Development of feeder bus concepts

- were based on a station location on Saxon Boulevard. The station was ultimately conjunction with FDOT's SunRail consultant HDR (April 2007). These concepts Initial route concepts were first based on Votran's West Side Transit Plan in constructed on Fort Florida Road.
- Letter of understanding between CFCRT and Votran signed in November 2007 establishing estimates of funding to supplement operations and maintenance of feeder bus service.
- November 2007 a new concept was developed including two express routes and an extension of an existing route.
- Due to increases in ridership on west side Votran routes, concepts were changed to two peak service routes serving established Votran stops.

Development of feeder bus concepts (cont'd)



Votran staff made two presentations to key players in west Volusia County referring to the feeder bus route concepts.

- Votran customers well but they thought it would be unlikely for commuters to use It was a clear consensus from the group that these routes would serve existing these routes due to long travel times to the station.
- options for additional express service for their review and consideration of funding. Following one of these presentations FDOT contacted Votran and requested
- Mall to the SunRail station with no stops in between. The cost to provide this route was estimated at \$345,000 with three A.M. trips to and from the station and three Votran staff developed 16 route options including an express route from Volusia P.M. trips to and from the station.
- One Of the 16, FDOT selected two additional express service options for funding. express route traveling along the U.S. 17-92 corridor and one express route serving Deltona and Orange City.



FDOT funding

SunRail feeder bus service will be operated using funding from FDOT.

Route concepts were designed based on available funding, existing customer demand, input from FDOT, SunRail consultants, input from Orange City and Deltona, and input received at West Volusia Summit meetings.

FDOT has allocated funding for four feeder bus routes.

Two routes will operate using existing Votran bus stops.

SunRail 31 is designed as express service with very limited stops.


