County staff.

NON-VOTING MEMBERSHIP:

- 1. Technical Staff Appointees (appointed by TPO Chair) 1 person from a Large City, 1 person from Small city, 1 person from County Traffic Engineering, and 1 person from County Growth and Resource Management (appointments to be approved and confirmed every two (2) years).
- 2. School Board Appointee 1 person from the School Board
- 3. VOTRAN Appointee 1 person from VOTRAN
- 4. FDOT Appointee 1 person from the Florida Department of Transportation
- B. Each voting member shall be designated in writing by the governing body of said governmental unit. Each voting member may be represented by an alternate or alternates designated in writing by the governing body of said governmental unit. Alternates may vote only in the absence of the member on a one vote per member basis.
- C. Municipalities and agencies in selecting their non-voting representatives, shall name only those technically qualified persons employed by a government or governmental agency.
- D. One or more alternates should be named, approved, and confirmed for each non-voting member, provided the recommended alternate meets the technical qualifications set forth in the preceding items.
- E. Each BPAC representative is expected to demonstrate interest in the BPAC's activities through attendance of the regularly scheduled meetings except for reasons of an

unavoidable nature. In said case of unavoidable nature, each representative should ensure that their alternate attends. No more than three (3) consecutive unexcused absences will be allowed by the representative or their alternate. A Subcommittee of Administrative Affairs shall deal with consistent unexcused absences and is empowered to recommend a replacement from the City or agency the member represents.

F. Voting members and their alternates shall serve at the pleasure of their respective TPO Board member for an indefinite term as determined by said TPO Board member.

SECTION 1.2: OFFICERS AND DUTIES

- A. The BPAC shall hold an organizational meeting as a part of the regular meeting in June for the purpose of electing the Chair and Vice-Chair from the voting membership.
- B. Officers shall be elected by a majority of the voting members present at the June meeting and shall serve a term of one year.
- C. BPAC Officers cannot serve more than two consecutive terms for the same office. At no time may a TPO staff member chair the BPAC.
- D. The Chair or Vice-Chair will meet with the TPO Staff to develop the agenda for the BPAC meeting. TPO Staff will provide timely input/materials for the BPAC agenda.
- E. The Chair shall preside at all meetings and, in the event of his/her absence or at his/her direction, the Vice-Chair shall assume the powers and duties of the Chair. In addition, the Chair shall attend the regular scheduled TPO Board meetings in order to provide a brief presentation on the BPAC's activities. The Chair will also serve on the TPO Board as a non-voting member.
- F. Annually, nominations from the floor will be provided by those committee members present for the election of the officers of Chair and Vice-Chair.

SECTION 1.3: MEETINGS

- A. Regularly scheduled meetings of the BPAC shall be held on a day and time agreed upon annually by the Committee. Regular meeting dates and times may be changed by action of the Committee (BPAC) to accommodate desirable changes because of holidays and/or other reasons.
- B. Special meetings may be called by the Chair or by initiative of two or more members petitioning the Chair. Reasonable notice must be provided to the members and alternates for special meetings.

- C. Nine (9) of the voting members on the Committee (BPAC) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- D. The TPO staff is responsible for the minutes of the meetings and for all notices and agendas for future meetings. The TPO shall furnish a Recording Secretary for all Committee (BPAC) meetings.
- E. Notices and tentative agendas shall be sent to members and alternates five (5) working days prior to the regular meeting dates.
- F. Meetings will be open to the public and press.
- G. If the bylaws do not address a particular issue that comes before the Board, and if the Statute that the BPAC is operating under does not cover said item, then *Robert's' Rules of Order* shall take precedence.

SECTION 1.4: RESPONSIBILITIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE BPAC

- A. The BPAC is responsible for reviewing plans, policies, and procedures as relates to bicycle and pedestrian issues in the Volusia TPO Planning Area and for making recommendations to the TPO Board that are pertinent to these subjects.
- B. BPAC recommendations to the TPO Board shall be based upon the technical sufficiency, accuracy, and completeness of studies and plans and/or programs.
- C. The BPAC shall make priority recommendations to the TPO Board and/or other agencies responsible for plan and program implementation based upon the needs as determined by technical studies.
- D. The BPAC will be responsible to the TPO Board for coordinating all public relation matters concerning bicycle and pedestrian issues within the Volusia TPO Planning Area.
- E. The BPAC shall serve as an advisory committee regarding bicycle and pedestrian matters to any and all duly constituted areawide transportation authorities and/or boards, as well as areawide planning boards or councils for physical development, health, social, or comprehensive planning upon direct request of such authorities, boards, or councils.
- F. The BPAC shall provide the opportunity at each of its meetings for citizens to comment or be heard on any matter pertinent to bicycle and pedestrian issues in the Volusia TPO Planning Area. Comments on specific items as shown on the agenda shall be in writing and shall be read by the Chair or his/her designee at the appropriate time.
- G. The BPAC shall, when feasible and desirable to do so, utilize any means that may be suggested or devised to provide for citizen participation in the planning process for bicycle and pedestrian issues

H. Recommended changes in the bylaws require a simple majority vote of the BPAC members at any meeting, providing that all voting members have received written copies of proposed amendments at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting. The BPAC recommended changes must be presented to the TPO Board for review and approval.

SECTION 1.5: SUBCOMMITTEES

- A. Subcommittees shall be designated by the BPAC as necessary to investigate and report on specific subject areas of interest to the BPAC.
- B. Subcommittees shall be designated as necessary to deal with administrative and legislative procedures relating to the BPAC. These may include:
 - 1. Administrative Affairs
 - Bylaws

V. Presentations and Discussion Items

A) Presentation on the Florida Department of Transportation Work Program

Background Information:

Each year, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) develops the Five Year Work Program in accordance with Section 339.135, Florida Statutes. The five year work program is an ongoing process that is used to forecast the funds needed for upcoming transportation system improvements scheduled for the next five years.

The development of this Work Program involves extensive coordination with local governments, including Metropolitan Planning Organizations and other city and county officials. In urbanized areas, Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) have the responsibility to develop transportation plans and prioritize transportation needs. In non-metropolitan areas, county commissions establish priorities. FDOT implements the transportation improvements identified by the MPOs and local governments. The implementation process results in the Work Program, which includes financial information about transportation projects. Each year, new projects are added to the program in the fifth year of the cycle ensuring that the financial balance forecast for the first four years is maintained. When a new fifth year is added to the cycle, the current year drops out of the plan, introducing a new five year work program. Public hearings are held in each of the seven transportation districts and a statewide public hearing is held by the Florida Transportation Commission. The Florida Transportation Commission then performs an in-depth review of the Work Program and presents the results to the Executive Office of the Governor.

Mr. Jim Brown, FDOT TPO Liaison, will deliver a brief presentation on the FDOT Work Program.

B) Presentation on the Corridor Improvement Program (CIP) Phase II: Assessment of US 1

Background Information:

The Corridor Improvement Program (CIP) is Task 5.08 in the Volusia TPO's adopted Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). FDOT has partnered with the TPO in pursuing coordinated efforts to help improve the safety and operational efficiency of corridors for all users of the transportation system.

Phase I - Assessment of the US 1/SR 5 Corridor from the Brevard County line to I-95 in Ormond Beach included the collection and review of pertinent studies, plans and analyses that have been completed to-date. Representatives of the TPO, FDOT, Votran and Volusia County worked closely with the staff of local jurisdictions and various stakeholders along the corridor in this assessment process. Projects were identified by themes and an interactive geographical information system (GIS) database was developed to synthesize the projects from these studies. The results of this effort can be viewed TPO on the Volusia website at: http://www.volusiatpo.org/resources/corridor-improvement-program-cip-3/. The completion of the CIP Phase I: Assessment of US 1 is a significant step towards realizing the shared goals for this very important corridor in Volusia County.

Phase II - Corridor Review of US 1/SR 5 from the Brevard County line to I-95 in Ormond Beach is being funded and managed by FDOT. With the support of the TPO, they will be working with the stakeholders to:

- Understand the current and future anticipated travel patterns along US 1
- Identify the vision for the corridor and how it supports desired local and regional mobility, local community livability and economic development goals and needs
- Outline a strategic approach to accomplish the vision and mobility goals
- Identify specific action items (program, policy, and/or infrastructure), their prioritization and timing, and potential funding mechanisms to implement the vision.

Ms. Judy Pizzo, FDOT Systems Planner, will deliver a brief presentation on the CIP Phase II: Assessment of US 1.

US 1 Corridor Improvement Program Phase II Introductory Fact Sheet

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has partnered with the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (VTPO) to conduct Phase II of the US 1 Corridor Improvement Program. The study focuses on US 1 from the Brevard County line to Interstate 95 and concluded with the desire to improve multi-modal travel (including bicycle, pedestrian and transit travel) along and across US 1.

Phase I was a data collection effort and assessment of existing and adopted studies along the corridor. The development of this work effort involved working with the staff of local representatives of all the jurisdictions along that corridor. Phase II will build upon these results and will determine the most effective way for US 1 to better serve bicyclists, pedestrians and transit, while still maintaining suitable automobile capacity. The project will consider the local jurisdictions' plans, desires and future visions and the function of US 1 from a corridor-wide and regional perspective. During this project, FDOT and their consultant with the support of the VTPO will be working with the stakeholders to:

- Understand the current and future anticipated travel patterns along US 1;
- Identify the vision for the corridor and how it supports desired local and regional mobility, local community livability and economic development goals and needs;
- Outline a strategic approach to accomplish the vision and mobility goals; and
- Identify specific action items (program, policy, and/or infrastructure), their prioritization and timing, and potential funding mechanisms to implement the vision.

This effort will involve working with the municipalities along the corridor to help define unique "Community Character Districts" which will be the basis for how bicycle, pedestrian, transit and auto mobility should be considered. These districts will serve to represent the existing and future land use context, community character and future desired role of the roadway right-of-way from the perspective of the communities and stakeholders.

Phase II of this project will be conducted over an 18 months period. The early activities will be to collect and analyze transportation and land use data and to engage stakeholders in brief interviews to best understand the immediate and long-term opportunities and issues surrounding the corridor. D) Discussion of a Prioritized List of Accessible Pedestrian Signal Intersections

Background Information:

Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS) provide information in non-visual formats (such as audible tones, speech messages and/or vibrating surfaces). APS detectors may be pushbuttons or passive detection devices. APS are typically integrated into the pushbutton, so the audible tones and/or messages come from the pushbutton housing. They have a pushbutton locator tone and tactile arrow, and can include audible beaconing and other special features. The installation of APS at signalized locations should be based on an engineering study, which should consider the following factors:

- Potential demand for accessible pedestrian signals
- A request for accessible pedestrian signals
- Traffic volumes during times when pedestrians might be present, including periods of low-traffic volumes or high turn-on-red volumes
- Complexity of traffic signal phasing
- Complexity of intersection geometry

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is currently working on evaluating state road intersections for the installation of APS. The Volusia TPO is engaging in discussions with stakeholders to determine the need for APS at intersections along both state and local roads. The discussions will include gathering information on pedestrian travel patterns and potential locations for APS at selected intersections. The goal is to create a prioritized list of intersections requiring APS within the planning area. The prioritized list will be subject to adoption by the Volusia TPO.

Dear Commissioner Gilliand.

Federal and state laws require that a metropolitan planning organization (MPO) be designated for each urbanized area with a population of more than 50,000 individuals, as defined by the U.S. Bureau of the Census. The designation or redesignation of a MPO requires agreement between the Governor and local governments representing 75 percent of the affected population including the largest incorporated city. The Governor and the MPO must also agree to the metropolitan planning area boundary and the voting membership of the MPO.

Additionally, s. 339.175, F.S., requires the Governor to review the composition of MPO membership in conjunction with the decennial census and reapportion it to comply with statutory requirements. On behalf of the Governor the department will consult with your MPO to determine if any modifications to the metropolitan planning area boundary, Board membership apportionment plan, and other related documents are needed based on the 2010 Census.

Enclosed are relevant excerpts of federal and state laws and regulations and other background information to assist in this effort. The Department of Transportation district staff will be contacting your staff in the near future to initiate the consultative process. Any needed membership apportionment plan changes be forwarded no later than February 1, 2013, to Ms. Yvonne Arens, 605 Suwannee Street, M.S. 28, Tallahassee, Florida 32399.
