1. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Board meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by TPO Chairperson Sander. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with eleven voting members and five non-voting members physically present; and one voting member virtually present.

Ms. Pruneau stated that Commissioner Werning of Oak Hill was the voting member of the Small City Alliance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

MOTION: A motion was made by Council Member Foley to allow for remote participation. The motion was seconded by Mayor Chasez and carried unanimously.

The board observed a moment of silence for the passing of Holly Hill Vice Mayor Roy Johnson.

There were no public comments.

Chairperson Sander stated that there has been a revision to Item E and a handout was provided.

MOTION: A motion was made by Commissioner Heriot to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by County Vice Chair Reinhart and carried unanimously.

4. Action Items

- A. Review and Approval of Resolution 2026-03 Amending the 2025/26 to 2029/30 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (Roll Call Vote Required)

MOTION: A motion was made by County Vice Chair Reinhart to approve Resolution 2026-03 amending the 2025/26 to 2029/30 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The motion was seconded by Mayor Chasez.

Ms. Nicoulin explained that the TIP must be amended to add funding for the first phase of the Clyde Morris Boulevard project, as well as the deletions of two projects that the city of South Daytona has withdrawn due to shifting priorities.

The motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

B. Review and Approval of Resolution 2026-04 Amending the FY 2024/25 and 2025/26 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), Deobligating Funds, and Authorizing an Amendment to the TPO Metropolitan Planning Organization Agreement (Roll Call Vote Required)

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mayor Chasez to approve Resolution 2026-04 amending the FY 2024/25 and 2025/26 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), deobligating funds, and authorizing an amendment to the TPO Metropolitan Planning Organization Agreement. The motion was seconded by County Vice Chair Reinhart.*

Ms. Nicoulin explained that as part of the development of the UPWP, any funds that have not been used are deobligated to make them available for use in the first year of the new UPWP. She stated that \$1,320,200 million in Consolidated Planning Grant funds and \$150,000 in Urbanized Attributable (SU) funds will be deobligated.

The motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

C. Review and Approval of the 2025 Annual FDOT/TPO Joint Certification Report

Ms. Powell presented the 2025 FDOT/TPO Joint Certification Report, stating that the TPO received a low-risk score with no marks. She thanked Ms. Nicoulin and the TPO staff for their work and expressed excitement in the continued work with the TPO.

Mayor Chasez noted the improvement from years past, recognizing Ms. Nicoulin's leadership, her staff, and hard work for the change.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Commissioner Heriot to approve the 2025 Annual FDOT/TPO Joint Certification Report. The motion was seconded by Mayor Chasez and carried unanimously.*

5. Presentations, Status Reports, and Discussion Items

A. Presentation and Discussion of the Adopted Flagler County FY 2026-2035 Transit Development Plan

Mr. Jonathan Roberson, University of South Florida (USF) Center for Urban Transportation Research (CUTR), gave an updated presentation on the recently adopted Flagler County FY 2026-2035 Transit Development Plan (TDP). He discussed the top-ranked service needs and the roadmap of the ten-year plan. He stated that the plan is currently in its 60-day review period with FDOT.

Council Member Johansson suggested utilizing caution going forward due to Volusia County's recent experience of having to reduce the number of fixed routes and the potential of property taxes being eliminated.

Mayor Chasez stated that there will be clarity in the next year or so regarding property taxes and suggested that this plan will require the fiscal responsibility of Flagler County. She stated her opinion that continuing the planning process is beneficial considering the current and future significant growth of Flagler County.

Council Member Miller asked about the plan's recommended enhancements to the current ADA service in Flagler County. Mr. Roberson stated there will be an increase in trips provided, the addition of weekend trips and mobility on demand service and noted that the plan is phased and measured with pilot projects considered.

Commissioner Dance echoed comments from Council Member Johansson and Mayor Chasez, stating that he believes the best way forward is mobility on demand service. He noted the difficulty of implementing fixed-route service due to Palm Coast's expansiveness.

Commissioner Heriot noted that he appreciated a measured approach to transit. He added that Deltona has dramatically reduced fixed route service and he acknowledged the challenges. He noted that working with private contractors was advantageous for mobility on demand service.

B. Presentation and Discussion of the Bike/Walk Central Florida Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety Program

Ms. Emily Bush, Executive Director of Bike/Walk Central Florida, gave a presentation on Best Foot Forward's Pedestrian Safety Program. She gave an overview of sign-waving events, explained the evaluation of driver yield rates, and discussed the 2025 engineering insights.

Council Member White thanked Ms. Bush for her efforts, stating that Ponce Inlet is continuing to implement the pedestrian safety program. He shared an anecdote of a citizen being issued a citation and learning from the experience. He stated that Ponce Inlet is exploring various methods of pedestrian safety signage, stating that aesthetics are a consideration.

Commissioner Dance thanked Ms. Bush for coming out to Flagler County last week and encouraged education of the public regarding the law and enforcements.

Commissioner Santore echoed Council Member White's comment regarding balancing aesthetics with traffic signals and signage. Ms. Bush suggested land use tactics to help with beautification.

Chairperson Sander asked about the duration of crosswalk data collection events. Ms. Bush explained that a data collection event can last from twenty minutes to two hours, depending on traffic volume.

Chairperson Sander asked if there is a public service announcement or some sort of education that explains the new pedestrian hybrid beacons. Ms. Bush stated that education regarding the beacons is facility-specific. She recommended utilizing FDOT's resources.

C. Presentation and Discussion of the Proposed Reed Ellis Road Trail

Ms. Bush gave a presentation on the proposed Reed Ellis Road Trail. She explained the overarching purpose of connecting three large conservation entities in southern Volusia County; D Ranch Preserve, Lake Monroe Preserve, and Beck Ranch Preserve through Reed Ellis Road. She explained the next steps in the process and how board members could help.

Commissioner Heriot stated that D Ranch is one of Deltona's greatest assets and recommended visiting it.

D. Presentation and Discussion of the 2026 TPO Annual Call for Projects

Ms. Nicoulin stated that the TPO's annual Call for Projects closed in February, and twenty-two applications were received. She pointed out that the applications are identified in the agenda packet and that TPO staff has nearly completed its in-house review. She explained the next steps, including subcommittee meetings being held over the coming month to review and score the projects, followed by a presentation to the board in May, adoption scheduled for June, followed by submittal to FDOT for consideration of funding.

Council Member Johansson pointed out that of Volusia County's sixteen cities, only five were represented in the applications. Ms. Nicoulin stated that she believed part of the reasoning for that is due to the LAP certification requirement. She noted that there were more cities represented in the Call for Projects last year. Council Member Johansson advised her to let him know if there were LAP certification issues with the small cities so that the county can help.

Commissioner Heriot stated that Deltona did not submit any projects this year. They recently had a productive meeting with Ms. Nicoulin and discussed the need to have a LAP certified staff member. He noted that Deltona will be submitting applications next year.

Mayor Chasez stated that while DeBary did not submit any applications this year, she wanted to assure citizens, that they are working to get a federal appropriation for a crossing over Benson Junction and Fort Florida Road, and she noted that in response to the conversation that occurred at the BPAC meeting, the issue around Dirksen Drive and 17-92 is being addressed by the city.

E. FDOT Report

Ms. Powell reviewed the FDOT report; shared a video detailing the widening project in DeLeon Springs, announced an upcoming Career Fair at the University of Central Florida on March 30th, and the Central Florida Safety Summit on May 8th in St. Cloud, stating that the link to register will be distributed soon.

6. Executive Director's Report

Ms. Nicoulin stated that TPO staff will also distribute Central Florida Safety Summit registration information shortly. She stated that the MPOAC Institute will take place on May 1st in Orlando, and that the TPO has budgeted to send three board members. She advised any members interested in attending to reach out to Ms. Pruneau.

7. Volusia-Flagler TPO Board Member Comments

County Vice Chair Reinhart informed members that Vice Mayor Johnson's funeral service will be held at the Church of Christ in Holly Hill on April 10th at 1:00 p.m.

Commissioner Dance stated that April 25th is Trails Day.

Council Member Foley stated that he will be stepping down from the board due to upcoming travel; Port Orange will find a replacement for his seat. He expressed his honor in being part of the board adding that it was one of the most important organizations in the area. Chairperson Sander thanked him for his service on both the TPO Board and the Executive Committee.

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the designated urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, 23 CFR 450.310, and Florida Statutes 339.175, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and Flagler County as defined by the Metropolitan Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 134, 23 CFR 450, and Florida Statutes 339.175, require the TPO and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to enter into an agreement clearly identifying the responsibilities for cooperatively carrying out the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) portion of the Metropolitan Planning Process and accomplishing the transportation planning requirements of state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, the TPO shall endorse and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required by 23 C.F.R. 450.300 through 450.324 and Florida Statutes 339.175, among which is the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP); and

WHEREAS, the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is a two-year work plan that identifies federal funding available to the TPO including metropolitan planning funds (PL Funds) authorized under 23 USC 104(f), Section 5305(d) transit planning funds and Urban Attributable (SU) funds; and

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is constructing a two-lane roundabout at the intersection of State Road (S.R.) 44 (East New York Avenue) and Kepler Road in DeLand to enhance safety and improve the flow of traffic.

Once completed, the roundabout will replace the existing signalized intersection. It will feature two travel lanes in each direction, right-turn bypass lanes at three of the four road connections, a concrete apron to accommodate large trucks, and landscaping in the center island.

Pedestrian safety enhancements include new sidewalks and crosswalks equipped with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at the roundabout approaches. Flagler County Design & Construction Projects Report

February 2026

Road & Bridge Program

- Walnut Avenue Paving Project – 100% Design is complete. Plans finalization was concluded in November 2025 and accepted by the Department. USACOE permitting is ongoing.
- Jungle Hut Road from A1A to beach access – FDOT complete review of 100% design plans issuing two comments.... Plans finalization and permitting are anticipated to conclude in March 2026. Forest Park Street from CR 90 to SR 100 – 60% design plans reviewed by FDOT. Plans finalization and permitting are anticipated to conclude in July 2026.
- CR 205 Resurfacing Project – Required design update was finalized in preparation of construction contractor procurement. Funding Agreement was approved by the BOCC on December 15, 2025. Advertisement for Bid and construction is anticipated to commence in the second quarter 2026.
- CR 304 Resurfacing Project (CR 305 to SR-11) – Design Plans update and permit activities are anticipated to begin in the second quarter 2026. Construction is anticipated to commence in the third quarter 2026.
- First Avenue Phase 2 Drainage – 100% Design plans development in progress. Plan finalization is scheduled for March 2026.

Sidewalk & Trail Program

- Bulow Creek Headwaters Regional Park – Planning phase is underway A second public meeting was held on February 3, 2026. Presentation of the final master plan to BOCC for approval is anticipated April 20, 2026. Submittal of the Final Plan and Report is anticipated by end of May 2026 which will conclude the planning phase. Project will begin to transition into design and permitting phase in Summer 2026.
- Trailhead for GST & Lehigh Trail – Coordination with the Department’s CSC is underway and is being coordinated with planned Eco-Discovery Center. Design phase is anticipated to begin in the first quarter 2026.



- Old Kings Road South Trail (SR100 to County Line) – Design began in July 2025, 60% design submittal is under review by County and FDOT. Completion of design and permitting is anticipated by September 2026.

Vertical CIP Program

- Fire Rescue Station 51 – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on November 19, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on December 8, 2025, 11am-12pm. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.
- Fire Rescue Administration Station 50 – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on October 8, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 13, 2025, 10-11am. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.
- SMA Integrated Stabilization Unit – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on October 22, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 18, 2025, 1-2pm. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.
- Eco-Discovery Center – The BOCC approved award of Design-Build contract to The Collage Companies on September 15, 2025. Design kick-off meeting held on January 26, 2026. Design-Builder has commenced preliminary design to establish the scope of the project.
- Multipurpose Emergency Preparedness Project – Task Work Order Four was issued to Design Build Team. This is the final Task Work Order needed to complete construction of all remaining work by June 30, 2026. Contractor was mobilized onsite and construction is underway.

Stormwater Master Plan Program

- MalaCompra Canal Restoration and Resiliency – Design and Permitting phases are underway. Conceptual design phase was completed. Project completion is anticipated in July 2026.

Beach Management Plan Program

- Beach Reach 2 (North 7th St to Varn Park) – All permits have been received. Invitation to bid was released on March 5, 2026 and construction timing will depend on the



contractor's schedule. Contract will specify that the dredge project to be complete within 365 days from Notice to Proceed.

- Beach Reach 3 – The Professional Services Agreement with Moffatt & Nichol was approved by the BOCC on April 21, 2025. Field work for permitting studies began in May 2025 and continues. Project design activities are actively underway. Hardbottom mapping has been delayed due to field and weather conditions. An update was provided at the December 15th BOCC Workshop.
- Hammock Dunes Emergency Dune Restoration Project – Completed as of November 2025.
- Ocean Hammock/Hammock Beach and Golf Resort Emergency Dune Restoration Project – This interim emergency dune restoration project between Jungle Hut Road and the southern edge of MalaCompra park was authorized under the Emergency Final Order for Hurricane Milton. Substantial completion was issued on December 15, 2025. The project is being funded jointly by FDEP and the OHPOA and HBAG Resort.
- FEMA Category G Dune Restoration Project – This emergency dune restoration project is underway from the southern end MalaCompra Park to River to Sea Preserve. Construction commenced on December 15, 2025, and is anticipated to continue through March 2026.
