1. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum / Pledge of Allegiance

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) meeting was called to order at 2:02 p.m. by Chairperson Nic Mostert. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum

was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with ten voting and four non-voting members physically present, and one voting and one non-voting member virtually present.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Wendler to allow members attending virtually to participate and vote. The motion was seconded by Mr. Coletti and carried unanimously.*

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

2. Public Comment/Participation

There were no public comments.

3. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of the February 11, 2026 BPAC Meeting Minutes

Mr. Aufdenberg clarified that his comment on section 7A in the minutes regarding the sidewalks on Nova Road, should say that he advocated for wider sidewalks on Nova Road, stating that they are shared by multiple modes of transportation.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Lodge to approve the February 11, 2026 BPAC meeting minutes as amended to state that Mr. Aufdenberg advocated for wider sidewalks on Nova Road, stating that they are shared by multiple modes of transportation. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wendler and carried unanimously.*

B. Reappointment/Appointment of 2026 BPAC Project Review Subcommittee Members

Chairperson Mostert asked if the current members of the BPAC Project Review Subcommittee wished to continue to serve; no objections were voiced. He then asked if there were any new members who wished to serve; there were none.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Lodge to reappoint Ms. Ardito, Mr. Aufdenberg, Ms. Belin, Ms. Bonds, Mr. Coletti, Mr. Lodge, Mr. Mostert, and Mr. Wendler to the 2026 BPAC Project Review Subcommittee. The motion was seconded by Ms. Belin and carried unanimously.*

C. Reappointment/Appointment of 2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Subcommittee Members

Chairperson Mostert asked if the current members of the Transportation Improvement Subcommittee wished to continue to serve; no objections were voiced. He then asked if there were any new members who wished to serve; there were none.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Ms. Epps to reappoint Ms. Ardito and Mr. Storke to the 2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Subcommittee. The motion was seconded by Ms. McCalip and carried unanimously.*

4. Presentations and Discussion Items

A. Presentation and Discussion of the Proposed Reed Ellis Road Trail

Ms. Emily Bush, Bike/Walk Central Florida, gave a presentation on the proposed Reed Ellis Road Trail. She explained the overarching purpose of connecting three large conservation entities in southern Volusia County; D Ranch Preserve, Lake Monroe Preserve, and Beck Ranch Preserve through Reed Ellis Road. She explained the next steps in the process and how committee members could help.

Members discussed the connection between D Ranch Preserve and Beck Ranch Preserve, with the latter permitting cyclists.

Ms. Ardito noted that this project could help build a relationship with the Lake-to-Lake Tour through conservation trails to Okeechobee.

Mr. Wendler asked what the speed limit is through Reed Ellis Road. Ms. Bush stated that the speed limit is 45 mph, however, drivers maintain an 85th percentile speed of 56 mph.

B. Presentation and Discussion of Bike/Walk Central Florida's Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety Program

Ms. Bush gave a presentation on Bike/Walk Central Florida's Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety Program, stating that the Flagler County portion is funded by the TPO and Volusia County is funded by FDOT. She gave an overview of sign waving events, explained the evaluations of driver yield rates, and discussed the 2025 engineering insights.

Members discussed the driver yield rate data.

Mr. Coletti stated that the sidewalk on Old Kings Road and Town Center Boulevard is closed, causing issues crossing from one section of the Lehigh Trail to the other. Ms. Bush stated that if construction is present, they contact the Public Works Department to let them know.

Ms. Ardito asked about any plans regarding 17-92 and Dirksen Drive. Ms. Bush explained the crosswalk locations are chosen by the program partners and there is not an upcoming event in that location currently. Mr. Lodge requested that that crosswalk location be looked at.

Members discussed the logistics of sign waving events. Ms. Bush offered to let members borrow signs if they wanted to hold their own events.

Ms. Bush expressed her surprise at the willingness of community partners and law enforcement to attend sign waving events.

Members discussed including information on pedestrian safety in the mailings for registration renewals or driver's license renewals.

Ms. McCalip asked about how to report crosswalk light glitches. Ms. Bush suggested letting elected officials know and that FDOT would likely be able to help.

The statistical significance and potential errors in the data collected were discussed.

Members discussed the funding sources. Ms. Bush stated that funding comes from the TPO, local governments, and FDOT covers funding for the first 3 years as part of their Target Zero efforts.

Ms. Bush stated that there will be a membership program beginning in 2027.

C. Presentation and Discussion of the Clyde Morris Boulevard (SR 483) Corridor Improvement Project

Mr. Ty Garner, FDOT Project Manager, presented the upcoming Clyde Morris Boulevard Corridor improvement project, offering an overview, the project schedule, and renderings of the completed project. He highlighted the proposed pedestrian tunnel in front of the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University main entrance.

Chairperson Mostert asked if they intend to keep the overpass. Mr. Garner confirmed that they will.

Mr. Garner stated that during one evaluation, 1,700 pedestrians crossed using the crosswalk in one day. He also stated that there was an accident last October in which three students were hit in a crosswalk.

Ms. Belin asked about wheelchair accessibility. Mr. Garner said that everything will be ADA compliant.

Mr. Garner further explained the projected schedule of the project.

Mr. Harris asked if the pedestrian tunnel will close at night. Mr. Garner stated that the tunnel will remain open and lit by LED lighting at night as well as a number of other safety features provided.

Mr. Harris asked about the policy of not being permitted to stop in front of the airport runways. Mr. Garner stated there will be no changes to that policy.

Mr. Aufdenberg expressed concern for the lack of infrastructure on the east side, suggesting keeping the old sidewalks accessible during construction of the new sidewalks. Separating the uses of the sidewalk was discussed.

7. BPAC Member Comments

Mr. Coletti shared that he discovered through the Daytona Beach News Journal that Mr. Ramos is running for Deltona Mayor. He also asked about the crossing circle on Route 1 and Royal Palms Parkway. Ms. Bhattacharya stated that it would be complete March 12th. Mr. Coletti stated that he appreciates the new roundabout by Cody's Corner.

Ms. Bhattacharya responded to a few inquiries brought up in the previous BPAC meeting; she confirmed that sidewalks on Williamson Boulevard to Granada are five feet wide. Ms. Belin expressed concern that five feet was not wide enough. Ms. Bhattacharya stated that she would send Ms. Belin the project manager's contact information. Ms. Bhattacharya stated that the sidewalk on US 1 and Royal Palms Parkway was removed to install drainage and will be complete March 23rd. She updated that the bollards on the new trail at Courtland Boulevard have been removed. She stated that the incomplete sidewalk on Williamson Boulevard and LPGA Boulevard is not currently funded for construction. Mr. Aufdenberg asked who he should advocate to regarding this project. Ms. Bhattacharya suggested reaching out to Volusia County.

Mr. Mostert asked about the widening project at the Pioneer Trail interchange project. Ms. Bhattacharya stated that she would find out.

Ms. Ardito stated that the Spring-to-Spring Family Fun Ride is upcoming and suggested reaching out to her for a discount. She gave thanks to Mr. Aufdenberg for helping with the children during the Family Fun Rides.

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) outlines the annual activities and funding for the TPO over a two-year period. The next two-year UPWP will become effective July 1, 2026. The TPO's transportation planning activities are funded in large part through federal grants. These federally funded transportation planning activities must be identified and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and FDOT in advance of each fiscal year. The activities, products, and budgeted funds must be documented in the TPO's Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) which is updated every two years.

In January and February, UPWP tasks and funding allocations were discussed and presented to the BPAC for review and comment. Following these discussions, a full draft document was compiled and submitted to FDOT and FHWA for their review and posted for public comment. RESOLUTION OF THE VOLUSIA-FLAGLER TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2026/27 AND FY 2027/28 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the designated urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, 23 CFR 450.310, and Florida Statutes 339.175, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and Flagler County as defined by the Metropolitan Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 134, 23 CFR 450, and Florida Statutes 339.175, require the TPO and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to enter into an agreement clearly identifying the responsibilities for cooperatively carrying out the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) portion of the Metropolitan Planning Process and accomplishing the transportation planning requirements of state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, the TPO shall endorse and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required by 23 C.F.R. 450.300 through 450.324 and Florida Statutes 339.175, among which is the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP); and

WHEREAS, the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is a two-year work plan that identifies federal funding available to the TPO including metropolitan planning funds (PL Funds) authorized under 23 USC 104(f), Section 5305(d) transit planning funds and Urban Attributable (SU) funds; and

WHEREAS, the FY 2026/27 and FY 2027/28 UPWP was developed with input from the TPO Board and Advisory Committees and posted for a 30-day public review period.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization:

1. Adopts the FY 2026/27 and FY 2027/28 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP); and
2. Authorizes the Executive Director to execute any contracts or agreements necessary to reflect these changes.

Presentation and Discussion of the 2026 TPO Annual Call for Projects

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

The Volusia-Flagler TPO annually submits to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) a prioritized list of projects for implementation within the TPO planning area. These priorities are used by FDOT to program state and federal transportation funds. Programming commitments made by FDOT are included in its Five-Year Work Program and the TPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Projects on the Priority List come from a variety of sources including the Long Range Transportation Plan (which populates the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Roadway list and the Regionally Significant Non-SIS Roadway list); the SUN Trail Program (which populates the SUN Trail list); regional transit agencies (which populate the Transit Projects list), and local governments (which populate the lists for Traffic Operations Projects, Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects, Transportation Planning Studies, and Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Eligible Projects).

The List of Priority Projects is updated annually by the TPO, and this process begins with the Call for Projects to solicit project applications from local governments in the traffic operations, bicycle/pedestrian, and transportation planning studies categories. These project applications are ranked based on an established set of criteria by a subcommittee made up of members from the TPO advisory committees. From these rankings, the TPO develops a draft List of Priority Projects that it makes available for public review and comment. The List of Prioritized Projects is formally reviewed by the TPO advisory committees and adopted by the TPO Board during their June meeting.

TPO staff will lead a discussion on the List of Priority Projects and the process used to annually update the list, as well as provide a summary of the bicycle and pedestrian project applications received during this year's Call for Projects.
