I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum / Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) <u>Bicycle/Pedestrian</u> <u>Advisory Committee</u> (BPAC) was called to order at 3:02 p.m. by Chairperson Robert Storke. The roll was called and it was determined that there was a quorum.

II. Public Comment/Participation

None

III. Action Items

- A. Review and Approval of February 13, 2013 BPAC Meeting Minutes
 - MOTION: A motion to approve the February 13, 2013 BPAC meeting minutes was made by Ms. Devies. The motion was seconded by Ms. Grenham and carried unanimously.

B. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2013-XX reaffirming the Volusia TPO's policy for establishing and maintaining Transportation Priority Projects

Mr. Harris stated draft Resolution 2013-XX represents the annual review and affirmation of the Volusia TPO's policy for transportation priority projects. Last year, this resolution and the next one on the agenda were consolidated. This year, they've been separated in an effort to make them easier to understand. The Volusia TPO has 7 categories of projects. XU Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects are addressed in category #7. The policies for ranking and protecting the top 3 projects on the priority list remains unchanged from last year.

MOTION: A motion to recommend approval of Resolution 2013-XX reaffirming the Volusia TPO's policy for establishing and maintaining Transportation Priority Projects was made by Ms. Devies. The motion was seconded by Ms. Grenham and carried unanimously.

C. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2013-XX reaffirming the Volusia TPO's policy for the annual allocation of Surface Transportation Program XU funding and Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding

Mr. Harris stated Resolution 2013-XX refers to how the Volusia TPO allocates XU and TAP funds. Forty percent (40%) of the total XU funds are allocated for Traffic Operations/ITS/Safety projects, 30% of the total XU funds are allocated for bicycle and pedestrian projects and 30% of the total XU funds are allocated for transit projects. The 30% allocation for bicycle and pedestrian projects is subdivided into 10% that can be used for projects with a non-bicycle and pedestrian component. There is no cap on funding for bicycle and pedestrian projects, but there is a \$500,000 cap on funding for TAP projects.

Ms. Carter asked about using more than one source of funds towards a project to enhance it. Mr. Harris responded the resolution doesn't prevent the use of local matching funds. In fact, the use of those funds is encouraged to help leverage federal funds.

Mr. McCord asked if the resolution limit a project that required piping of a ditch to build a sidewalk. Mr. Harris responded if the piping of the ditch was a part of the project, then it would be eligible for funding and the resolution would not limit the project.

Dr. Aufdenberg asked how the protected ranking works. Mr. Harris responded the protected ranking keeps new projects from being ranked over projects in the top 3 positions on the priority list.

MOTION: A motion to recommend approval of Resolution 2013-XX reaffirming the Volusia TPO's policy for the annual allocation of XU and TAP funding was made by Ms. Devies. The motion was seconded by Ms. Grenham and carried unanimously.

D. Review and Recommend Approval of Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Letter 2013-03

Mr. Harris stated during review of the "Alert Today, Alive Tomorrow" resolution last month, the TPO Board requested Letter 2013-03 to show additional support for pedestrian safety laws. The letter is a draft and is intended for local law enforcement agencies.

Ms. Devies stated there are separate state statutes for stopping for visually impaired individuals and for mobility impaired pedestrians. Mr. Harris [after looking for the statutes in a handbook] agreed to research the statutes and verify it. Mr. Bustos stated the statute for visually impaired pedestrians is 1301 and the statute for mobility impaired pedestrians is 1303.

Mr. Harris asked if the BPAC prefers one or both of the statutes to be referenced in the letter. [The consensus was to include both statutes.]

Ms. Devies suggested using Volusia County statistics instead of statewide statistics.

Ms. Mason asked if the letter was going to be sent to the Flagler County Sheriff. Mr. Harris responded yes, if the Flagler County Sheriff has jurisdiction in Flagler Beach and/or Beverly Beach [Ms. Mason verified that this is the case.]

Ms. Winsett suggested contacting Tony Nosse (FDOT, District 5 Safety Engineer) for statistical data.

Dr. Aufdenberg suggested using statistics cited in the "Alert Today, Alive Tomorrow" literature.

MOTION: A motion to recommend approval of Letter 2013-XX with modifications was made by Ms. Grenham. The motion was seconded by Ms. Mason and carried unanimously.

E. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2013-XX approving the Volusia TPO Reapportionment Plan for submittal to FDOT

Ms. Bollenback stated the reapportionment plan is included in the agenda packet. After the 2010 Census, the boundaries of the urbanized district were redrawn to include areas of Palm Coast, Bunnell and Flagler County. Discussions have been underway with representatives of those governments to determine the exact locations of the boundaries. New membership on the TPO Board is also part of the plan. The plan has been reviewed by the FDOT Central Office. The Florida Governor has to approve the plan along with the affected members. The new membership plan includes changing the six Volusia County seats to five with one seat for Flagler County. Both counties receive one third of the total vote on the entire board. Florida laws limit the total number of board seats to 19. A small city alliance will be formed. The alliance will consist of the 10 smallest cities by population. Another name for the TPO is being area will be asked to approve resolutions in support of the reapportionment plan, probably in April.

Ms. Nicoulin asked if an area between Volusia and Flagler Counties is included in the TPO planning area. Ms. Bollenback responded some of the areas (that are not cross hatched) are considered rural and not in the planning area.

MOTION: A motion to recommend approval of Resolution 2013-XX approving the Volusia TPO Reapportionment Plan for submittal to FDOT was made by Ms. Devies. The motion was seconded by Ms. Grenham and carried unanimously.

IV. Presentations and Discussion Items

A. Presentation of Flagler County Past, Present and Future Trends and Transportation Issues

Ms. Johnson stated the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners are: George Hans (Chairman), Nate McLaughlin, Barbara Revels, Frank Meeker and Charlie Ericksen, Jr. Flagler County was formed in 1917 from portions of Volusia and St. Johns counties. Bunnell is the county seat. The main road was Dixie Highway and is now US 1. The Florida East Coast Railway was a major transportation corridor. The economy of Flagler County was largely agricultural. This included sod farming. Palm Coast and Hammock Dunes were developed in the 1970's. Major roads are I-95 and US 1. Interchanges are along I-95 at SR 100, Palm Coast Parkway and Old Dixie Highway (west side). State

roads are SR A1A, SR 100 and SR 11. Flagler County has a broad network of trails and sidewalks, including the Flagler Beach to Marineland Trail and Leigh Trail. Flagler County Airport is an enterprise fund. SCOP and SCRAP funding are used for road projects. A paratransit on-demand system is used. Transportation projects include a new access road to the Flagler County Airport, widening of CR 305 with 7 bridge replacements, I-95 /Matanzas Woods Interchange, Traffic light and turn lane at Palm Coast/Royal Palm Parkways, a new trailhead at the Lehigh Trail and several repaving projects.

Ms. Nicoulin stated Flagler County has done a good job on transportation projects with limited funding.

Ms. Merens asked if there was a feeling in Flagler County that Volusia County is "taking over?" Mr. Johnson responded Flagler County is a proud partner with Volusia County.

B. Presentation on the draft FY 2013/14 to FY 2017/18 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Comparison Report

Mr. Harris stated the TIP includes funding for all projects in the Volusia TPO planning area for FY 2013/14 to FY 2017/18. [A TIP report was distributed as a handout.] The report, created by Bob Keeth, is an excerpt of bicycle and pedestrian projects from the larger TIP. The TIP also includes a comparison report that lists projects in the current TIP and corresponding projects in the proposed new TIP. [Discussion ensued with each project listed on the handout.]

C. Presentation on the Disability Solutions for Independent Living Charity Bicycle Ride

Mr. Decarie stated Julie Shaw, Executive Director for Disability Solutions for Independent Living (DSIL), is recovering from an injury and cannot attend. DSIL has formed a fundraising committee for the "zombie" bicycle ride. A letter of acknowledgement is being requested from the BPAC. The bicycle ride will be a charity event that disabled individuals can participate in dressed up as "zombies." Proceeds from the event will benefit DSIL. The target date is the week before Halloween.

Mr. Storke stated a letter of support will be on the BPAC agenda next month.

V. Staff Comments

Mr. Harris stated several newly elected officials have joined the TPO Board. Last January, TPO staff sent a letter to each new TPO board member notifying them that written notice is needed for reappointing existing BPAC members or appointing new BPAC members. Unfortunately, Volusia County Council Chair/TPO Board member Jason Davis has not reappointed Michael Chuven. According to the BPAC Bylaws, the Vice Chair assumes the duties of the Chair when the Chair is not available. This is why Mr. Storke is now the BPAC Chairman.

Mr. Mostert asked if action needs to be taken to replace the Vice Chair. Mr. Harris responded the BPAC Bylaws don't address filling the Vice Chair position between elections. Elections are scheduled for next June.

Ms. Devies stated the BPAC Bylaws subcommittee should address this when the bylaws are reviewed.

Mr. Harris stated a public meeting was held to discuss the impact of the Titusville to Edgewater Loop Trail on communities in Southeast Volusia County (Edgewater and Oak Hill). Edgewater has an alternative alignment for consideration. In order for the alternative alignment to be considered, public meetings to discuss alternatives have been postponed by FDOT. [Public Service Announcement video for pedestrian safety was shown.]

VII. BPAC Member Comments

Dr. Aufdenberg asked if there were guidelines for the width of a bicycle lane when the speed limits change. Ms. Bustos responded this is something that is being considered in other states.

Mr. McCord stated the "Alert Today, Alive Tomorrow" campaign had a large presence at the Daytona International Speedway.

Mr. Bustos stated Florida Bicycle Association has developed materials to train law enforcement agencies on bicycle safety.

Ms. Mason stated the Friends of A1A Scenic Byway are working on a bicycle safety video. The Rotary Club of Flagler Beach is sponsoring their 10th annual bicycle tour.

Ms. Devies stated the Veterans Memorial Bridge Advisory Committee will be headed by Volusia County Council member Joshua Wagner. Lois Bollenback will represent the BPAC, CAC and TCC. The kickoff meeting will be on April 2nd at 5:00 p.m. at the Daytona Beach Chamber of Commerce. The Ormond Beach LAP Agreement for audible pedestrian signals passed at the city commission meeting. The equipment will be located at: White Street/ISB, Nova Road/ISB and Bill France Boulevard/ISB.

Mr. Mostert suggested the TPO select a name using 386/funcoast.

Mr. Storke stated a couple was crossing US 17-92 against the pedestrian traffic signal and were amazed that cars were not stopping for them. The couple eventually made it to the other side of the street.

B. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2013-XX establishing local match requirements for projects utilizing the VTPO's suballocated Surface Transportation Program funds (XU) and Transportation Alternatives Program funds (TALU)

Background Information:

This TPO originally began requiring a local match for XU funds as part of our initiative to begin developing and implementing a more streamlined effort for bicycle and pedestrian projects. That effort was duplicated when the TPO created a set-aside for ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety projects. The original match requirement was 50%. Later it was reduced to 25% and then to 15%.

The current match requirement, 10% of the total amount of XU funds programmed on a project, was set by Resolution 2011-03.

This proposed new resolution reaffirms that 10% local match requirement for XU funded projects. In addition, this resolution establishes a new match requirement for projects utilizing the TPO's sub-allocated Transportation Alternatives Program funds (TALU). The Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) is a new program established by the federal Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21). It provides funding for many of the project types that were eligible for the discontinued Transportation Enhancements Program. The TPO did not require a local match for Transportation Enhancement Projects.

The TPO Board provided clear direction for the establishment of a local match requirement equal to 20% of the total amount of TALU funds programmed on a project when it approved the Transportation Alternatives Projects Application for Funding last November.

RESOLUTION DELINEATING THE LOCAL MATCH REQUIREMENTS PLACED ON GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES RECEIVING FEDERAL FUNDS SUBALLOCATED TO THE TPO FROM THE SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM (XU) AND FROM THE TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TALU)

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the Urbanized Area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the Urbanized Area; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the transportation planning process for the Urbanized Area including Volusia County, and Flagler Beach and Beverly Beach in Flagler County; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia TPO is designated and certified by the U.S. DOT as a "large MPO"; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the aforementioned designation the Volusia TPO annually receives suballocations of federal Surface Transportation Funds (XU) and Transportation Alternatives Program Funds (TALU); and

WHEREAS, the Volusia TPO maintains full authority over the programming and distribution of these XU and TALU funds; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia TPO desires to provide, whenever possible, financial assistance to governmental entities to allow them to pursue transportation projects and programs which benefit residents of and visitors to our planning area; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia TPO wants to leverage its annual allocations of XU and TALU funds and ensure a measure of local financial commitment to transportation projects and programs utilizing these funds;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization that:

- 1) every governmental entity receiving XU or TALU funds from the Volusia TPO shall provide a local match commitment; and
- 2) effective April 23, 2013, a local match of 10% of the total amount of XU funds programmed for each project utilizing XU funds and a local match of 20% of the total amount of TALU funds programmed for each project utilizing TALU funds shall be required of the governmental entity requesting the funds; and
- 3) the Volusia TPO determines that "local match" shall be defined as non-federal cash match and/or in-kind services that advance the project in question; and

- 4) the Volusia TPO also reaffirms its policy that any cost overruns encountered on a project funded with XU funds or TALU funds will be the responsibility of the governmental entity identified as the project originator with the following exception: if the project is on the state highway system and the State DOT is the project manager of record then the state shall be responsible for any cost overruns utilizing state dollars; and
- 5) notwithstanding the terms prescribed in subparagraph 2, above, the required local match shall not exceed the percentage required in the current policy of the TPO board at the time the governmental entity requesting the funds commits to its amount of local match for the project; and
- 6) the Volusia TPO reserves the right to waive or adjust the local match requirements if the TPO Board deems there exists sufficient reason or circumstance; and
- 7) the Chairman of the Volusia TPO (or his/her designee) is hereby authorized and directed to submit this resolution to the:
 - a. State and Regional Clearinghouse Offices;
 - b. Florida Department of Transportation;
 - c. Federal Transit Administration (through the Florida Department of Transportation);
 - d. Federal Highway Administration (through the Florida Department of Transportation);
 - e. East Central Florida Regional Planning Council;
 - f. Federal Aviation Administration;
 - g. Environmental Protection Agency; and
 - h. Division of Community Planning & Development, Department of Economic Opportunity; and
 - i. Councils, Commissions, and Managers of the TPO Member Local Governments

Draft FY 2013/14 to FY 2017/18 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Comparison Report

The purpose of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is to identify all federal and state funded transportation projects that have been scheduled for implementation in the Volusia TPO planning area from FY 2013/2014 to FY 2017/2018. The projects listed in the TIP include improvements to the area's highway, transit and aviation systems. Regionally significant projects, as well as some of the area's locally funded projects, are included in the TIP for informational purposes. The TIP also identifies transportation-disadvantaged projects, as well as bicycle facilities, sidewalks and other enhancement projects scheduled during this time period. The draft TIP is currently being reviewed by the TPO's advisory committees and will be considered for approval by the TPO Board in June.

Coast to Coast Connector

The Coast to Coast Connector (Connector) is a significant effort to provide a safe and continuous multiuse trail from the Gulf of Mexico to the Atlantic through Central Florida. The Connector is an estimated total distance of 275 miles with approximately 75 percent (over 200 miles) of the corridor already developed and open to the public or funded for completion. The estimated cost to close the remaining gaps is approximately \$42 million.

The Connector will link communities between St. Petersburg and Titusville along its entire length into a major destination route that will allow residents and visitors to explore Central Florida by bicycle or foot. The Connector includes two of the state's most popular trails, the Fred Marquis Pinellas Trail and the West Orange Trail, both of which have fueled the economic transformation of communities, particularly Dunedin and Winter Garden. This corridor also includes significant portions of the developing 51 mile East Central Regional Rail Trail, the longest single rail-trail corridor ever acquired by the state. The Connector will link all or part of the following existing multi-use trails, developed and managed by a broad range of communities and agencies:

- Fred Marquis Pinellas Trail
- Starkey Trail
- Suncoast Trail
- Good Neighbor Trail
- Withlacoochee State Trail
- Gen. James A. Van Fleet State Trail
- South Lake Trail

- West Orange Trail
- Clarcona-Ocoee Trail
- Pine Hills Trail
- Seminole-Wekiva Trail
- Rinehart Trail
- Spring to Spring Trail
- East Central Regional Rail Trail

The Connector is a major priority within the Florida Greenways and Trails System Plan which is being implemented by the Office of Greenways and Trails, and is the keystone project within the Florida Greenways and Trails Foundation's "Close the Gaps" Campaign.

Why Invest in the Coast to Coast Connector and the Florida Greenways and Trails System?

The economic impact of and public demand for trails are significant, as demonstrated by the following:

- In downtown Dunedin, private business occupancy rates increased from 30% to nearly 100% following the establishment of the Pinellas Trail (Dunedin Economic Development Director).
- Three Central Florida trails, including the West Orange Trail, were estimated to support \$42 million of economic impact and 516 jobs in 2010 (East Central Florida RPC, 2010).
- Nearly 75 percent of Florida's 87 million visitors participate in nature-based activities during their visit (VISIT FLORIDA, 2012).
- Trails are the number one community amenity sought by American homebuyers (National Association of Homebuilders, 2008).
- Every \$1 million spent on the construction of multi-use trails yields 9.6 jobs (University of Massachusetts, 2011).
- The repeated annual economic impact of cyclists has been estimated to be nine times the onetime cost to build bicycle facilities (North Carolina DOT, 2004).
