MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Biro to approve the March 21, 2023 CAC minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Heyne and carried unanimously.

B. Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2023-## Amending the FY 2022/23 to 2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (Roll Call Vote Required)

Ms. Nicoulin stated that this item is for the addition of a rail safety project in DeLand on South Ridgewood Avenue just north of Old New York Avenue; it is to upgrade the rail crossing for safety. The upgrade will bring the rail crossing up to current standards.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Feldman to recommend approval of Resolution 2023-## amending the FY 2022/23 to 2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The motion was

seconded by Mr. McKenna and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

# IV. Presentation Items

# A. Presentation and Discussion of the SR A1A Resiliency Plan

Ms. Catalina Chacon, Mr. Ty Garner, and Mr. Joseph Fontanelli, FDOT, gave a PowerPoint presentation on the SR A1A Resiliency Plan. The presentation covered the damage that occurred after Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, the history of SR A1A, and the cost of the repairs in the last 6 months. The Resiliency Plan Strike Team, FDOT, and stakeholders looked at the focus area which covered thirteen miles, beginning in Volusia County at Roberta Road in Ormond Beach to Osprey Drive in Flagler County. She reviewed the identified critical areas, viable options, and recommendations.

Discussion ensued about turtles and nesting as well as the removal of boulders and coquina rock.

Mr. Feldman stated that the location slightly north of Mariners Drive was underwater during the last hurricane.

Mr. Garner responded that they are addressing the drainage issues and doing what they can to mitigate the concerns.

Mr. Fendley thanked FDOT and the Army Corp of Engineers. He asked if they had looked at lowering speeds to make the roads safer.

Mr. Fontanelli responded that they had; in addition to creating a geometry as they narrow the lanes, they are also aiding the bicycle/pedestrian facilities by creating raised areas that inhibit speeds. They are currently implementing that, and the intent is to emulate the 35-mph speed throughout the area.

Mr. Garner added that they are looking to extend the project limits south to the Volusia/Flagler County line.

Mr. McKenna asked what the overall cost was for the project.

Mr. Garner responded the cost was an estimated \$117 million for the two wall sections and some of the roadway improvements.

Ms. Nice asked if there were any plans for Daytona Beach.

Mr. Garner stated there were no plans there regarding sea walls featuring garnishment from FDOT.

Ms. Lendian asked about the elevation difference over the thirteen miles from the road to the beach.

Mr. Garner stated the north section where they put the wall in last time was about eight to ten feet. He added that they would get the information to the TPO to send out.

# B. Presentation and Discussion of FDOT Smart Scopes

Ms. Celine Bounds, FDOT, gave a PowerPoint presentation on FDOT Smart Scopes. She explained that Smart Scopes are designed to alleviate the pitfalls of 4P scopes; their purpose is to create more adaptable scopes to the current criteria as well as community and department needs during design. She reviewed the Smart Scoping process which involves much more community input; community visioning meetings with the FDOT Scoping team and local agency partners to present candidate 3R projects, safety issues, and initial recommended target speeds. She explained how projects are selected for the area.

Mr. Feldman asked how they base their studies; from the public, jurisdictions, or FDOT observations.

Ms. Bounds responded that it is based on community feedback from the meetings, information from FDOT staff, and their own safety and field reviews.

# C. Presentation and Discussion of Reducing Bicycle Fatalities through Social Marketing

Ms. Blankenship gave a PowerPoint presentation on a project that came out of a *Social Marketing in Transportation* course that she and Ms. Stephanie Moss, FDOT, completed through the University of South Florida and the Center for Urban Transportation Research (CUTR). She reviewed the pilot project designed to reduce bicycle fatalities and how it was developed through the social marketing process. Ms. Moss is currently working on a scope for a task order to implement the project.

Ms. Biro suggested applying for a grant to offset the cost of the gift cards.

Ms. Blankenship stated that FDOT does offer small grants and she would look into that.

It was noted that if the pilot project works, the social marketing method used could be adapted to different populations and problems.

# D. <u>Presentation and Update of Performance Measures Updates for PM2 (Bridge & Pavement) and PM3 (System Performance & Freight Movement)</u>

(Handout provided)

Ms. Nicoulin explained that federal transportation law requires state DOTs and TPOs to implement transportation performance management; a strategic approach to connecting investment and policy planning decisions to meet performance goals. She reviewed the PM1 safety goals and targets which are adopted annually; earlier this year, the TPO adopted FDOT's goal of Target Zero. The PM2 and PM3 goals and targets are required to be adopted every four years. Last time, the TPO supported FDOT's goals; in supporting the state's goals and targets, the TPO is agreeing to participate in the process and program projects that help them meet those targets. This year the TPO is proposing to support the state's targets; in 2025. This will be back next month for recommended action to adopt the targets.

# E. FDOT Report

Ms. Rakinya Hinson, FDOT, stated the FDOT report was provided in the agenda. She referred the members to <a href="www.cflroads.com">www.cflroads.com</a> for the most up-to-date project information and noted she was available for any questions. She introduced Ms. Yessenia Encarnacion, the new TPO Liaison who is responsible for the Space Coast TPO and Lake-Sumter MPO.

Ms. Hinson noted that in regard to the questions asked at the last CAC meeting, she sent the information regarding the residents' complaints about the crosswalk on SR A1A at the Hard Rock Hotel to the FDOT Safety Office. They are looking into it, and she will follow up. The other outstanding item is a repair on Nova Road and Bellevue Avenue, a gap in the concrete. She spoke with the Operations Center, and they said there had been a recent emergency repair due to a utility repair underneath the roadway. The gap is a placeholder because additional repairs are still being done. The contractor is awaiting inspection to be able to finish the repair. They could not close the gap until the other repairs were done. They are waiting on a permanent repair as soon as the contractor is able to move forward.

Ms. Hinson announced that this month is Distracted Driving Awareness Month, and this week is Work Zone Safety Awareness Week.

Mr. Collins stated that for the project at Nova Road and Bellevue Avenue, the crew only had one cone set up in the middle lane to alert drivers.

Ms. Hinson made a note of the information and added that she was unsure of who the contractor was but would find out.

motion was seconded by Ms. Winsett and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

# A. Presentation and Discussion of the SR A1A Resiliency Plan

Ms. Catalina Chacon, Mr. Ty Garner, and Mr. Joseph Fontanelli, FDOT, gave a PowerPoint presentation on the SR A1A Resiliency Plan. The presentation covered the damage that occurred after Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, the history of SR A1A, and the cost of the repairs in the last six months. The Resiliency Plan Strike Team, FDOT, and stakeholders looked at the focus area which covered thirteen miles, beginning in Volusia County at Roberta Road in Ormond Beach to Osprey Drive in Flagler County. They reviewed the identified critical areas, viable options, and recommendations.

Discussion ensued about the meaning of self-healing protection in granite revetment.

Ms. Mendez asked what the cost difference was between a retaining wall and a secant wall.

Mr. Garner responded that there was a hardpan about 12-14 feet down; therefore, a sheet pile wall is almost not an option. It would also corrode. A secant wall may cost twice as much but it has a 70-year life cycle.

Mr. Karet asked about the areas in Volusia County, north of Ponce Inlet where A1A is protected by private property to the east; some areas of the property have lost 80 feet and there are only 50 feet between the edge of the properties and A1A. He asked if there had been any thought regarding restoration there.

Mr. Garner stated that the FDOT perspective is that the road itself is not in jeopardy. The benefit-to-cost ratio is zero at this time; there is currently no chance of losing A1A. In addition, A1A is not a state road at that location.

Ms. Eaton asked if a longer timeframe was being looked at beyond 70 years because we are seeing stronger storms.

Mr. Garner responded that the design would handle any storm that would hit today. It is uncertain if we can predict what a storm will look like in ten years.

Ms. Eaton asked if they anticipate the design will impact the areas next to the walls.

Mr. Garner responded yes.

Ms. Chacon added that the areas that are most vulnerable are where they were proposing the fixes.

Florida Department of Transportation requests River to Sea TPO amend the FY 2022/23-2026/27 TIP.

Project #449855-1 is a Local Agency Program (LAP) project in which both a change in project limits and an increase of local funding of more than \$2M and 20% have occurred. These changes will require the TIP to be amended so that the project information is shown accurately and authorization for use of federal funds can be obtained.

To prepare for the new state fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2023, we have identified projects programmed in FY 2024 also requiring amendments to the current TIP. FDOT is requesting the TPO act on amending the additional FY 2024 projects listed in the table below.

Projects #445716-1, #445219-1 and #447082-1 received additional funding increases of more than \$2M and 20% to adjust for cost estimate increases and inflationary factors. Authorization for use of federal funds is needed during the first quarter of FY 2024 to keep the project on schedule in production.

Projects #450782-1 and #447724-1 are projects programmed in FY 2024 and are requested to be added to the current TIP and prevent delay of production. Authorization for use of federal funds is needed during the first quarter of FY 2024 to keep the projects moving forward. These projects are included in the FY 2024-2028 TIP.

# **Background Information:**

Federal transportation law requires state DOTs and MPOs to implement Transportation Performance Management (TPM), a strategic approach to making investment and policy decisions to achieve performance goals.

Three FHWA Performance Measures (PM) rules and two FTA transit rules establish various performance measures to assess highway safety (PM1), bridge and pavement condition (PM2), system performance and freight movement (PM3), transit asset management (TAM), and transit safety. The FHWA and FTA Planning Rule and the performance measures rules also specify when and how MPOs should set targets, report performance, and integrate performance management into their Long Range Transportation Plans (LRTP) and Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP).

At the April meeting of the CAC/TCC, TPO staff presented an overview of the PM2 (Bridge & Pavement) and PM3 (System Performance & Freight Movement) measures and targets and provided Fact Sheets.

**WHEREAS**, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and portions of Flagler County inclusive of the cities

of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) issued the final rule-making needed to implement requirements established through the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) and subsequent provisions in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), which identified national transportation programs for measuring, reporting and target setting of the transportation system; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 23 C.F.R. 490.105(a), the Florida Department for Transportation (FDOT), has developed transportation performance measures and targets for bridge condition, pavement condition and travel time reliability; and

WHEREAS, 23 C.F.R. 490.105(a), requires that each Metropolitan (or Transportation) Planning Organization establish a program of Transportation Performance Management (TPM) that includes transportation measures and targets and each organization will report progress in reaching the adopted targets; and

**WHEREAS**, the River to Sea TPO recognizes that programming decisions regarding resurfacing and bridge maintenance are directed by FDOT; and

**WHEREAS**, the River to Sea TPO supports the efforts of the FDOT in coordinating the data required to develop measures and setting performance targets; and

**Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the River to Sea TPO that the:

- 1. River to Sea TPO Board and advisory committees have reviewed the data and support and adopt the FDOT targets for PM2 (Bridge and Pavement) and PM 3 (System Performance and Freight Movement) as shown in in Exhibit A; and
- 2. Authorize the Executive Director to submit these targets to the:
  - a. Florida Department of Transportation; and
  - b. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and the
  - c. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation).

B. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF OF THE DRAFT FY 2023/24 TO FY 2027/28 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

# **Background Information:**

The TPO is required by 23 U.S.C. 134(j) and Florida Statute 339.175 to develop a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a program of transportation projects covering a period of five years. The TIP is developed and formally adopted by the TPO each year. It must be consistent with the Long Range Transportation Plan, and required for projects to be eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S.C. and Title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53. The TIP is developed in cooperation with FDOT, local governments, public transit operators, and the public.

The TIP lists capital and non-capital surface transportation projects supported with state and/or federal funds. Also required to be included are all regionally significant projects requiring an action by FHWA or FTA regardless of funding source and projects that implement paratransit plans required for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Florida law also requires the TIP to include a list of locally and privately funded projects for informational purposes.

TPO staff will lead a discussion regarding the development of the draft FY 2023/24 to FY 2027/28 TIP and provide an update on notable changes.

# C. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE DRAFT 2023 LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS

# **Background Information:**

The River to Sea TPO develops eight lists of priority projects (LOPP), each representing a different category of projects. Each year, the TPO updates these lists and upon adoption, transmits the lists to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) district office for use in allocating transportation funds to the area.

Two of the priority project lists – the Strategic Intermodal System projects (SIS) and the Regionally Significant, and Non-SIS Roadway projects list – were updated to reflect projects/project phases that have moved into the Work Program and updated cost estimates.

Three of the lists – the Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations-focused) projects; Bicycle/Pedestrian and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian-focused) projects; and Transportation Planning Studies – are updated annually with the "Call for Projects." Project applications submitted to the TPO in these categories are reviewed and ranked by the respective subcommittees based on the criteria developed through the subcommittees and approved by the River to Sea TPO Board.

The Shared Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Projects list contains projects that are populated by the State's SUN Trail Program priorities.

The Transit Projects list contains regional transit projects. The TPO defers to Votran or Flagler County Public Transportation to determine project priorities.

The Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Eligible Projects list contains projects that local governments have identified are ready to advance into the Work Program should funding become available, and have committed to the local match requirement, if required.

The draft 2023 Lists of Priority Projects (LOPP) reflect changes as a result of updates to the status of projects already on the lists (e.g., completed phase(s), updated cost estimates, etc.), as well as the incorporation of new projects received and ranked through the Annual Call for Projects.
