Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum ١.

The meeting of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Board was called to order at 9:01 a.m. by Chairperson Nancy Long. The roll was called and it was determined that a quorum was present.

MOTION: Council Member Patterson moved approval of the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Gilliland seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

٧. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of Resolution 2014-12 Adopting the FY 2014/15 and 2015/16 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Ms. Bollenback explained that the UPWP is a two-year work program for the TPO which begins in July. The document was presented as draft in February and adjusted to include Phase II of the US 92 Corridor Improvement Program (CIP). The UPWP has been reviewed by FDOT and FHWA, comments have been received, and changes have been made, most being minor in nature. There was a request to adjust the amount of total FTA funding from roughly \$208,000 to \$205,000.

MOTION: Commissioner Gilliland moved approval of Resolution 2014-12 adopting the FY 2014/15 and 2015/16 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Council Member Saylor seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

B. Review and Approval of the Resolution 2014-13 Amending the FY 2010/11 and 2011/12 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Ms. Bollenback noted that FTA funds must stay with the original UPWP in which they are received. There are currently unspent funds in the transit element of a prior UPWP, a task to transition to choice ridership. Votran has asked to redesignate those funds to General Planning Activities to allow more flexibility in their use

MOTION: Commissioner Gilliland moved to approve Resolution 2014-13 amending the FY 2010/11 and 2011/12 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Council Member Saylor seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

C. Review and Approval of the Resolution 2014-14 Amending the FY 2014/15 – 2018/19 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Ms. Bollenback explained that FDOT has asked to add two projects to the TIP, both railroad crossing improvements. One is on Mason Avenue and the other is on Dunlawton Avenue.

MOTION: Council Member Denys moved to approve Resolution 2014-14 amending the FY 2014/15 – 2018/19 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Commissioner McGuirk seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

D. Review and Approval of the Resolution 2014-15 Changing the Name of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization to the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (R2CTPO)

Ms. Bollenback noted that the TPO had already taken action in August 2013 to change the name of the organization and it was expected to take effect in concert with the completion of reapportionment; however, the development and review of the agreements needed to complete reapportionment has taken longer than anticipated. Currently there are two tasks, the Long Range Transportation Plan and the Community Transportation Survey that involve significant public outreach as well as expanding the TPO's presence into the new planning area. It would not be beneficial to change the TPO's name while those activities are under way. This is a request to formally change the name of the Volusia TPO to the River to Sea TPO. Legal counsel has recommended the name be changed in the form of a resolution which can be filed with the clerks of court.

Council Member Northey asked if the incoming planning areas have any issues with reapportionment.

Ms. Bollenback responded the only item outstanding was the completion of the agreements.

MOTION: Council Member Northey moved to approve Resolution 2014-15 changing the name of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization to the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (R2CTPO). Commissioner Gilliland seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Ms. Bollenback pointed out that there were insulated bottles with the River to Sea TPO name for each of the TPO Board members. The new River to Sea TPO sign was revealed.

VI. <u>Presentations, Status Reports, and Discussion Items</u>

A. Volusia TPO Community Transportation Survey Campaign Kick-Off

Mr. Denis Eirikis, Clear Light Communications, reviewed the survey goals, marketing plan, survey ambassador program and the next steps. The campaign will run through July 23, 2014. Rack cards were provided to the members. He noted that the ambassador program enlists the TPO Board members to distribute the survey to the public. Today, each board member will receive an email with an individual link to the *Tell the TPO* survey that will specifically tie back to them. The board member with the most completed surveys will win a trophy (the trophy was displayed) in July. He asked the members to let him know if they needed help with newsletters or any other promotional activities.

Mr. Eirikis stated that the survey information will also be posted on Facebook and Twitter after the meeting.

Commissioner Revels asked who she should speak to about doing a radio spot to promote the survey.

Ms. Bollenback stated that she would speak to her and coordinate with anyone wishing to partner with the TPO to promote the survey.

B. Presentation on Votran's New Website and Rider Tools

[Handout provided]

Ms. Blanck gave a PowerPoint presentation on Votran's new website and rider tools including Google Transit.

Council Member Wagner stated that the updating of Votran's website was a great initiative and thanked Daytona Beach for their help. The Votran app is also very easy to use and will be helpful to tourists.

Mayor Pro Tem Matusick asked where the SunRail brochures were going to be placed. She stated that people in Seminole County may be interested and noted that the information should be provided to surrounding counties. She added that on May 1, 2014 the DeLand Intermodal Transportation Center will open. She added that there have been a number of issues with the Votran bus that travels from the east to west side; people have been let off at the corrections center without having a timely transfer. She asked how those issues will be prevented from occurring again.

Ms. Blanck stated that the most recent initiative that will become effective on Monday will be the new schedule; the SunRail schedule is being published separate from the regular service. With the new service, there will be no more bus changes at Northgate on the 60 bus.

Council Member Northey noted that the bus tracker on the Votran website did not show up easily on an ipad and she asked Ms. Blanck to look into that. Council Member Northey asked where the pamphlets would be placed.

Ms. Blanck stated she would look into it. She added that the pamphlets were on the website, all the places where the regular schedules currently are and they are also working on putting them on the SunRail ticket vending machines.

Council Member Northey requested that they be placed at the visitors' bureaus.

Ms. Blanck stated that she would ensure they were placed at the visitors' bureaus and added they would also be at the libraries.

Council Member Northey asked about free transfers.

Ms. Blanck stated that the base \$2.00 fee would be free on SunRail when a customer rides Votran. She noted that the schedule for SunRail has had three adjustments in the last month and requested that the members be patient.

Vice Mayor DeLorenzo asked if there were any plans to place QR codes on the Votran bus stop signs which would launch to the route and show how far the bus is from the stop.

Ms. Blanck introduced "Text the Vo to Go." Votran is in the process of labeling each of the bus stops with numbers; texting the bus number will let you know what time the next bus will be there.

Ms. Bollenback commented that the update to Votran's website was a tremendous undertaking and she credited the staff for getting the attention of Google Transit.

C. Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Presentation

Ms. Martha Moore, Ghyabi & Associates, gave a PowerPoint Presentation on the draft vision statement, goals, objectives and performance measures for the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan. The vision statement, goals, objectives and performance measures have been reviewed by the LRTP Subcommittee, and the CAC and TCC.

Ms. Eliza Harris, Canin and Associates, continued the PowerPoint presentation on the forecast projections for employment and population.

Ms. Bollenback requested feedback from the members regarding the items presented. She noted that the population forecast was 100,000 people less than estimated in the previous LRTP which was significant. The TPO staff will be working with city/county staff to figure out how the population is going to be distributed for the future.

Council Member Northey asked about the LRTP Subcommittee.

Ms. Bollenback noted that the LRTP Subcommittee meets monthly and there will be a presentation to the TPO Board each month regarding the items the LRTP Subcommittee discusses.

Council Member Northey stated that she felt that the board was being left out of the process and asked when the TPO Board would have an opportunity to weigh in.

Ms. Bollenback added that the LRTP Oversight Committee has two board members on it as well as CAC and TCC representatives; that committee oversees the scheduling of the LRTP key milestones. She clarified that the LRTP vision, goals, objectives and performance measures were presented today with the intent to receive feedback from the members.

Councilman Emter asked for a definition of the term "urban area" that is used in the vision statement.

Ms. Bollenback explained that the purpose is to enhance the existing, built environment and not sprawl into environmentally sensitive land.

Council Member Northey requested that the term "urban area" be better defined.

Commissioner Revels stated that the information received from the community transportation survey may help show how citizens feel about transportation in the future. She added that it would be helpful for Flagler County to ask not only what modes of transportation people use regularly but also what they use it for as well as how far they go. She asked if another question could be added to the survey.

Ms. Bollenback explained that every survey leads to more questions. It is a balance to keeping the survey short enough that people will take it versus getting enough information. The survey is intended to be a guide that will elicit further public outreach. She added that questions can added to subsequent efforts but this survey is being launched today.

Mayor Pro Tem Matusick requested that a list of definitions and acronyms be included in the Long Range Transportation Plan.

D. FDOT Report

Ms. Claudia Calzaretta gave the FDOT report.

Council Member Northey stated that she did not receive a notice for the I-4 public meeting in Deltona on Thursday. She asked Ms. Calzaretta to confirm who received the notice and added that if it was not properly noticed the meeting would need to be redone.

Ms. Mary Schoelzel, FDOT, stated that FDOT was trying to find out how it was missed and would let her know. She relayed apologies from Ms. Noranne Downs and Mr. Frank O'Dea, FDOT.

Council Member Cusack asked if the I-4 construction would be completed in early 2015.

Ms. Calzaretta stated she would look into it but did not know if it would be completed in early 2015. She will get the information to Ms. Bollenback to send out to the members.

Mayor Pro Tem Matusick thanked FDOT for their help with Bike Florida. She added that there has been an issue with SunRail taking freight off the line between 10:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight; they blow the whistle in a residential neighborhood and it is disturbing the residents. She asked if that could be changed to occur in the morning or afternoon.

Ms. Calzaretta commented that she would look into it.

Commissioner Revels thanked FDOT for finishing the paving through Flagler Beach to I-95 as well as the June start of the 305 bridge. She asked for an update about the different signage used on bike paths; she had asked about it at the last meeting.

Ms. Calzaretta stated she would speak with her after the meeting.

Ms. Bollenback stated that there is information on the I-4 public meeting at each member's seat. The TPO had just received the information and would be posting it; she asked the members to do so as well. The TPO was not included in the public notice.

Mr. Big John, Press, asked how much the Granada Boulevard project was.

Ms. Calzaretta responded \$4.2 million.

VII. Executive Director's Report

→ Reapportionment Update

Ms. Bollenback stated that staff was working through the three required interlocal agreements to complete reapportionment. It looks like the review process may take some time and reapportionment may occur in June.

→ <u>Legislative Update</u>

Ms. Bollenback stated that Senate Bill 218 will allow flexibility in the state funding program to fund trail projects; this is a legislative priority for the TPO. She added that the Florida Land and Water Legacy referendum proposes to use doc stamp funding for a variety of water and land maintenance issues; it would take 30% of doc stamp funding, which is currently used for the Small County Outreach Program (SCOP), New Starts, Strategic Intermodal Systems (SIS), Florida Rail Enterprise (FRE) and the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) programs.

→ SunRail Update

Ms. Bollenback stated that SunRail was on schedule to begin May 1, 2014 and the first two weeks will be free. Ambassadors will be at each of the stations to assist the public.

→ Values Study Update

Ms. Bollenback stated that the TPO recently contributed to a values study done by Heart + Mind Strategies. A briefing was held to present the preliminary findings and to discuss what the sense of a community is including transportation. The research will be presented in Orlando on June 19, 2014. Information will be sent out via email to the members.

Ms. Bollenback stated that last Thursday the County Council discussed a number of issues, one being the boundaries of the Systems Study (Alternatives Analysis). The boundaries included in the scope are limited. The council discussed the need for the boundaries to be broadened and took action to extend them to the Seminole County Line and recognizing that the Daytona Beach International Airport may not be the best end point. She asked if there was any interest in the TPO Board echoing that sentiment.

Ms. Bollenback noted that the second issue the council discussed related to the I-4 managed use lanes PD&E study. Historically, there has been a rail envelope on I-4 from end to end. As part of the PD&E activity, FDOT has been looking at options that would take away the rail envelope from the Seminole County Line up to SR 472. In September, the FDOT Project Manager gave a presentation to the TPO Board on the rail envelope and it was stated that as we work through the PD&E process there would be an opportunity to make clear whether the TPO supports maintaining the rail envelope. The public meeting tomorrow night will present alternatives that do not preserve the envelope. The TPO Board has never taken a position to remove the rail envelope. She added that the TPO Board can either provide direction today or agenda the discussion for next month.

Council Member Northey stated that the county council was unanimous in their decision that they did not want to give up the rail envelope. She added that she hoped the TPO Board echoed the county council's position to maintain the envelope across the bridge to Seminole County. She stated that she would like to take action today.

Mayor Pro Tem Matusick stated that she strongly supported Council Member Northey's recommendation to leave the rail envelope and take action today.

Mayor Kelley suggested the members attend the I-4 public meeting and wait for next month to take action.

MOTION: Mayor Kelley moved to agenda the item to discuss and take action on the rail envelope on I-4 at the May TPO Board meeting. Council Member Patterson seconded the motion.

Councilman Emter stated he was not in favor of the I-4 widening at the time and that the rail lane should not be removed; the view of the TPO Board should be presented at the public meeting.

AMENDED MOTION: Councilman Emter motioned to amend the motion to establish a preliminary, non-binding opinion today followed by a presentation at the May TPO Board meeting.

Council Member Saylor agreed with maintaining the rail line but added that the board needs to remember that there are plans that could be affected by this.

The amendment was seconded by Council Member Cusack. The amendment to the motion carried with Mayor Kelley and Council Member Patterson opposing.

The amended motion to have a full report at the May TPO Board meeting with a non-binding opinion vote to be taken today carried unanimously.

Councilman Emter moved to take an opinion poll to maintain the I-4 rail envelope. The motion was seconded by Council Member Northey and carried unanimously.

Ms. Bollenback clarified that the vote would permit her to present the TPO Board's opinion that the rail envelope should be maintained at the public meeting tomorrow; in addition a presentation would be given at the May TPO Board meeting with an official vote taking place.

The motion to maintain the rail envelope on I-4 carried unanimously.

Ms. Bollenback asked if it was the direction of the TPO Board to communicate to FDOT that the board supports flexibility in broadening the boundaries for the Systems Study as well as to not preclude recommendations that may create a more efficient, effective system.

MOTION: Mayor Pro Tem Matusick directed the TPO Executive Director to communicate to FDOT that the TPO Board supported broadening the boundaries of the Systems Study. Council Member Northey seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

VIII. <u>Volusia TPO Board Member Comments</u>

Council Member Northey stated that at the state budget conference \$15.5 million was provided for the Coast to Coast Connector Trail. A discussion is needed to find a way to ensure that Edgewater and New Smyrna Beach are considered entry points on the Coast to Coast Connector. She added that on May 6, 2014 she will be taking a group to Orlando on one of the free SunRail rides; she invited the members to attend. She asked if the train would be running on weekends.

Ms. Schoelzel replied it would only run during the week.

Project FM # 4337181, <u>Alternative Analysis – SunRail to Daytona Beach Int'l Airport</u>, project limits are proposed to be amended. The old limits were "between SunRail (commuter rail service) on the west side of Volusia County with the Daytona Beach International Airport on the east side of the county". The new limits are "from SR 46 in Seminole County to US 1 in Daytona Beach, and from US 92 to I-4". Also, the project name is changed to <u>Volusia County Transit Connector Study - SunRail to Daytona Beach</u>, reflecting the new project limits.

1.1 Background

The purpose of the 2040 Constrained Trend Socioeconomic Forecast is to formulate a realistic population and employment projection for input to the transportation model to determine future transportation needs. The level of analysis used by the Florida Standard Urban Transportation Model Structure (FSUTMS) is the Traffic Analysis Zone (TAZ). TAZs vary widely in size based on the intensity of the land use and transportation network and can range from several acres to thousands of acres. The level of output for the dataset is the TAZ.

The most recent update to the socioeconomic data was for the 2035 Volusia TPO Long Range Transportation Plan, which used a base year of 2005. In the interim, an updated based year dataset for 2010 was produced.

The update of the socioeconomic data for the portions of Flagler County that are located within the boundaries of the River to Sea TPO is being accomplished by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). This information will be merged with that for Volusia County once the reapportionment has been approved.

1.2 Control Totals

Population Control Totals

The population component of the Constrained Trend Socioeconomic Forecast is informed by population projections produced by the University of Florida Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR). The Central Florida Regional Planning Model Committee has recommended the use of the BEBR Medium projection for all member jurisdictions. The totals for employment categories and population totals are matched within an error range of approximately 10 persons to control totals. The numbers listed below are for Volusia County only.

The 2010 Base Year Data Set reported a higher population count than the 2010 Census estimate as well as a higher number of dwelling units than was represented by the 2010 Census, resulting in a higher total forecast population. In that the 2010 Base Year dwelling unit count was thoroughly reviewed on a parcel by parcel basis by the TPO, local jurisdictions and the TPO's consultant, the 2040 projection uses the higher 2010 base year population and assumes the same differential from the BEBR projection in future years.

2040 LRTP Update:

2010 Base Year Dwelling Units: 257,538 2010 Population Estimate: 510,189 2040 Population Forecast: 608,296

The 2010 base year population data set is based on permanent residents and excludes non-permanent residents (such as "snowbirds"). The estimated persons per household rate is 1.81 for multi-family dwelling units and 2.37 for single family dwelling units.

Employment Control Totals

The 2040 Control Totals for employment projections were drawn from Woods and Poole projections.

1.3 Approach

The update to the trend forecast is a limited update at the TAZ level using the 2035 forecast as a guide. The socio-economic data is split into two sections: ZDATA1, consisting primarily of population data, and ZDATA2, consisting primarily of employment data.

- The 2035 socioeconomic data forecast is updated to take into account existing development that occurred between the development of the 2005 base year data and the present. The primary new available data is the 2010 base year. The primary goal is to identify TAZs where comparison of the new 2010 base year to the previous 2015 projection (from the 2035 forecast) would show in negative growth or to identify growth that was projected to happen by 2010 that did not actually occur. The future year projections for each TAZ are adjusted accordingly to anticipate any projected growth to occur later or earlier depending on the situation.
- In order to account for changes since the 2035 projection, rates of growth were calculated in units/jobs per year for both 2005-2010 and from the previous projection of 2005-2035. For TAZs where growth happened faster than anticipated, the rate of growth for 2005-2010 was used. Growth that was slower than anticipated was assumed to a result of the economic recession. This temporary slowdown is represented in the new 2010 base year.
- Growth capacity for each TAZ was limited to the highest dwelling units or job count in the 2035 LRTP or, where employment growth occurred in TAZs which was not anticipated in 2035 projections, the capacity was 2010 capacity plus 10% for IND or COM. Service employment was the only category where total 2040 employment exceeded the 2035 growth projection in the 2035 LRTP. As a result, the maximum capacity was used for SER employment in each TAZ plus a factor of 22.4% for those TAZs where unanticipated growth occurred from 2005-2010 to account for TAZs. This factor accounts for growth capacity that was not anticipated in the 2035 projections.
- The number of persons per household has been trending down for the last two decades. This trend was anticipated to continue, resulting in a 2040 persons per household of 2.26 for single-family and 1.79 for multi-family. Research shows that the number of households without children could be as high as 71% by 2030 (Source: Arthur C. Nelson, Metropolitan Research Center, University of Utah).
- Negative Growth: In TAZs where negative job growth occurred from 2005-2010 and negative growth was
 anticipated in the 2035 LRTP projection for 2005-2035, negative growth was projected for 2040 for jobs.
 The primary negative growth occurred under the IND category. Negative growth in dwelling units was

not permitted. Negative growth in population was permitted based on the anticipated change in persons per household.

- Vacancy rates are maintained as in the 2010 base year and vary by TAZ. Any TAZ which does have a
 vacancy rate in 2010 because it has no existing development is assigned the average permanent vacancy
 rate for the county.
- The only major new generator not anticipated in the 2035 plan was the Farmton development. Population and employment were first projected to the control totals without Farmton and then added in Farmton's projected units and jobs. Growth in each TAZ was then adjusted by a percentage to match the control totals as follows: IND: 96.4%, COM: 88.9%, SER: 100%; DU: 85.31%. This percentage was also applied to Farmton's projected growth.
- The LRTP committee and TCC members were requested to review the 2035 employment projections in detail and provide comments on adjustments that should be made. The population projections were previously reviewed in detail so it is requested that committee members focus their efforts on the employment data.
- The LRTP committee and TCC members were requested to provide information on any major developments or major future land use changes, such as DRIs that have been recently approved or withdrawn, that were not anticipated in the 2035 plan but should be taken into account in the 2040 projection. Volusia County provided detailed program information for the Farmton Development. Square footage was converted to jobs using the following conversion rates: SER: 300 SF / job; COM: 500 SF/job; IND 1000 SF/job. School Enrollment for colleges 450 SF / student.
- Because the population and employment projections for 2040 are lower than those projected in the 2035 forecast as well as the lack of growth in the 2005-2010 timeframe, no additional population and employment will need to be projected beyond those comments received from the committees. In order to meet the lower control total, the consultant will use the 2025 and 2030 forecast years from the 2035 LRTP to extrapolate an adjusted 2040 forecast that meets the control totals. Additional development included in the previous projection will be assumed to occur in 2045 or 2050, which extends beyond the study timeframe for the transportation model. Woods and Poole projections will be used to develop a new employment forecast control total.
- The total for school enrollment matched within 1,000 students to the 2035 forecast's projection for the year 2025 (122,618 students) because the prior 2025 population forecast total most closely matched the new 2040 overall population projection. School enrollment includes both K-12 grade schools as well as colleges and universities. Florida is anticipated to have approximately 15% of persons in grade school in 2040. This would result in approximately 88,000 grade school students based on the 2040 projected population. Total enrollment was projected as 121,543 students. Negative growth was permitted in TAZs for school enrollment consistent with the 2035 methodology and trends from 2005-2010 in some TAZs.
- As part of the update to the new model structure, the boundaries for some TAZ were changed. Therefore, the future projections from the 2035 LRTP were split into new TAZ boundaries for 50 TAZs. Thirteen of

these were related to the Farmton development. New growth capacity was split into new TAZs based on vacant land remaining and new growth between 2005-2010.

1.4 Results

The product will be a table showing population (ZDATA1) and employment (ZDATA2) data for each Traffic Analysis Zone (TAZ) in five year increments for year's 2015, 2020, 2025, 2030, 2035 and 2040.

B. PRESENTATION OF THE DRAFT FY 2014/15 – 2018/19 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Background Information:

The purpose of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is to identify funding for all federal and state funded transportation projects that are scheduled in the River to Sea TPO planning area for fiscal years 2014/15 to 2018/19. The projects listed in the TIP include improvements to area highway, transit and bicycle/pedestrian systems. Regionally significant projects, as well as some of the area's locally funded projects, are included in the TIP for informational purposes. The TIP also identifies transportation-disadvantaged projects, bicycle facilities, sidewalks and other enhancement projects scheduled during this time period.

Mr. Robert Keeth, TPO Senior Planner, will lead a committee discussion regarding the draft FY 2014/15 to FY 2018/19 TIP. Issues identified during this discussion will be addressed in a subsequent draft which will be presented to the CAC/TCC for final review and approval in June.

C. PRESENTATION OF I-4 MANAGED USE LANES PRELIMINARY DESIGN AND ENVIRONMENT (PD&E) STUDY

Background Information:

The I-4 Multi-Modal Master Plan was completed in 1996. Among other recommendations, the plan included maintaining a 64-foot rail envelope within the I-4 corridor from US 17/92 in Seminole County to I-95 in Volusia County. Subsequently, an opportunity was presented to advance the widening of I-4 from four to six lanes from the St. Johns River Bridge to SR 472 by widening to the middle and encroaching on the rail envelop. The MPO did not take a position to remove the rail envelop permanently, but rather as a temporary measure to facilitate the addition of travel lanes to I-4 within the existing right-of-way.

Subsequent presentations and actions have included approving an amendment to the 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) to add the I-4 Managed Use Lanes project, approving an amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add funds to update/complete the PD&E study, and receiving a presentation from the FDOT Project Manager providing an update on the I-4 PD&E effort. The rail envelope continued to be a part of these discussions and has been recognized as a desired component of the I-4 corridor.

On April 17, 2014 Volusia County Council approved a motion to preserve the rail envelope as part of the I-4 managed use lanes project and transmitted a letter to FDOT as included in this agenda. However, a design concept that did not include a rail envelope on I-4 as part of the managed use lanes improvements had been prepared prior to this action and was presented by FDOT at a public meeting held on April 24th.

Mr. Frank O'Dea, Director of Transportation Development for FDOT District V, will present an update of the project design concepts and review the potential issues and options regarding the preservation of a rail envelope within the I-4 corridor from US 17/92 in Seminole County to I-95 in Volusia County.

JAMES T. DINNEEN COUNTY MANAGER

On April 17, 2014, the County Council approved funding for the transit connector alternatives study. The parameters of that study and the rail corridor along I-4 were discussed at length. DOT staff and consultants were available to help inform that discussion.

The outcome was Council direction that the alternatives analysis include DeBary and the I-4 corridor into Seminole County as options for rail service connection.

Also, Volusia County requests that the rail corridor (envelope) be preserved and remain part of the I-4 corridor from Seminole County to Daytona Beach. Whether for commuter or inter-city service, I-4 remains the best route through the county. Loss of that option south of SR472 would impair future service opportunities, perhaps irrevocably.

Thank you for the support of your agency. We look forward to working together on these important initiatives.

Dear Chairman Davis:

I have received your April 23, 2014 letter on the Volusia Transit Connector Study. The Department will include analysis of providing transit service to both DeBary and into Seminole County as part of the study, as you requested.

For the Interstate 4 widening, the Department will prepare a summary of the impacts of preserving the rail envelope along Interstate 4 to the Volusia - Seminole County line. We will present the rail envelope option at the May, 2014 River to Sea TPO committee and board meetings to verify support for the envelope through that body. Assuming the TPO direction is consistent with the Volusia County request that the rail envelope be preserved, the Department will include that envelope in our recommended alternative.

The Florida Department of Transportation is in the midst of numerous significant transportation projects in Volusia County. We recognize that due to recent reapportionment, not all Volusia County Council members are on the TPO board. With the impact these projects can have on the economic vitality of the county, the Department wants to insure we maintain proper communication of our major projects and studies that impact the county. We would be willing to provide updates at your council meetings on a periodic basis if you determine that would be a valuable service to your council. Please let me know if you would like to receive such updates on a bi-monthly or quarterly basis from senior Department staff.



E. PRESENTATION OF THE 2014 VOLUSIA TPO JOINT CERTIFICATION REPORT

Background Information:

Each year, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Five office conducts a Certification Review of the TPO. The annual review examines various activities of the organization to ensure compliance with federal and state mandates. The review was conducted in March 2014 and a copy of the report is included in this agenda.

The FDOT TPO Liaison for the River to Sea TPO will provide an overview of findings.

2014 MODIFIED JOINT CERTIFICATION REVIEW

Florida Department of Transportation, District Five and

Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (Please note the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization changed its name to the River to Sea TPO on April 23, 2014)

Attendees: Lois Bollenback (Volusia TPO), Robert Keeth (Volusia TPO), Stephen Harris (Volusia TPO), Jean Parlow (Volusia TPO), Claudia Calzaretta (FDOT), Diane Poitras (FDOT), and Mary Schoelzel (FDOT)

The Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (VTPO) has the responsibility for ensuring that the major transportation issues in their planning areas are addressed and that the requirements in state and federal law governing the metropolitan transportation planning process are met. Certification reviews are the tool used to determine whether the MPOs/TPOs are fulfilling this responsibility. They are conducted on an annual basis by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and on a new implemented four (4) year cycle by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for MPOs/TPOs in TMA areas. The only exception is "conditional certification" issued for a MPO/TPO by FHWA. The next federal certification review for the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization will be conducted in year 2015.

The 2014 State Modified Joint Certification Review process for the Volusia TPO commenced with a meeting between FDOT District Five Staff and the Volusia TPO Staff on March 12, 2014. The discussions were organized around a set of questions developed by FDOT Staff to review all of the transportation planning processes and requirements mandated by law. The Volusia TPO staff provided responses to the questions that led to additional dialogue. The findings, summary of noteworthy achievements, and recommendations presented in this Modified Joint Certification Review are drawn from the responses to the questions. They also reflect the emerging importance of regionalism, the increasing emphasis being placed on development of interconnected multi-modal transportation systems, and the need to improve linkages between transportation planning and land use planning. FDOT Staff will present the results of the 2014 Modified Joint Certification Review to the Volusia TPO Board, the Technical Coordinating Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee in May.

FINDINGS

General

The Volusia TPO continues to have a positive cooperative working relationship with the Florida Department of Transportation, Local Governmental Agencies, Regional Planning Agencies, and other Transportation Agencies to support the initiatives needed for the Transportation demands within Volusia County. The TPO Staff has worked diligently in the past year to plan and prioritize projects of significant importance within

their TPO boundary. They continue to move forward with working, planning and developing regional projects. These projects include roadway, safety projects, freight, pedestrian sidewalk/trails and bicycle transportation facilities.

The TPO staff is to be commended for their work on the implementation and submission of their 2014-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TPO is currently working on their new 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan and Reapportionment activities which will incorporate the new 2010 Census data.

The TPO continues to have a positive relationship with other Local Governmental Agencies, Regional Planning Agencies and other transportation and land use agencies. The Department appreciates the support that the TPO and Local Agencies provide to move projects forward to enhance and complete the transportation needs in Volusia County.

The Volusia TPO continues to have conversations with FDOT and strategize on incorporating the new MAP-21 (Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act) performance measures into their planning documents.

Summary of Noteworthy Achievements

The Volusia TPO should be recognized for their efforts in coordinating and working cooperatively over the past year with the Local Governmental Agencies in regards to Reapportionment activities as well as working with the Florida Department of Transportation staff on the 2010 Census Urban Boundary Smoothing. The TPO developed and approved the Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary Adjustment and Membership Reapportionment Plan for submittal to the Governor. This activity also required updating the bylaws, revising the legal agreements required for a TPO, and developing amendments for the LRTP and TIP (which remain in draft form pending completion of this effort). The Volusia TPO has also worked with the Florida Department of Transportation staff on the 2010 Census Urban Boundary Smoothing. This is an ongoing process requiring a series of back and forth exchanges and updates between the TPO and FDOT. As the Urban Boundary Smoothing process is taking place, TPO Staff is beginning to assess the need for any Functional Classification updates as well.

A second noteworthy achievement lead by the Volusia TPO was the consolidation of the FDOT Project Application into the existing TPO application to reduce redundancy and their continued work with FDOT to improve the project development process by revising the Feasibility Study requirements and encouraging an on-line submission process for the district that will improve efficiencies and standardization. In addition, staff worked with the Central Florida MPO Alliance to develop a Regional List of Priority Projects for the Coast to Coast Trail/Close the Gap initiative, and the Strategic Intermodal System, Transit, and Regional Trail Projects.

The Volusia TPO also completed activities required to support the development of a regional traffic model for the 2040 long-range transportation planning (LRTP). These efforts included attendance at the District V Regional LRTP Subcommittee meetings, completing the development and review of base year socio-economic data for the transportation model as well as completing a review of base year model network.

The Volusia TPO also held its annual Planning Organization Retreat & Orientation on February 28th, 2014 at Celebration Place in Ormond Beach. This annual function serves as a forum to review the purpose of the UPWP and LRTP, to reflect on the goals and the vision of TPO activities and decision making. In addition this event assists in acclimating new board members to the roles and functions of the TPO.

The Volusia TPO has continued a robust safety outreach program including the expansion of the pedestrian law enforcement training, support of the FDOT's Alert Today Alive Tomorrow Pedestrian/Bicycle Safety Campaign, support for the Volusia County Schools Safety Initiative and mobile Safety Village. The activities the TPO have taken on above demonstrate once again its continued dedication to the education of bicycle and pedestrian safety.

The TPO also has completed a reorganization of TPO staffing and review of the TPO budget to improve organizational efficiency.

TPO staff is to be commended for facilitating, engaging, encouraging, consulting, and including all new and current members into the Palm Coast – Daytona Beach – Port Orange Urbanized Area in numerous meetings and discussions. When the City of Palm Coast provided a schedule conflict of their city council meetings, the TPO Board Members of the Volusia TPO voted to change the board meeting date and time to include all the new Flagler County members.

Lastly, the Volusia TPO staff had conducted two (2) Corridor Improvement Program (CIP) studies for US 1 (Phase II) and US 17/92 (Phase I). The TPO continues to identify and prioritize the various corridors within the planning boundaries to allow for additional data studies, which in result should recognize specific projects for local member governments to apply for during the TPO's scheduled call for projects. The TPO also conducted a workshop to explore enhanced transit options in the planning area and to gain consensus for pursuing a transit study (resulted in unanimous board approval).

Accountability

The content of the reports submitted by the Volusia TPO with invoices have been adequate in detail and capacity. These reports are intended to document progress made and difficulties encountered in implementing the TPO's mission and vision through the UPWP. They also are used to help assess the eligibility and justification of the TPO's expenses to be reimbursed with federal funds.

The submitted Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary Adjustment and Membership Reapportionment Plan was recently approved by the Governor of Florida, and the TPO has been working with the Department on finalizing the Transportation Planning Funds Joint Participation Agreement, the Interlocal Agreement for Creation of the Metropolitan Planning Organization, Intergovernmental Coordination and Review and Public Transportation Coordination Joint Participation Agreement, and the Public Transportation Joint Participation Agreement. These various agreements must be in place as a condition of receiving Federal Funding.

Planning Fund Carryover Balances

Planning funds are intended to be used for innovative productive planning activities within a reasonable timeframe and are subject to redistribution or loss if certain requirements are not met.

Public Involvement

The Volusia TPO continues to improve their public outreach and information efforts by upgrading their current website to make it more user-friendly. The Volusia TPO utilizes the organization to increase public awareness of the activities and purpose of the TPO. The website includes information about the TPO process, the board and committees, upcoming meeting agendas, planning studies, documents and other topics pertaining to the transportation environment. This website address http://www.volusiatpo.org. This website provides the public with the Federal and State required documents needed for public participation. The Volusia TPO is currently in the process of updating their Public Participation Plan, looking to be approved and adopted in June 2014. This document outlines the process and the tools that the Volusia TPO utilizes in order to achieve the objectives of incorporating regional and community priorities to solicit opinions from citizens, encourage participation and utilizes the information to better help the public to understand their role and responsibilities and to have a positive effect in transportation decision making. The TPO uses social networking, such as Facebook, as a tool to keep citizens informed by posting current meeting information, links and other items of interest.

Public Transportation

The Volusia TPO continues to enhance the solid working relationship with their Public Transportation partners on a daily basis. The TPO's Transit Planner has been located at the VOTRAN Office to act as a liaison between the Volusia TPO and VOTRAN since 1998. The TPO continues to assist their Public Transportation partners in obtaining the necessary planning coordination with agencies and/or groups who may be affected, assists in checking for consistency with the Florida Transportation Plan, Local Government Comprehensive Plans and other statewide modal plans. The TPO also

ensures (via its Public Involvement Process) that opportunities for Public Involvement are made available.

Efficient Transportation Decision Making (ETDM)

The Volusia TPO has worked with the Department to support the efforts in the development of the ETDM Process. As priorities change the TPO and Department will continue to work collaboratively on sending projects through for ETDM review.

RECOMMENDATIONS/ACTIONS

- 1. The Volusia TPO should continue to work diligently with their new partners as part of the Reapportionment activities.
- 2. The Volusia TPO should be commended on a job well done in continuing to keep the Technical Advisory Committee, the Citizen's Advisory Committee, Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee and the TPO Board Members informed of the status of their transportation initiatives as well as the initiatives of the Department.
- 3. The Volusia TPO should continue its regional coordination by continuing to participate in the Central Florida MPO Alliance, SunRail TAC, MPO/FDOT Quarterly meetings, Regional LRTP Subcommittee meetings, MPO Advisory Council Meetings, attending other MPO/TPO's Board meetings in adjacent areas as well any other regional meetings to continue to benefit from the regional coordination efforts.
- 4. The Volusia TPO staff needs to ensure that their FY 2014/2015 and FY 2015/2016 UPWP production plan and schedule is fully achieved and begin preparing for implementation of the successive two year UPWP.
