I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance

IV. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of March 20, 2018 CAC Meeting Minutes

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Ball to approve the March 20, 2018 CAC meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Storke and carried unanimously.

B. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2018-## Amending the FY 2017/18 to 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Ms. Nicoulin stated this proposed amendment is for three projects; the first two are FDOT resurfacing projects along I-95. The first one is to revise the funding to add an additional \$4.92 million to the construction phase; the second one is to program new funding of \$1 million to the design phase. The third project is a Volusia County project which is programming local funding in the amount of \$110,000 for the design phase of East Volusia Traffic Management Center.

Mr. Peterson stated he travelled I-95 today from Flagler County and it does need to be resurfaced. He stated that the washboarding is bad along US 1 to SR 40; he asked if that was on a schedule to be resurfaced as well.

Ms. Wyche replied she would research that and get back to him.

Ms. Habel asked where the East Volusia Traffic Management Center is located.

Ms. Winsett replied the county is still trying to find a suitable site but it will probably be on US 92.

Ms. Nicoulin stated this project is programming funding for the relocation of fiber optics; it is not for design of the building.

Ms. Winsett stated the Volusia County Public Works Department is trying to centralize everything instead of being spread out through the county to be more efficient.

Ms. Habel asked if they are looking at existing county facilities.

Ms. Winsett replied the existing fiber optics will have to be relocated when the new building is constructed.

Ms. Nicoulin stated there is going to be a new Public Works building that will house more than just the Traffic Management Center; this is being funded in order to get the fiber optics and equipment there that will support the Traffic Management Center. This is the local match that the county is paying; it is not coming out of the TPO's federal set-aside funding.

Ms. Habel asked where the facility will be located.

Ms. Winsett replied the county is negotiating with a landowner; potential sites could be on US 92 or SR 44. It is really premature and they have not released a location yet. The county is also pursuing a lot of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) smart system signal projects that will require extra data storage and a facility. The facility will have to be able to manage all that.

Ms. Habel asked what the time frame is for this project.

Ms. Winsett replied she could not say; from what she has heard, construction should be underway within a year or year and a half.

Ms. Nicoulin stated the programming for this dollar amount is for next fiscal year for design, not construction.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Storke to recommend approval of Resolution 2018-## amending the FY 2017/18 to 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The motion was seconded by Ms. Bledsoe and carried unanimously.

C. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2018-## Adopting the FY 2018/19 and 2019/20 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Ms. Nicoulin stated the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) was developed by TPO staff and the UPWP Subcommittee and was presented to advisory committees and the TPO Board. It was submitted to FDOT and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for review and comment. The TPO received three minor comments which were incorporated into the document. The resolution is for a recommendation to adopt the UPWP.

MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Lipovsky to recommend approval of Resolution 2018-## adopting the FY 2018/19 and 2019/20 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The motion was seconded by Ms. Biro and carried unanimously.

D. Review and Recommend Approval of the 2018 River to Sea TPO's "Tell the TPO" Survey Questions and Survey Kick-Off

(Handout)

Ms. Blankenship introduced Ms. Lara Bouck, H.W. Lochner, Project Manager, to give the updated presentation.

Ms. Bouck gave a PowerPoint presentation and stated the goals of the survey. The survey will launch on Monday, April 30, 2018; the online version will go live on that date and hard copies will be dispersed throughout the area. The draft questions are provided in the agenda. There was space for two new questions and based on instructions from the TPO Board those questions have been identified. New question 9 asks which types of transportation projects are the highest priorities to fund with the TPO's limited resources and new question 10 asks which of the 10 highest crash locations are of greatest concern. She reviewed the marketing plan which is designed to get the maximum exposure; the target goal is to receive 2,000 responses. The survey will be available in English and Spanish. A random prize drawing is a two-night stay for two people in a local area hotel. She reviewed the TPO Board and the committee Ambassador Challenge; the winner of each will receive a trophy. On Friday, April 27, 2018, an email will be sent to the BPAC members with the link specific to the BPAC to forward to family and friends. There will also be an update in May on which committee is in the lead.

Ms. Lendian referred to Question 10 that asks about specific intersections and asked why the International Speedway Boulevard (ISB) and Tomoka Farms Road intersection was not listed.

Ms. Blankenship replied the question includes the top ten crash intersections in the planning area based on the TPO's Crash Analysis Report.

Ms. Bouck stated there is a space on the survey instrument for respondents to put additional comments for anything they feel needs attention.

Ms. Habel stated she shares the concern about the Tomoka Farms Road and the Beville Road extension. She asked what members were expected to do with the email when it is received.

Ms. Bouck replied there will be a link to the survey with suggested language explaining the survey to forward to friends, family, co-workers, etc.

Ms. Habel asked if they were planning on coordinating with other county departments such as the library and what events they were planning on attending.

Ms. Bouck replied yes; they will attend One Voice for Volusia's next meeting, they have reached out to Cycle Flagler, a car show in DeLand and the farmer's markets.

Mr. Peterson referred to the marketing plan and asked how many events they were going to attend.

Ms. Bouck replied three; one in East Volusia, one in West Volusia and one in Flagler County.

Ms. Blankenship announced the TPO will also be present at the Oak Hill River Fest.

Mr. Peterson referred to Question 10 and the most dangerous intersections and asked if that information would be correlated to the location of the respondent.

Ms. Bouck replied yes, they will be able to correlate that; the survey asks the zip codes of where the respondent lives and works.

Mr. Peterson confirmed they would know which respondents were from Flagler County and what intersection is most important to them. He referred to the optional questions that refer to race and income and asked what relevance that has to the survey.

Ms. Blankenship replied that lets the TPO know if they have reached out to a good section of each area; those are optional questions and people do not have to answer.

Mr. Peterson commented that because of the controversy with the census question he wondered if it should be there; he was unaware of any enclaves in Flagler County and Volusia County that are ethnically related. He asked if it was by ethnicity or income.

Ms. Blankenship replied FHWA requires the TPO to track how it is reaching out to the underserved and low income population.

Ms. Lendian commented she did not see Uber or that type of transportation as a choice for Question 2 and asked if there was a place to write it in.

Ms. Blankenship replied it is not an option because the question asks what type of transportation is used three or more times a week. Typically, Uber is not used more than every once in a while. In the future, as it becomes more popular, that response will be added.

Ms. Lendian replied she asked because her daughter's boyfriend recently used Uber to go to and from work for a several weeks while his car was being repaired.

Ms. Habel agreed; it should be added.

Mr. Peterson suggested that if Uber is added, it should be Uber/Taxi.

Ms. Blankenship asked if the committee was requesting the addition of an Uber/Taxi option to Question 2.

The committee confirmed.

Ms. Stevens-Foltz referred to the link the members would receive and asked if it went to just the survey in the link or if it went to another page that information on the survey.

Ms. Bouck replied members will receive a sample email to use if they wish and the survey website will have information about the TPO and the survey campaign.

Ms. Blankenship explained the link will go directly to a page similar to the one shown on the screen and will explain the purpose. There are flyers available that have more information.

Ms. Gillespie commented that 38% of the public does not have a computer and asked how the survey would reach them.

Ms. Bouck replied there will be hard copies available at the libraries, schools, Department of Motor Vehicles, courthouses, bus stations, etc.

Ms. Gillespie suggested having them at the museums; there are two in New Smyrna Beach and she would like to see them at both. There has been good response from the public when the museums were used to get the word out. She also suggested contacting the League of Cities to help with distribution. She likes that the survey asks for both a home zip code and a work zip code. She will put the flyer up at her church and Homeowner's Association bulletin boards.

MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Lendian to recommend approval of the 2018 River to Sea TPO's "Tell the TPO" Survey questions with the addition of the Uber/Taxi option to Question 2. The motion was seconded by Ms. Gillespie and carried unanimously.

V. Presentation Items

A. <u>Presentation and Discussion to Bundle Holly Hill Sidewalk Projects Along Center Avenue, Flomich Street and 15th Street</u>

Ms. Nicoulin stated the TPO received a request from the city of Holly Hill to bundle five separate projects that are currently on the Bicycle/Pedestrian Priority List. One project is on Tier A and is funded for design, two projects are on Tier B awaiting funding, and two projects are on Tier C awaiting feasibility studies. One of the feasibility studies has been completed; the other project is currently ranked at number 10. There is a representative here from Holly Hill to provide more information on the request.

Mr. Antoine Khoury, City Engineer for Holly Hill, gave a PowerPoint presentation and explained the city's plan for moving forward with these sidewalk projects. The main goal of these projects is to serve Holly Hill Elementary School and improve pedestrian circulation for school access. He reviewed the individual projects for Center Avenue, which has two phases; Flomich Street, which has two phases; and 15th Street, which has one phase. Flomich Street, Phase 1, is on Tier A and is funded for design in FY 2018/19; the city is requesting a delay of this funding to FY 2019/20 and would like to combine all five projects under one contract. This recommendation came from Volusia County; they believe it will save money and it will reprioritize these projects by cost effectiveness. The city is requesting funding for design in FY 2019/20. The city would like to maintain the option of partnering with Volusia County or have the city get Local Agency Program (LAP) certified. The city is requesting \$235,000 from FDOT for design; the city will provide a 10% local match of \$23,500 bringing the total design cost to \$225,250.

Ms. Nicoulin stated this request is a first for the TPO and they wanted to bring it before the committees to get feedback.

Ms. Gillespie asked if any of these projects are currently in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Ms. Nicoulin replied yes; the project on Tier A is funded for design for next year.

Ms. Gillespie asked if this request would cause a problem within the organization if the projects are consolidated. She can see the point of the request and it looks good but the TPO has never done this before.

Ms. Nicoulin replied it has not been done before; the TPO wants to know the concerns of the committees and the TPO Board.

Ms. Gillespie asked how long it would take the city to get LAP certified.

Mr. Khoury replied it could be as quick as two months or it could take as long as nine months; that is why the city is asking for the delay in funding.

Mr. Peterson asked in what way bundling the projects would be cost effective. It is now a series of projects at different levels on the priority list; he asked what the cost effectiveness of consolidating the projects would be.

Mr. Khoury replied it would be in having one contract instead of advertising and awarding five different contracts. The city would like to have the priority of the projects re-established; some of the projects have right-of-way issues and the ones that do not can move forward faster. Flomich Street has right-of-way challenges and he is not sure if it can move forward as the first project whereas Center Avenue has 100 feet of right-of-way and can be done much faster.

Mr. Peterson asked if these projects are consolidated into one project how it would affect other projects currently on the priority list.

Ms. Nicoulin replied the one project on Tier A is funded for design; the next projects on Tier B are awaiting funding. She showed the priority list and explained what projects will fall off and how the Holly Hill projects would move up. One of the feasibility studies on Tier C has been completed; the other project would come off Tier C and roll into the bundle. Tier B projects would not affect any other project but the projects on Tier C would.

Mr. Peterson asked what happens to the money from the project that is funded.

Ms. Nicoulin replied the city is requesting that project be deferred for one year. The TPO funds projects as money becomes available; it does not look like there is money to fund this project next year. The TPO has already programmed its money for next year.

Discussion continued.

Ms. Bollenback stated the TPO has worked with cities before to bundle projects; but typically, the projects come in that way. Originally, Holly Hill did not have the staff to get LAP certified; they have since hired someone to do that. Before that, they were working with Volusia County; the county wants it as one bundled project rather than having five contracts. The challenge is the TPO has not changed a project to a bundled project after they are on the priority list; how to do this without setting a precedent. These are projects that link together and they could have been submitted as one project. Some of the projects have right-of-way issues and some can be done easily; by bundling the projects, they can go through the design process and see what is easy and what is not and then separate the projects. The question is how to do this within the TPO's process so that it does not harm other projects.

Discussion continued.

Ms. Lipovsky asked what the cost difference would be between bundling the projects and keeping them individual projects.

Ms. Bollenback replied there are costs that are not quantified such as going through the LAP process and issuing contracts five times instead of one. Also, smaller projects get bid at higher unit costs so by bundling them it is more competitive.

Mr. Khoury stated the most important thing is the LAP certification; if the projects are separate, the city will have to get prequalified five times. They would like the option to reprioritize these projects based on the available right-of-way. Center Avenue has no right-of-way issues and could move up first.

Discussion continued.

Vice Chairperson Blais closed the discussion due to time constraints.

B. <u>Presentation and Discussion of the 2018R2CTPO Annual Planning Retreat</u>

(Handout)

Ms. Blankenship gave a PowerPoint presentation of the 2018 R2CTPO Annual Planning Retreat and stated it was held Friday, March 23, 2018 at the Brannon Center in New Smyrna Beach in partnership with Volusia County Association for Responsible Development (VCARD). There were 126 attendees including TPO Board advisory committee members, the press, citizens, consultants, city and government staff, as well as VCARD members. The purpose of the retreat was to provide a forum to discuss and explore current and future transportation technology. It also incorporated some of the TPO's core planning elements including the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) and how the TPO will include advancing technologies. She reviewed the opening exercise, the five presentations and presenters and showed a video on how the "Travel Safely" app works. She explained the different vehicles on display and stated test rides were given in the autonomous Tesla; the "Travel Safely" app was used in that vehicle. She stated the TPO conducted a post-retreat survey that and the results were positive; respondents rated the retreat nine out of ten in satisfaction. The survey suggested topics for next year's retreat and the top selection was "Transportation in Supporting Economic Development" followed by "What Will Transportation Look Like in the Next 25 Years". All the presentations given at the retreat are available on the TPO's website.

C. <u>Presentation and Discussion of the R2CTPO Transportation System Management & Operations (TSM&O)</u> <u>Master Plan</u>

Ms. Nicoulin introduced Mr. Dale Cody, Metric Engineering, to give the presentation. Phase 1 of the TSM&O Master Plan was completed in 2016 and in August, the TPO started Phase 2.

Mr. Cody gave a PowerPoint presentation of the R2CTPO Transportation System Management and Operations (TSM&O) Master Plan. He explained that TSM&O are strategies that use technology to leverage existing roadway infrastructure such as traffic signals. Typically, these are actively managed with real-time operations and not something that has been traditionally funded through an MPO. TSM&O can identify detector failures, help with evacuations, incident management and surveillance to allow operators to view the roadways and incidents in real-time. To do this appropriate staffing and resources are needed to expand the infrastructure, fill in gaps in fiber optics, etc. Currently, it is funded below the level recommended by FHWA. Interagency cooperation and data sharing with other agencies is very important. The results of effective TSM&O are fewer unnecessary delays, smooth evacuations and improved incident management. Also, we will be able to do performance measurements, leverage FDOT assets and increase efficiency for lower cost than traditional roadway improvements. He reviewed the strategies from implementation and potential avenues for funding. TSM&O benefits all users of the roadway systems and makes the transportation system reliable and consistent.

Chairperson Papa called the meeting of the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) to order at 3:10 p.m. The roll was called and it was determined that a quorum was present.

II. Introduction of New TCC Members (TCC Only)

Chairperson Papa introduced Mr. Jason Lawrence, Lake Helen representative.

III. Press/Citizen Comments

There were no press/citizen comments.

IV. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of March 20, 2018 TCC Meeting Minutes

MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Mendez to approve the March 20, 2018 TCC meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Paradise and carried unanimously.

B. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2018-## Amending the FY 2017/18 to 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Ms. Nicoulin stated this proposed amendment is for three projects; the first two are FDOT resurfacing projects along I-95. The first one is to revise the funding to add an additional \$4.92 million to the construction phase; the second is to program new funding of \$1 million to the design phase. The third is a Volusia County project programming local funding in the amount of \$110,000 for the design phase of East Volusia Traffic Management Center.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Holmes to recommend approval of Resolution 2018-## amending the FY 2017/18 to 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The motion was seconded by Ms. Winsett and carried unanimously.

C. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2018-## Adopting the FY 2018/19 and 2019/20 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Ms. Nicoulin stated the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) was developed by TPO staff and the UPWP Subcommittee and was presented to advisory committees and the TPO Board last month. It was submitted to FDOT and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for review and comment. The TPO received three minor comments which were incorporated into the document. The resolution is for a recommendation for adoption of the UPWP.

MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Winsett to recommend approval of Resolution 2018-## adopting the FY 2018/19 and 2019/20 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The motion was seconded by Mr. Paradise and carried unanimously.

D. Review and Recommend Approval of the 2018 River to Sea TPO's "Tell the TPO" Survey and Survey Kick-Off

(Handout)

Ms. Blankenship introduced Ms. Lara Bouck, H.W. Lochner, Project Manager, to give the updated presentation.

Ms. Bouck gave a PowerPoint presentation and stated the goals of the survey. The survey will launch on Monday, April 30, 2018; the online version will go live on that date and the hard copies will be dispersed throughout the area. The draft questions are provided in the agenda. There was space for two new questions and based on instructions from the TPO Board those questions have been identified. New question 9 asks which types of transportation projects are the highest priorities to fund with the TPO's limited resources and new question 10 asks which of the 10 highest crash locations are of the greatest concern. She reviewed the marketing plan designed to get the maximum exposure; the target goal is to receive 2,000 responses. The survey will be available in English and Spanish and be dispersed throughout the East and West Volusia County and in Flagler County. The random prize drawing is a two-night stay for

two people in a local area hotel. She reviewed the TPO Board and the committee challenges; the winner of each will receive a trophy. On Friday, April 28, 2018, an email will be sent to the TCC members with the link specific to the TCC to forward to co-workers, family and friends. There will also be an update in May on which committee is in the lead. The CAC suggested one change to Question 2; adding "Uber/Taxi" as an option.

Chairperson Papa asked what form the survey would be in at the community events.

Ms. Bouck replied hard copies and probably a couple of i-Pads.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Karet to recommend approval of the 2018 River to Sea TPO's "Tell the TPO" Survey questions with the addition of the Uber/Taxi option to Question 2. The motion was seconded by Mr. Joulani and carried unanimously.

V. Presentation Items

A. <u>Presentation and Discussion to Bundle Holly Hill Sidewalk Projects Along Center Avenue, Flomich Street and 15th Street</u>

Ms. Nicoulin stated the TPO received a request from the city of Holly Hill to bundle five separate projects that are currently on the Bicycle/Pedestrian Priority List. One project is on Tier A and is funded for design, two projects are on Tier B awaiting funding, and two projects are on Tier C awaiting feasibility studies. One of the feasibility studies has been completed; the other project is currently ranked at number 10. There is a representative here from Holly Hill to provide more information on the request.

Mr. Antoine Khoury, City Engineer for Holly Hill, gave a PowerPoint presentation and explained the city's plan for moving forward with these sidewalk projects. The main goal of these projects is to serve Holly Hill Elementary School and improve pedestrian circulation for school access. He reviewed the individual projects for Center Avenue, which has two phases; Flomich Street, which has two phases; and 15th Street, which has one phase. Flomich Street, Phase 1, is on Tier A and is funded for design in FY 2018/19; the city is requesting a delay of this funding to FY 2019/20 and would like to combine all five projects under one contract. This recommendation came from Volusia County; they believe it will save money and it will reprioritize these projects by cost effectiveness. The city is requesting funding for design in FY 2019/20. The city would like to maintain the option of partnering with Volusia County or have the city get Local Agency Program (LAP) certified. The city is requesting \$235,000 from FDOT for design; the city will provide a 10% local match of \$23,500 bringing the total design cost to \$225,250. They are requesting this bundle to make the projects more cost effective and move them forward.

Mr. Paradise asked if bundling the projects would advance them on the priority list.

Ms. Nicoulin explained that is why this item is on the agenda; to address these questions. One project is on Tier A and is programmed for design in 2018/19; they are looking at bringing the additional projects into that programmed phase and pushing it out an additional year. The answer to his question is yes; there are two projects on Tier B that are next in line for funding. The issue is what to do with the projects on Tier C; they are not required to go through a feasibility study and they have not submitted an application for Tier B, project implementation.

Mr. Joulani commented he understands what the city is trying to do but asked if it would negatively affect other projects on the priority list that are competing for funds.

Ms. Nicoulin replied potentially; only one project is on Tier A. She reviewed the Tier B projects and explained the two Holly Hill projects will be next in line for funding. The question is what to do with the projects on Tier C. Those projects will not go through the traditional annual call for projects. They are requesting bundling for the design phase; the construction phase will be dependent on which project is ready for construction based on design.

Mr. Paradise commented he is not comfortable with dodging the call for projects and ranking process. This seems like it is going outside of a long established and understood process on how to achieve funding.

Mr. Finley commented he thinks it is a great idea to bundle these projects; the projects on Tier A and Tier B total approximately \$200,000 in design cost. He asked if it would affect the construction ranking and if the Tier C projects would still be ranked lower or would they move up.

Mr. Khoury replied yes; the challenge is the cost effectiveness. There is an open drainage ditch that will be hard to design and implement construction. The city wants to bundle so that it can identify what projects can move forward.

Mr. Finley stated because of the proximity of these projects, it makes sense to have it as one design project.

Mr. Khoury replied that is the idea; to have one design project. However, he does not think all of them will move forward to construction.

Mr. Finley commented that if it does not change the construction ranking he does not see how it would negatively impact other projects.

Ms. Nicoulin stated the CAC and the BPAC discussed bundling these projects for design but leaving them where they are on the priority list with a note that they are bundled for design; moving them into construction when appropriate. Also, requiring the Tier C projects to go through the process and submit a project application next year so that they are ranked and on the appropriate list. The TPO is trying to move projects along and these particular projects were submitted at time when the city did not have the staff to become LAP certified. They have now hired staff and are able to do that but it is a project specific LAP process. Instead of going through it five times, they only want to go through it once.

Ms. Mendez asked Mr. Harris to show the Tier A list and asked if bundling the projects and increasing the funding would affect any projects on the Tier A list; specifically, the West French Avenue sidewalk and bike lane. That project is out for bid now and she wants to know how moving projects from other tiers will affect funding for Tier A projects.

Mr. Harris replied the list is last year's adopted list and has had some administrative changes; it is up to date as of November 2017 so it is not current; next month the new draft List of Priority Projects will be presented and will include the new projects from the recent call for projects.

Ms. Mendez asked if the city would be willing to wait until the list is updated and then request the bundling.

Mr. Harris replied this is for discussion today and next month the committee will take action.

Mr. Walker reiterated Ms. Nicoulin's statement that these projects came about when the city did not have LAP funding; projects were stagnating and not moving forward so they contacted Volusia County. The county is willing to partner with them but want the projects bundled so they can do everything as one project to save money and be more efficient; this is a requirement. Since then, the city has hired a Public Works Director and a Finance Director who have experience with the LAP certification; the city is pursuing that. It will be one or the other. The sidewalks are all connected and surround the school. If they had had the forethought, they would have sent them in as one application.

Discussion continued.

Mr. Holmes stated he is opposed to this if it hurts other projects or jurisdictions, especially without knowing the cost.

Ms. Nicoulin replied the design cost for the project on Tier A is \$100,000; the estimated design cost for all five projects is \$250,000. It is not a big cost change for design; the construction cost and whether there is right-of-way will be the issue. They are asking to bundle the design and the construction will be done as they able to do it.

Mr. Paradise stated his concern is about setting a precedent. It may be fine in this instance, but what about the next one?

Chairperson Papa commented his concern is for the projects on Tier C; they have not gone through a feasibility study and do not know what the design costs would be; the reason for a feasibility study is to get the cost estimate for design. He asked how much the city knows as to what those projects might actually cost if they leap to Tier A.

Ms. Nicoulin replied that projects on Tier C are not required to go through a feasibility study; it is a service that the TPO offers if the cities do not have the expertise on staff to do those feasibility studies and develop a cost estimate. Volusia County does have in-house staff and Holly Hill has new staff that can provide that. The TPO can bring this back for more discussion if the committee wishes.

Chairperson Papa asked if the \$235,000 Holly Hill is requesting for design is reasonable.

Mr. Khoury replied yes; there are some insurmountable challenges for some of these projects such as right-of-way. No matter what the city does, one or maybe two of these projects may drop off because they are not cost effective. They could do some pedestrian enhancements instead.

Chairperson Papa questioned the projects going through the process if they are not buildable.

Mr. Khoury replied that is why they are bundling the projects; to see what they can and cannot do.

Discussion continued.

B. <u>Presentation and Discussion of the 2018R2CTPO Annual Planning Retreat</u>

Ms. Blankenship gave a PowerPoint presentation of the 2018 R2CTPO Annual Planning Retreat and stated it was held Friday, March 23, 2018 at the Brannon Center in New Smyrna Beach in partnership with Volusia County Association for Responsible Development (VCARD). There were 126 attendees including TPO Board advisory committee members, the press, citizens, consultants, city and government staff, as well as VCARD members. The purpose of the retreat was to provide a forum to discuss and explore current and future transportation technology. It also incorporated some of the TPO's core planning elements including the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) and how the TPO will include advancing technologies. She reviewed the opening exercise, the five presentations and presenters and showed a video on how the "Travel Safely" app works. She explained the different vehicles on display and stated test rides were given in the autonomous Tesla; the "Travel Safely" app was used in that vehicle. She stated the TPO conducted a post-retreat survey that and the results were positive; respondents rated the retreat nine out of ten in satisfaction. The survey suggested topics for next year's retreat and the top selection was "Transportation in Supporting Economic Development" followed by "What Will Transportation Look Like in the Next 25 Years". All the presentations given at the retreat are available on the TPO's website.

C. <u>Presentation and Discussion of the R2CTPO Transportation System Management & Operations (TSM&O)</u> <u>Master Plan</u>

Ms. Nicoulin introduced Mr. Dale Cody, Metric Engineering, to give the presentation. Phase 1 of the TSM&O Master Plan was completed in 2016 and in August, the TPO started Phase 2.

Mr. Cody gave a PowerPoint presentation of the R2CTPO Transportation System Management and Operations (TSM&O) Master Plan. He explained that TSM&O are strategies that use technology to leverage existing roadway infrastructure such as traffic signals. Typically, these are actively managed with real-time operations and not something that has been traditionally funded through an MPO. TSM&O can identify detector failures, help with evacuations, incident management and surveillance to allow operators to view the roadways and incidents in real-time. To do this appropriate staffing and resources are needed to expand the infrastructure, fill in gaps in fiber optics, etc. Currently, it is funded below the level recommended by FHWA. Interagency cooperation and data sharing with other agencies is very important. The results of effective TSM&O are fewer unnecessary delays, smooth evacuations and improved incident management. Also, we will be able to do performance measurements, leverage FDOT assets and increase efficiency for lower cost than traditional roadway improvements. He reviewed the strategies from implementation and potential avenues for funding. TSM&O benefits all users of the roadway systems and makes the transportation system reliable and consistent.

D. <u>FDOT Report</u>

The FDOT report was provided in the agenda.

E. Volusia and Flagler County Construction Reports

The Volusia County Construction Report was provided in the agenda. There is no Flagler County Construction Report this month.

VI. Staff Comments

® Update on Annual Call for Projects

Ms. Nicoulin stated the Annual Call for Projects closed earlier this month and announced there will be a TIP Subcommittee meeting this Thursday to review the applications. The TPO received six feasibility applications and seven project implementation applications for Bicycle/Pedestrian projects. For Traffic Operations and Safety, the TPO received three feasibility applications, seven project implementation applications and four applications for planning studies.

® Update on Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs)

Ms. Nicoulin announced the issue with the patents that caused the approval for rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFBs) to be rescinded has been resolved and FHWA has issued a new interim approval for RRFBs. The informational memorandum is provided in the agenda.

Ms. Winsett referred to page 67 of the agenda, the memorandum from FHWA, and read "A State may request Interim Approval for all jurisdictions in that State" and asked if FDOT District 5 had applied for that and if it is only for state roads or all roads in the state.

Ms. Nicoulin replied she would confirm that and send out an email.

Ms. Nicoulin referred to the earlier discussion on bundling the Holly Hill projects; part of their request was to defer funding that has already been programmed. That can be difficult to do because sometimes funding may not be available in out years. Currently, the TPO is programmed out for three years; FDOT prefers five years. If an agency has a request to defer a project, the TPO may not have funding for the year they want to defer. Also, if an agency does not have a good idea of what the construction cost will be for a project, it is better not program it based on a low estimate because that leads to cost overruns; the agency is responsible for that cost overruns. In the past, an agency has requested additional funding for cost overruns from the TPO Board and been approved because the TPO had money that it needed to spend. That is no longer the case and the TPO does not have extra funds. The TPO has received several letters of continuing support for the projects on the priority list from the municipalities. She urged members that

have not submitted their letters of support to do so by April 30, 2018 and to include updated cost estimates.

B. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE CENTRAL FLORIDA REGIONAL TRANSIT STUDY

Background Information:

The Central Florida Regional Transit Study (CFRTS) follows recommendations provided by the East Central Florida Corridor Task Force (ECFCTF) to develop a consensus-driven regional transit vision. With the planning horizons of 2040 (interim term) and 2060 (long term), the ten-county-region CFRTS study aims to accomplish a number of goals, including to establish a base transit condition, and to identify and develop strategies for advancing a conceptual regional transit vision framework, identify interim and long-term, high priority transit investments. The intent of the CFRTS is to support transit agencies, MPO/TPOs, and FDOT coordinate transit planning efforts and to support long range transportation plan (LRTP) development.

The CFRTS was conducted over the past 12-14 months, with findings recently presented to Transit Providers and the Project Advisory Group (PAG) which consisted of members representing the six MPO/TPOs and FDOT in the study area. These findings will be incorporated into the larger "East Central Florida Corridor Evaluation Study" which extends to January 2019.

Findings from the CFRTS will be presented to the six MPO/TPOs in the study area, and then the final plan will be presented to the Central Florida MPO Alliance (CFMPOA).

C. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE DRAFT FY 2018 LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)

Background Information:

The River to Sea TPO develops seven lists of priority projects (LOPP), each representing a different category of projects. Once adopted, the lists are transmitted to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) district office for use in allocating transportation funds to the area.

Two of the priority project lists – the Strategic Intermodal System projects (SIS); Regionally Significant, and Non-SIS Roadway projects list – were updated to refect changes to the status of projects already on the lists (e.g., completed phase(s), updated cost estimates, etc.).

Four additional lists — the Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations-focused) projects; Bicycle/Pedestrian and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian-focused) projects; Regional Trails projects; and Transportation Planning Studies — are updated annually with the "call for projects". Project applications submitted to the TPO are reviewed and ranked based upon the criteria developed through the committee process and approved by the River to Sea TPO Board.

For Transit projects, the TPO generally defers to Votran and Flagler County Public Transportation to determine project priorities.

The draft priority project lists reflect changes to the status of projects already on the lists (e.g., completed phase(s), updated cost estimates, etc.). The draft Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Project List will be provided under separate cover. The Transportation Planning Studies list includes new projects received through the "call for projects". These have been reviewed and scored by the TIP Subcommittee and added in ranked order according to the project scores.

The draft Bicycle/Pedestrian and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian-focused) project list and the Regional Trails project list are reviewed by the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee and are provided herein to the CAC and TCC for information purposes only.

A strike-through and underlined version is provided to reflect changes from the 2017 Lists of Priority Projects.

D. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE DRAFT FY 2018/19 TO 2022/23 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Background Information:

The TPO is required by 23 U.S.C. 134(j) Florida Statute 339.175 to develop a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a program of transportation projects covering a period of five years. The TIP is developed and formally adopted by the TPO each year. It must be consistent with the Long Range Transportation Plan, and required for projects to be eligible for funding under title 23 U.S.C. and title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53. The TIP is developed in cooperation with FDOT, local governments, public transit operators and the public.

The TIP lists capital and non-capital surface transportation projects proposed for funding under Title 23 U.S.C. and Title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 (including transportation enhancements; safety projects; trails projects; pedestrian walkways; and bicycle facilities). Also required to be included are all regionally significant projects requiring an action by FHWA or FTA regardless of funding source and projects that implement paratransit plans required for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. For information and conformity purposes, the TIP includes all regionally significant projects to be funded with federal funds other than those administered by the FHWA or FTA, as well as all regionally significant projects to be funded with non-federal funds. Florida law also requires the TIP to include a list of locally and privately-funded projects for informational purposes. Due to its relatively large size we are providing the draft TIP and a report comparing the draft TIP to the current adopted TIP for viewing and downloading from the TPO's website at:

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
