1. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Board meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by TPO Chairperson Sander. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with thirteen voting members and four non-voting members physically present; and two voting members virtually present.

Ms. Pruneau announced that Council Member White, Ponce Inlet, was the voting member for the Small City Alliance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

MOTION: A motion was made by Council Member Johansson to allow remote participation. The motion was seconded by Council Member White and carried unanimously.

There were no public comments.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mayor Chasez to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cantu and carried unanimously.

4. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of the FY 2024/25 Volusia-Flagler TPO's Independent Audit Report

Mr. Zach Chalifour, James Moore, gave an explanation of the FY 2024/25 audit report. He shared that he met with the Executive Committee earlier in the month to explain the status of the audit and that due to the government shutdown, the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) compliance supplement for auditing grants was behind schedule. Therefore, the TPO's audit report cannot be finalized until that guidance is issued, although no major changes or findings are anticipated once that occurs. He noted that any changes would come back to the Executive Committee and TPO Board. He also highlighted the continued improvement of the TPO each year, noting that there were no comments in the report for the first time in five years.

Mayor Chasez shared that she felt very encouraged by the TPO's progress in the audit.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Commissioner Briley to approve the FY 2024/25 Volusia-Flagler TPO's Independent Audit Report. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Gillis and passed unanimously.*

B. Review and Approval of Resolution 2025-17 Reaffirming the Policy for the Annual Allocation of Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (SU) Funding and Other State and Federal Funds Identified in the 2050 LRTP

Ms. Nicoulin explained that the next three agenda items were policy resolutions that guided the Call for Projects, opening at the end of the year. She discussed the set-aside funding and the 30/30/40 policy of funding for transit, bicycle and pedestrian, and traffic operations projects. She stated the language has been updated to reflect the 2050 LRTP. She added that the TCC recommended changing the second whereas clause on all the remaining resolutions to reflect the TPO's planning area of Volusia and Flagler Counties.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mayor Chazez to approve Resolution 2025-17 reaffirming the policy for the annual allocation of Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (SU) funding and other state and federal funds identified in the 2050 LRTP. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Heriot and passed unanimously.*

C. Review and Approval of Resolution 2025-18 Reaffirming the Policy for Defining the Local Match Requirements Placed on Local Governments for Projects Prioritized for Funding by the TPO

Ms. Nicoulin explained that there are no major changes since last year to this resolution, which defines and sets the local match percentage at 10%. She explained the difference between cost overruns and cost increases.

Mayor Chazez noted for newer board members that the threshold for the Executive Director to approve cost increases had been discussed extensively before choosing 50%.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Vice Mayor Gillis to approve Resolution 2025-18 reaffirming the policy for defining the local match requirements placed on local governments for prioritized projects for funding by the TPO. The motion was seconded by Council Member White and passed unanimously.*

D. Review and Approval of Resolution 2025-19 Reaffirming the Policy for Establishing and Maintaining Transportation Priority Projects

Ms. Nicoulin explained that this resolution sets the project rankings and categories. She explained that updated project cost estimates are completed on an annual basis, and there has been a change from last year to allow updated construction costs following the completion of the design phase.

MOTION: *A motion was made to approve Resolution 2025-19 reaffirming the policy for establishing and maintaining transportation priority projects. The motion was seconded by Council Member Johansson and passed unanimously.*

E. Review and Approval of the Priority Project Applications for Traffic Operations/Safety and Local Initiatives Projects, Transportation Planning Studies, and Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects

Ms. Nicoulin explained that the applications and criteria are included as a link in the agenda packet and stated that the Call for Projects dates are from December 1st through February 27th.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Vice Mayor Martin to approve the priority project applications for traffic operations/safety and local initiatives projects, transportation studies, and bicycle/pedestrian projects. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Briley and passed unanimously.*

F. Review and Approval of 2026 Volusia-Flagler TPO Policy Positions

Ms. Nicoulin reviewed the changes to the 2026 Volusia-Flagler TPO Policy Positions from the previous year.

Council Member Johansson stated that he felt language around flood mitigation may be worthwhile to add to the Policy Positions. The wording of the additional language was discussed among the members.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Council Member Johansson to add the wording “develop a resilient network of transportation infrastructure, including stormwater management” to the 2026 Volusia-Flagler TPO Policy Positions. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Werning and passed unanimously.*

MOTION: *A motion was made by Vice Mayor Gillis to approve the 2026 Volusia-Flagler TPO Policy Positions as amended. The motion was seconded by Council Member Miller and passed unanimously.*

5. Presentations, Status Reports, and Discussion Items

A. Presentation and Discussion of FDOT’s Tentative Five-Year Work Program for FY 2026/27 to FY 2030/31

Ms. Powell explained what the tentative Five-Year Work Program is and noted that this time it is in a compressed cycle, beginning in January rather than March. She stated that the corresponding maps and reports are available online. She went over the timeline and discussed the approach, adjustments, policies, and statutes. She provided a funding breakdown and detailed the key projects.

Commissioner Cantu asked about difficulties with the project on Clyde Morris Boulevard. Ms. Powell said that she would find out more information for her. Commissioner Cantu also inquired about the PD&E study done on LPGA Boulevard. Ms. Powell stated that the project would be split into two separate projects.

Council Member Miller advocated for Flagler County to receive a greater percentage of funding since \$853 million is 6.5% of the total funding, but Flagler County has 19% of the population. The funding formula is disproportionate, and he noted he disagreed with that.

Commissioner Belhumeur noted that SR A1A should be included in the Work Program. Ms. Powell commented that she would look into it.

B. Presentation and Discussion of the Draft Flagler County FY 2026/2035 Transit Development Plan (TDP)

Mr. Jonathan Roberson, CUTR, gave a presentation to introduce the draft Flagler County FY 2026-2035 Transit Development Plan (TDP). He explained the highlights of the current transit system, existing and projected conditions, the project schedule, and the upcoming activities. He provided business cards with a QR code to an online survey to allow for public comments.

Discussion ensued regarding the need for more staffing of drivers to increase trips and ways to partner with local employers.

C. Presentation and Discussion of VoTran’s 50 Years of Service

Ms. Bobbie King, Volusia County Transit Services Director, gave a presentation detailing VoTran’s 50th anniversary event and the administrative changes to follow. Some changes include updated logos for VoTran and VoRide, and the rebranding of Votran Gold under its new name, VoAccess.

D. FDOT Report

Ms. Powell reviewed the FDOT report; gave an update on the SR 44 Kepler Road roundabout project; and a reminder that November 14th was National Seatbelt Day. She noted that NHTSA reports that seat belt usage was at 90% in 2024.

Ms. Christine Barone gave an in-depth look at the construction of the SR-44 roundabout project. Chairperson Sander stated that he appreciated the insight into how these projects are implemented.

6. Executive Director’s Report

Ms. Nicoulin noted that the SR 44 roundabout project had been one of the TPO’s top priorities prior to her becoming Executive Director in 2017. She stated that it showed a great partnership between the TPO, Volusia County, and FDOT.

She offered a reminder for the Holiday Open House and toy drive taking place December 11th from 4-6 p.m. She stated that the toys donated would be distributed to the Department of Children and Families and The Neighborhood Center of West Volusia.

Ms. Nicoulin then let the board know about the recent passing of Mr. Dave Castagnacci, the original Executive Director of VCARD and a member of the TPO’s Citizens’ Advisory Committee. She recognized his effort in the community.





Review and Approval of Resolution 2026-02 Adopting the 2026 Volusia-Flagler TPO Transportation Safety Targets

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

Federal law requires state DOTs and TPOs to conduct performance-based planning by tracking performance measures and setting data-driven targets. The first of the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) performance management rules that became effective was assessing the conditions of roadway safety (PM1) by requiring state DOTs and TPOs to set targets for five performance measures that assess the number and rate of fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads, including specific targets related to vulnerable road users. FDOT established statewide targets for calendar year 2026 on August 31, 2025. Given FDOT's firm belief that every life counts, the statewide target for each safety performance measure is zero for the following five measures:

- Number of Fatalities
- Number of Serious Injuries
- Rate of Fatalities per 100 million vehicle miles traveled
- Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million vehicle miles traveled
- Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries

TPOs must annually establish targets for each performance measure by supporting the target established by the state and agree to plan and program projects that contribute to the accomplishment of the state target, or by establishing an independent target. In recent years, the Volusia-Flagler TPO has supported the state target of zero for PM1. TPO staff recommends continuing to support the FDOT PM1 Safety Target of Zero for each performance measure.

Resolution 2026-02 adopts the Volusia-Flagler TPO Safety Performance Targets for the calendar year 2026.





Number of Fatalities





Number of Serious Injuries




OVERVIEW

The first of Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) performance management rules establishes measures to assess safety on all public roads and the process for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Florida's Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) to establish and report their safety targets.*






ANNUAL FATALITIES




ANNUAL SERIOUS INJURIES




FATALITY RATE (PER HUNDRED MILLION VMT)

STATEWIDE TARGETS

FDOT establishes statewide safety targets for the following calendar year as part of the [HSIP Annual Report](#), which must be submitted by August 31 each year.

Given FDOT's firm belief that every life counts, the target set for all safety performance measures is ZERO.

MPO TARGETS

MPOs must set targets by February 27 of each year (within 180 days after FDOT sets targets). MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own targets for the MPO planning area.

MPOs must include the most recent reported performance and targets with each TIP update. The TIP must describe how the investments contribute to achieving the performance targets. The LRTP must include a System Performance Report that discusses the performance of the transportation system and progress achieved in meeting the targets over time.

ASSESSMENT OF SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS

FHWA considers a state to have met or made significant progress when at least four of the five safety targets are met or the actual outcome is better than baseline performance. Florida is making progress towards achieving the targets established for serious injuries but not yet for fatalities or non-motorized users.

As requested by FHWA, FDOT annually develops an [HSIP Implementation Plan](#) to highlight strategies it will undertake in support of these targets. MPOs are encouraged to review this Plan each year to identify strategies appropriate for their planning area.

FHWA will not assess MPO target achievement. However, FHWA will review MPO adherence to performance management requirements as part of periodic transportation planning process reviews.

ADOPTING TRANSPORTATION SAFETY TARGETS**

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia and Flagler Counties; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the FHWA issued a final rule based on section 1203 of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) and with consideration to provisions in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), which identified national transportation goals, outlined standards for measuring and reporting safety data and established five safety performance measures; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 23 C.F.R. 490.209(a), the Florida Department for Transportation (FDOT), as part of the annual development of the State Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP), has developed safety targets for each of the five safety performance measures; and

WHEREAS, 23 C.F.R. 490.209(c), requires that each Metropolitan Planning Organization establish targets annually for each safety performance measure; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has adopted statewide targets for all safety performance measures (PM 1) as zero; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia-Flagler TPO wishes to adopt its safety performance measures and targets as those of FDOT and agrees to work with the State to address areas of concern for performance-based planning within the metropolitan area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Volusia-Flagler TPO that the:

1. Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization supports and adopts the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Safety Performance Targets for Calendar Year 2026 and agrees to plan and program projects that contribute towards the accomplishment of the Performance Measures and Targets; and the
2. Volusia-Flagler TPO Board and advisory committees have reviewed and endorsed the safety-related transportation performance data and targets; and the
3. Chairperson of the Volusia-Flagler TPO (or his/her designee) is hereby authorized and directed to submit these targets to the:
 - a. Florida Department of Transportation; and
 - b. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and the
 - c. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation).



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The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is implementing safety improvements and resurfacing the roadway along Granada Boulevard (State Road (S.R.) 40) from U.S. 1 to S.R. A1A (Ocean Shore Boulevard/South Atlantic Avenue), except for the bridge over the Halifax River in Ormond Beach.

In addition to repaving this segment of S.R. 40, the travel lanes along this segment of Granada Boulevard will be slightly narrowed to 10 feet, and subtle changes in the roadway alignment will be introduced to encourage slower driving speeds. Pedestrian safety improvements include a new mid-block pedestrian crossing between Vining Court and Bovard Avenue. Upgrades will also be made to existing crossings at Washington Street and west of Beach Street.

The mid-block crossings located west of Beach Street and between Vining Court and Bovard Avenue will be slightly elevated to be level with the sidewalk and will include in-road lighting to further alert motorists of people crossing the roadway and encourage reduced speeds.

All three crossings will be equipped with a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) and overhead lighting to increase driver awareness and visibility of pedestrians. A PHB is an overhead traffic device that remains dark until a pedestrian activates the beacon, signaling for drivers to come to a stop and for pedestrians to cross. Audible pedestrian signals and detectable warning pads will also be installed at each crossing to provide accessibility for the visually impaired.

Intersection lighting will be upgraded, and new mast-arm poles will be installed at the Ridgewood Avenue and S.R. A1A traffic signals. New bicycle lanes next to turn lanes, called keyholes, minor drainage improvements, median modifications, and a new directional median to reduce left-turn conflicts at Washington Street will also be included. 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

Flagler County Design & Construction Projects Report

December 2025

Road & Bridge Program

- Walnut Avenue Paving Project – 100% Design is complete. Plans finalization was concluded in November 2025 and accepted by the Department. USACOE permitting is ongoing.
- Westmayer Place Paving Project – Final Design is complete and has been accepted by the Department. Project closeout is underway.
- Canal Avenue (CR 302) from Water Oak Road to Forest Park – Final design is complete and has been accepted by the Department. Contract and grant are in the process of closeout. Public meeting was held on November 4, 2025, at Hidden Trails Park in Daytona North.
- Jungle Hut Road from A1A to beach access – 100% design plans are anticipated in January 2026. Plans finalization and permitting are anticipated to conclude in February 2026. Community Meeting was held on September 30, 2025, 5-7pm at Hammock Community Center.
- Forest Park Street from CR 90 to SR 100 – 90% design phase is underway. Community Meeting was held on November 4, 2025, 5-7pm at Hidden Trails Community Center in Daytona North. Plans finalization and permitting are anticipated to conclude in July 2026.
- Flagler Central Commerce Parkway Connector Project – Construction of the roadway project is complete and was accepted by the County and the Department in September 2025. Project closeout activities are currently underway.
- Old Haw Creek Road – Final Inspection and acceptance of construction was on July 17, 2025. Contract is in the process of closeout and preparation of final invoice for reimbursement. Staff is coordinating with FDOT to receive reimbursement of expenses incurred during construction coordination with FDOT's adjacent SR11 project. Supplemental Agreement was approved by the BOCC on December 15, 2025.
- CR 205 Resurfacing Project – Required design update was finalized in preparation of construction contractor procurement. Funding Agreement was approved by the BOCC on December 15, 2025. Advertisement for Bid is planned for early 2026. Construction is anticipated to commence in the second quarter 2026.



- CR 304 Resurfacing Project (CR 305 to SR-11) – Design Plans update and permit activities are anticipated to begin in the second quarter 2026. Construction is anticipated to commence in the third quarter 2026.
- First Avenue Phase 2 Drainage – Design phase is underway. Community Meeting was held on September 30, 2025, 5-7pm at Hammock Community Center. Plan finalization is scheduled for January 2026.

Sidewalk & Trail Program

- Bulow Creek Headwaters Regional Park – Planning phase is underway with the first public meeting held on June 4, 2025. Presentation/Update to County Commission was made at a BOCC workshop on September 15, 2025. A public meeting is scheduled for February 3, 2026. Planning efforts are anticipated to conclude in Summer 2026 when the project will transition into design & permitting.
- Trailhead for GST & Lehigh Trail – Coordination with the Department's CSC is underway and is being coordinated with planned Eco-Discovery Center. Design phase is anticipated to begin in the first quarter 2026.
- Old Kings Road South Trail (SR100 to County Line) – Design began in July 2025, and a 60% design submittal is anticipated in January 2026. Completion of design and permitting is anticipated by September 2026.

Vertical CIP Program

- Fire Rescue Station 51 – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on November 19, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on December 8, 2025, 11am-12pm. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.
- Fire Rescue Administration Station 50 – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on October 8, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 13, 2025, 10-11am. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.
- NEXUS Center – Substantial Completion date was September 25, 2025. Certificate of Occupancy was received in December 2025. Final construction and project closeout are underway.



- SMA Integrated Stabilization Unit – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on October 22, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 18, 2025, 1-2pm. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.
- Eco-Discovery Center – The BOCC approved award of Design-Build contract to The Collage Companies on September 15, 2025. Design-Builder has commenced preliminary design to establish the scope of the project.
- Multipurpose Emergency Preparedness Project – Task Work Order Four was issued to Design Build Team. This is the final Task Work Order needed to complete construction of all remaining work by June 30, 2026. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.

Stormwater Master Plan Program

- MalaCompra Canal Restoration and Resiliency – Design and Permitting phases are underway. Conceptual design phase was completed. Project completion is anticipated in July 2026.

Beach Management Plan Program

- Beach Reach 2 (North 7th St to Varn Park) – All permits have been received. Invitation to bid will be released in first quarter of 2026 and construction timing will depend on the contractor’s schedule. Contract will specify that the dredge project must be complete by September 1, 2026.
- Beach Reach 3 – The Professional Services Agreement with Moffatt & Nichol was approved by the BOCC on April 21, 2025. Field work for permitting studies began in May 2025 and continues. Project design activities are actively underway. Hardbottom mapping has been delayed due to field and weather conditions. An update was provided at the December 15th BOCC Workshop.
- Hammock Dunes Dune Restoration Project – Completed as of November 2025.
- Ocean Hammock/Hammock Beach and Golf Resort Emergency Dune Restoration Project – This interim emergency dune restoration project between Jungle Hut Road and the southern edge of Malacompra park was authorized under the Emergency Final Order for Hurricane Milton. Substantial completion was issued on December 15, 2025. The project is being funded jointly by FDEP and the OHPOA and HBAG Resort.



- FEMA Category G Dune Restoration Project – This emergency dune restoration project is underway from the southern end MalaCompra Park to River to Sea Preserve. Construction commenced on December 15, 2025, and is anticipated to continue through March 2026.

As FDOT focuses resources in support of Central Florida's transportation needs, the reThink Your Commute program will conclude on **January 31, 2026**.

Please remember to use your reThink Your Commute reward points and submit your reimbursable rides request by January 31, 2026. After that date, the program will no longer be active. This will include the discontinuation of the "reThink Your Commute" Application trip planner and the Reimbursable Rides emergency ride home program.
