1. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum / Pledge of Allegiance

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Chairperson Ted Wendler. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with eleven voting and three non-voting members physically present, and two voting and two non-voting members virtually present.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Ramos to allow members attending virtually to participate and vote. The motion was seconded by Mr. Coletti and carried unanimously.*

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, followed by a moment of silence for Herb Hiller, long-time trail advocate.

2. Public Comment/Participation

Ms. Ardito advised that Mr. Hiller’s Celebration of Life will take place on March 15, 2025.

3. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of the January 8, 2025 BPAC Meeting Minutes

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Jeffreys to approve the January 8, 2025 BPAC meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Ms. Belin and carried unanimously.*

Action Items

B. Review and Recommend Approval of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Goals and Objectives

Mr. Marc Ispass, Kimley-Horn, gave a presentation to review the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Goals and Objectives, which include the following: multimodal, economic development, connectivity, safety, livability, and involvement.

Mr. Aufdenberg addressed several objectives, starting with Objective 5.5, suggesting the words “maintains or reduces” be changed as it is dangerous to maintain greenhouse gas emissions. He also sought clarification regarding Objectives 4.1 and 2.3, which Mr. Ispass clarified.

Mr. Lodge addressed Objective 1.2, questioning whether reducing transportation demand is realistic in an increasingly popular tourist state. Mr. Ispass explained the goal is to reduce demand on existing facilities or to reroute traffic to other areas. Ms. Ardito referenced Goal 1, stating that there was no reference to multi-use trails. Mr. Ispass advised that the goal should not be specific so that no facility type is excluded.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Lodge to approve the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Goals and Objectives. The motion was seconded by Mr. Aufdenberg which carried unanimously.*

C. Review and Recommend Approval of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Public Involvement Plan (PIP)

Mr. Ispass discussed the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Public Involvement Plan (PIP). He recalled that the outbreak of COVID-19 affected the last LRTP. He noted that pop-up events during existing community events will be held. He gave a few examples of events, such as farmer’s markets and street festivals. Members commented on the pop-up events and provided event suggestions.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Mr. Storke to recommend approval of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Public Involvement Plan (PIP). The motion was seconded by Mr. Ramos and carried unanimously.*

4. Presentation and Discussion Items

A. Presentation and Discussion of FDOT’s 2055 Florida Transportation Plan Update

Ms. Powell updated the committee regarding the 2055 Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). She defined what the FTP is, the purpose of the plan, and the long-term goals. She addressed how the committee members can get involved and provided a QR code to access the website.

Mr. Hamilton asked how the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan and 2055 FTP interrelate, and Ms. Powell stated she would provide more information later, at the next BPAC meeting.

B. Presentation and Discussion of the Development of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

Mr. Ispass presented updates and upcoming activities relating to the 2050 LRTP, including the recent virtual workshop, the 2050 LRTP webpage, open houses scheduled to be held in April, revenue for socioeconomic data forecasts, and the draft needs assessment and evaluation criteria.

Mr. Aufdenberg asked how accurate the older LRTPs were when compared to the current system. Mr. Ispass assured the committee that the information is tracked and readily available, should anyone want to research.

BPAC members stressed the need for a cultural shift relating to a more walkable city. Ms. Nicoulin referenced how the Vision Zero Action Plan can provide input toward cultural behaviors and mentioned that the TPO has a cost-feasible list of criteria which helps determine projects moving forward.

5. Staff Comments

A. 2025 Volusia-Flagler TPO Call for Projects

Mr. Harris explained the memorandum dated January 23, 2025, announcing the Call for Projects is now accepting applications until March 31st at 4:00 pm. He stated that the Call for Projects process will be the same as the previous year with the adoption of the Priority Lists in June.

B. Vision Zero Action Plan

Mr. Harris reviewed the January 29th Vision Zero Action Plan workshop that was held and advised that there will be three community workshops coming up, as well as virtual stakeholder meetings and presentations to the TPO committees and board in April and June.

7. BPAC Member Comments

Members discussed ways to get French Avenue, Blue Springs, and Highbanks as priority SunTrail projects, and Mr. Jeffreys discussed difficulties he has had in obtaining matching funds for SunTrail projects and his correspondence with people at FDOT.

Mr. Harris reviewed the Office of Greenways and Trails (OGT) map update cycles and noted the success the TPO has had in including new corridors.

Ms. Phillips mentioned that there is a helmet-fitting certification class in DeLand on March 7th for anyone interested.

Members discussed the Best Foot Forward in Flagler County stakeholder meeting; discussed penalties for crashes involving cyclists and pedestrians; the Florida Greenway and Trails Foundation Summit and how to leverage Senate Bill 106 to increase funding for trails; the resurfacing at Beville Road and Nova Road; pedestrian signals that are still uncompleted; and the crosswalk enforcement operations that will take place in Flagler County on February 14th and 17th.

Ms. Nicoulin introduced the TPO's new Administrative Assistant, Ms. Melanie Pruneau, to the committee.

1. **Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum / Pledge of Allegiance**

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Chairperson Ted Wendler. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with thirteen voting and two non-voting members physically present, and one voting member virtually present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

2. **Public Comment/Participation**

There were no public comments.

3. **Action Items**

A. **Review and Approval of the March 12, 2025 BPAC Meeting Minutes**

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Storke to approve the March 12, 2025 BPAC meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Aufdenberg and carried unanimously.

Mr. Harris noted that, due to the lack of a quorum at the March BPAC meeting, the February 12, 2025 BPAC minutes would be back as an Action Item next month.

B. **Review and Recommend Approval of Volusia-Flagler 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Prioritization Criteria**

Mr. Marc Ispass, Kimley-Horn, gave a PowerPoint presentation, discussing the steps that are currently in development for the LRTP; the roadway needs assessment, major trails assessment, and the transit assessment. The presentation detailed the approved 2050 goals and objectives which will be used to help guide project prioritization when developing the cost feasible plan. He went over the updates and upcoming activities, announcing in-person public open houses on April 21st in Port Orange, April 28th in Palm Coast, and April 29th in DeLand.

Members discussed details of the weighted criteria, golf carts sharing the roads or sidewalks, and notable changes between the current LRTP and the previous plan. Ms. Nicoulin noted that safety and congestion are the two categories that rose to the top of the project evaluation criteria list due to a heightened sense of importance.

MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Bonds to recommend approval of the Volusia-Flagler 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Prioritization Criteria. The motion was seconded by Mr. Coletti and carried unanimously.

C. **Reappointment/Appointment of 2025 BPAC Project Review Subcommittee Members**

The following agreed to continue serving on the BPAC Project Review Subcommittee: Maggie Ardito, Jason Aufdenberg, Gayle Belin, Elizabeth Bonds, Terry Lodge, Nic Mostert, and Ted Wendler.

Mr. Aufdenberg noted that the subcommittee could benefit from someone from Flagler County being on it.

Mr. Coletti volunteered to serve on the subcommittee.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Aufdenberg to appoint Larry Coletti to the 2025 BPAC Project Review Subcommittee. The motion was seconded by Ms. Belin and carried unanimously.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Ms. Belin to reappoint Maggie Ardito, Jason Aufdenberg, Gayle Belin, Elizabeth Bonds, Terry Lodge, Nic Mostert, and Ted Wendler to the 2025 BPAC Project Review Subcommittee. The motion was seconded by Mr. Jeffreys and carried unanimously.*

D. Reappointment/Appointment of 2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Subcommittee Members

A. Presentation and Discussion of the Volusia-Flagler TPO's 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

This item was discussed under Action Item 3A, Review and Recommend Approval of Volusia-Flagler 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Prioritization Criteria and Mr. Ispass reviewed the presentation following Presentation Item B, Presentation and Discussion of the Volusia-Flagler TPO's Vision Zero Action Plan.

B. Presentation and Discussion of the Volusia-Flagler TPO's Vision Zero Action Plan (VZAP)

Ms. Roberta Fennessy, VHB, gave a PowerPoint presentation on the progress of the Vision Zero Action Plan (VZAP). She discussed the goals of the VZAP, the equity analysis overview, and policy review recommendations. She stated that the plan is expected to be complete by June.

Mr. Jeffreys asked whether bicycle paths were taken into consideration in the roadway segment analysis; Ms. Fennessy stated that the data is analyzed by VHB but not utilized for the identification of the High Injury Network (HIM).

Members discussed KSI reporting requirements, including what factors may be taken into consideration when the data is collected, and Florida's "Dangerous by Design" report.

5. Staff Comments

Mr. Harris informed the committee that the BPAC Project Review Subcommittee would take place immediately following the BPAC meeting; he also announced an upcoming VZAP workshop taking place on April 17th in Palm Coast, and upcoming LRTP public open houses taking place on April 21st in Port Orange, April 28th in Palm Coast, and April 29th in DeLand.

Presentation and Discussion of the Draft FY 2025/26 to FY 2029/30 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

The TPO is required by 23 U.S.C. 134(j) and Florida Statute 339.175 to develop a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a program of transportation projects covering a period of five years. The TIP is developed and formally adopted by the TPO each year. It must be consistent with the Long Range Transportation Plan and is required for projects to be eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S.C. and Title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53. The TIP is developed in cooperation with FDOT, local governments, public transit operators, and the public.

The TIP lists capital and non-capital surface transportation projects supported with state and/or federal funds. All regionally significant projects requiring action by FHWA or FTA, regardless of funding source, and projects that implement paratransit plans required for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act are required to be included. Florida law also requires the TIP to include a list of locally and privately funded projects for informational purposes.

TPO staff will lead a discussion regarding the development of the draft FY 2025/26 to FY 2029/30 TIP and provide an update on notable changes to bicycle and pedestrian projects.

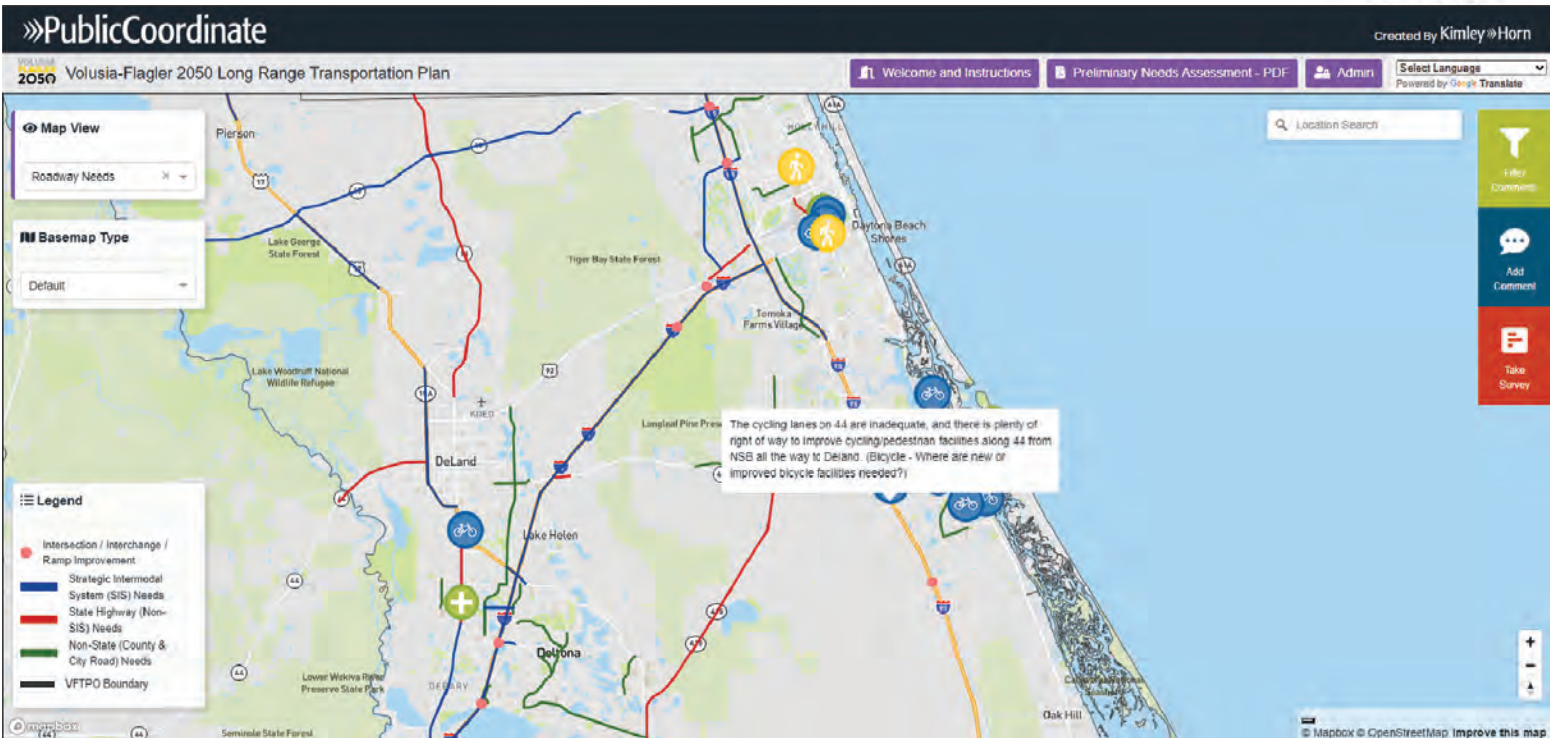
