I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance

Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) Vice Chairperson Greg Feldman called the meeting of the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) to order at 1:22 p.m. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with twelve voting members and two non-voting members physically present, and one voting member and two non-voting members virtually present.

Ms. Nicoulin provided in-depth details of the resolution amendments. She stated that every two years the TPO develops a new UPWP. During this time, the TPO identifies funds in the current UPWP that are not anticipated to be spent down which will then go through the de-obligation process. By de-obligating these funds it allows the TPO to continue activities that were started before the end of the current fiscal year into the following fiscal year.

Ms. Nicoulin provided in-depth details on the St. Johns River to Sea Loop Trail and noted that the resolution supports the trail as one of the leading regional trail priorities in the State of Florida. She noted that the funding that is currently programmed on the trail will remain regardless of whether the ranking changes. She stated that the TPO has received a letter of support from Flagler County and expects to receive another from the Northeast Florida Regional Council.

She provided overall details of what their purpose is and identified the current Floridadesignated Trail Towns, the goals, what makes a Trail Town, and the benefits. She provided information on how to become a Trail Town and explained the process of applying and getting approved. She explained the variety of programs that they offer; the criteria needed, and the benefits of each program.

Ms. Hopkins answered CAC members' questions regarding how SunTrail and the Florida Greenways and Trails work together and whether their grants and funding sources are only available to government agencies.

B. <u>Presentation and Update on the Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety High Visibility Crosswalk Enforcement Operation</u>

Ms. Blankenship provided a PowerPoint presentation on the Bike/Walk Central Florida's Operation Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety Program. She provided in-depth details of the program's mission, expected benefits, and the data that was collected on thirteen crosswalks during January of 2024. She discussed driver yield rates at various crosswalks in Volusia County that ranged from 16%-97%. She noted that five high visibility crosswalk enforcements took place in February producing twenty-four warnings and ninety-four citations.

Ms. Blankenship answered CAC members' questions regarding the locations of the crosswalks; continuing pedestrian education for the public; different crosswalk safety countermeasures and if there is a system set up to communicate with all of the local governments to help get the word out.

She explained the difference between feasibility studies, project implementation, and traffic operations project applications. Background Information:

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) outlines the annual activities and funding for the TPO over a two-year period. The next two-year UPWP will become effective July 1, 2024. The TPO's transportation planning activities are funded in large part through federal grants. These federally funded transportation planning activities must be identified and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Florida Department of transportation (FDOT) in advance of each fiscal year. The activities, products, and budgeted funds must be documented in the TPO's Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP).

In January and February, UPWP tasks and funding allocations were discussed and presented to the TPO advisory committees and Board for review and comment. Following these discussions, a full draft document was compiled and submitted to FDOT, FTA, and FHWA for their review and posted for public comment. RESOLUTION OF THE RIVER TO SEA TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2024/25 AND 2025/26 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the designated urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, 23 CFR 450.310, and Florida Statutes 339.175, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and a portion of Flagler County as defined by the Metropolitan Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 134, 23 CFR 450, and Florida Statutes 339.175, require the River to Sea TPO and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to enter into an agreement clearly identifying the responsibilities for cooperatively carrying out the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) portion of the Metropolitan Planning Process and accomplishing the transportation planning requirements of state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea TPO shall endorse and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required by 23 C.F.R. 450.300 through 450.324 and Florida Statutes 339.175, among which is the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP); and

WHEREAS, the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is a two-year work plan that identifies federal funding available to the TPO including metropolitan planning funds (PL Funds) authorized under 23 USC 104(f), and Urban Attributable (SU) funds; and

A. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DRAFT FY 2024/25 TO FY 2028/29 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Background Information:

The TPO is required by 23 U.S.C. 134(j) and Florida Statute 339.175 to develop a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a program of transportation projects covering a period of five years. The TIP is developed and formally adopted by the TPO each year. It must be consistent with the Long-Range Transportation Plan, and required for projects to be eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S.C. and Title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53. The TIP is developed in cooperation with FDOT, local governments, public transit operators, and the public.

The TIP lists capital and non-capital surface transportation projects supported with state and/or federal funds. Also required to be included are all regionally significant projects requiring an action by FHWA or FTA regardless of funding source and projects that implement paratransit plans required for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Florida law also requires the TIP to include a list of locally and privately funded projects for informational purposes.

TPO staff will lead a discussion regarding the development of the draft FY 2024/25 to FY 2028/29 TIP and provide an update on notable changes.

The purpose of the project is to resurface State Road (S.R.) 100 from east of N. Palmetto Road in Bunnell to east of Old Kings Road in Palm Coast to extend the service life of the existing roadway. Improvements include constructing 6-foot-wide sidewalk to close sidewalk gaps where existing right of way allows and improving pedestrian features at intersections within the project limits. During construction, the existing S.R. 44 bridge will remain open for drivers to use while the new bridge is constructed to the south of the existing bridge. After construction, the existing bridge will be removed.

Starting April 5, 2024, the entrance to Ed Stone Park from New York Avenue (State Road (S.R.) 44) will be closed for approximately one month. This closure is necessary to facilitate the construction of the new access road to Ed Stone Park, St. John's Marina, and St. John's River Grill from New York Avenue (S.R. 44). During this period, a detour will be in place to guide motorists to their destinations. The purpose of this project is to enhance safety along select segments of state roadways in Volusia and Flagler Counties by installing sinusoidal rumble striping and pavement markings along the travel lane lines. The rumble stripes help to alert drivers if the vehicle moves outside the travel lane by creating vibration and noise.

The roadways to be included will have speed limits of 50 mph or greater with flush shoulders, and which do not already have auditory or vibratory pavement markings. Roadways to be included are:

The deployment seeks to provide early detection of traffic incidents, such as stopped vehicles or queuing, and display an advanced warning on roadside signs with flashing beacons approaching the incident. - Update: The contractor has installed all of the advanced incident warning sign structures and the project is awaiting final acceptance.



This goal of this project is to enhance safety for the travelling public by deterring and minimizing accidents due to wrong way driving. This technology will be implemented at all 6 ramps on I-95 at Palm Coast Parkway interchange, I-95 at Matanzas Woods Parkway interchange, and at I-4 at SR 44 interchange. The WWVDS initiative supports the FDOT's commitment to achieving zero fatalities and serious injuries on the State Highway System.
