G. Review and Approval of Expenditure for Volusia County's Major Update of the Transit Development Plan (TDP) and Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP) (\$100,000)

TPO staff is requesting authorization for the expenditure of \$100,000 for major updates to VoTran's Transit Development Plan (TDP) and Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP). The plans will evaluate existing fixed-route, on-demand, and paratransit services; assess operating conditions and market demand; carry out a robust public involvement process; identify and prioritize transit corridors; prepare a 10-year schedule of projects; estimate future demand using FDOT-approved methods; and produce final TDP and TDSP documents for adoption and implementation. This expenditure will occur in the next fiscal year and funding for this expense is included in the approved FY 2027 TPO Budget and in *Task 5.0 – Transit Related Activities* of the new UPWP.

H. Approval of Five-Year Contract Extension with Audit Firm James Moore & Co.

TPO staff is requesting authorization for an Amendment to the Audit Service Contract to provide for a five-year extension with the firm James Moore & Co. for audit services. James Moore has provided audit services for the TPO for FY 2021 – FY 2025. The current contract scope provides an extension clause stating, "beyond the initial five-year period, the engagement may be renewed at the option of both parties for up to five additional years." This expenditure will occur in the next fiscal year and funding for this expense is included in the approved FY 2027 TPO Budget and in *Task 1.0 – Administration and Program Support* of the new UPWP.

1. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Board meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by TPO Chairperson Councilman Sander. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with fourteen voting members and four non-voting members physically present; and one voting and one non-voting member virtually present.

Ms. Pruneau stated that Council Member White of Ponce Inlet was the voting member of the Small City Alliance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

MOTION: A motion was made by Council Member Miller to allow for remote participation. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Gillis and carried unanimously.

Chairperson Sander apologized for missing the prior meeting and thanked Mayor Cloudman for acting as Chair in his absence.

Chairperson Sander pointed out item J, the rescheduling of the November 25th Board meeting to November 18th.

MOTION: A motion was made by Council Member Robins to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Gillis and carried unanimously.

4. Action Items

A. Review and Approval of the FY 2026/27 Volusia-Flagler Slate of TPO Officers for FY 2026/27

Chairperson Sander reviewed the recommended slate of TPO officers from the May 6th Executive Committee meeting; Councilman Sander of South Daytona as Chairperson, Council Member Robins of Volusia County as 1st Vice Chair and Treasurer, and Vice Mayor Gillis of Edgewater as 2nd Vice Chair and Secretary. He stated that the term will last from July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027.

Ms. Nicoulin noted that the Executive Committee recommended retaining the current Chairperson, noting that a chairperson serving more than one consecutive term is not addressed in the Bylaws, therefore it is permitted. This was recommended as a way to provide continuity for the TPO Board.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Commissioner Dance to approve the FY 2026/27 Volusia-Flagler TPO slate of officers as follows: Councilman Eric Sander of South Daytona as Chairperson, Council Member Danny Robins of Volusia County as 1st Vice Chairperson/Treasurer, and Vice Mayor Charlotte Gillis of Edgewater as 2nd Vice Chairperson/Secretary. The motion was seconded by Council Member Miller and carried unanimously.*

2. Public Comment/Participation

Public comment/participation was addressed at this point in the meeting and there were no public comments.

B. Review and Approval of the FY 2026/27 Volusia-Flagler TPO Budget

Ms. Nicoulin went over the proposed budget, noting the reduction in the contingency amount from \$50,000 to \$25,000 based on the discussion and recommendation at the Executive Committee meeting. The dollar amount is being reallocated to legal services because there are a number of internal documents that need to be updated that legal services will be assisting with. She discussed the minor adjustments to revenues.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Vice Mayor Gillis to approve the FY 2026/27 Volusia-Flagler TPO Budget. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried unanimously.*

C. Review and Approval of the Executive Director's Performance Evaluation and Salary Adjustment

Chairperson Sander explained the recommended salary adjustment discussed in the May 6th Executive Committee meeting, consisting of the cost of living adjustment equal to what TPO staff will receive.

MOTION: *A motion was made by Vice Mayor Gillis to approve the Executive Director's Performance Evaluation and Salary Adjustment. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dance and carried unanimously.*

5. Presentations, Status Reports, and Discussion Items

A. Presentation and Discussion of the Draft 2026 List of Prioritized Projects (LOPP)

[Handout provided]

Ms. Nicoulin explained the process of adoption for the LOPP. She provided the list of changes to the LOPP from last year's list.

Council Member Miller asked about the process of funding for SunTrail Projects and when to let the TPO know about funding requests. Ms. Nicoulin replied that the update to the LOPP occurs only once per year, but SunTrail does not have a Call for Projects every year, therefore the LOPP can be amended as needed.

County Vice Chair Reinhart asked about the Clyde Morris Boulevard project in Tier A of the Traffic Operations List. Ms. Nicoulin stated that it is a series of intersections in Port Orange bundled into one project.

County Vice Chair Reinhart asked when the Reed Canal Bridge project is funded for construction. Ms. Nicoulin stated 2030 is the expected year.

B. Presentation and Discussion of the Draft FY 2026/27 to FY 2030/31 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Ms. Nicoulin provided an update on the development of the new TIP. She explained how the TIP, LOPP, and FDOT's Tentative Work Program are interrelated. She explained that the document encompasses all funded projects over the next five years in both counties. She specified that the projects listed are not solely the TPO's,

but all projects including aviation, landscape, maintenance, resurfacing, etc. The TPO is showing support for all projects. She discussed the roll forward amendment and the set-aside funding. The full document has been uploaded to the TPO website for public comment and will be submitted to FDOT once adopted.

Council Member White expressed excitement for the Ponce Inlet sidewalk project, stating the loan forgiveness grant has been approved and the design is fully planned.

Commissioner Dance expressed interest in working with Volusia County to realign and extend the multi-use trail and Old Kings Road south into Volusia.

C. Presentation and Discussion of the Federal Transit Administration Section 5310 Program Funding

Mr. Harris explained the purpose of Section 5310 Program funding. He stated that Resolution 2026-07 was approved last month that designated FDOT as the recipient for the Deltona urbanized area.

County Vice Chair Reinhart asked about the drop in funding from FY 2024 to FY 2025. Mr. Harris explained that the decrease is due to the submitted projects that scored lower in FY 2025.

Council Member Miller asked how urbanized areas are defined. Mr. Harris explained that they are defined by population via the Census, and each area must be continuous, with no gaps.

Commissioner Dance asked how Flagler County can use these funds, as their transit does not operate in the same way as Volusia County. Mr. Harris stated that there is an on-demand bus system in Flagler County that can utilize Section 5310 funds, and suggested using them for training programs, signage, and ride sharing programs.

D. FDOT Report

Ms. Powell presented the FDOT Report; she highlighted recently completed projects, an upcoming project, and offered a reminder that May is Youth Traffic Safety Month.

Mayor Cloudman asked for an update on the new roundabout on Kepler Road and SR 44 in DeLand. Mr. Engels, FDOT, stated that June 20th is the expected date to switch to the two-lane roundabout configuration. They discussed changing the signage for safety purposes.

6. Executive Director's Report

Ms. Nicoulin offered a highlight of Information Item J: the BUILD American 250 Act, and recognized Mr. Harris for celebrating 20 years with the TPO with an art glass award.

7. Volusia-Flagler TPO Board Member Comments

County Vice Chair Reinhart thanked Stephan for his service with the TPO, especially on the TDLCB.

Commissioner Snow thanked Ms. Nicoulin for meeting with her as a new member of the board to help her better understand the TPO. She mentioned that Holly Hill is searching for a new city manager and city clerk and to let her know of any potential candidates.

8. Volusia-Flagler TPO Chairperson Comments

Chairperson Sander stated that the Executive Committee meeting scheduled for June 3rd has been cancelled due to a lack of business items on the agenda. He expressed his honor for being elected to serve another year's term as Chairperson of the TPO Board.

It must be consistent with the Long Range Transportation Plan and is required for projects to be eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S.C. and Title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53. The TIP is developed in cooperation with FDOT, local governments, public transit operators, and the public.

The TIP lists capital and non-capital surface transportation projects supported by state and/or federal funds. Also required to be included are all regionally significant projects requiring action by FHWA or FTA, regardless of funding source, and projects that implement paratransit plans required for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Florida law also requires the TIP to include a list of locally and privately funded projects for informational purposes.

The draft FY 2026/27 to FY 2030/31 TIP was recommended for approval by the BPAC, CAC and TCC for review this month and was open for public review and comment until June 22, 2026.

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

The Volusia-Flagler TPO develops eight lists of priority projects (LOPP), each representing a different category of projects. Each year, the TPO updates these lists and upon adoption, transmits the lists to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) district office for use in allocating transportation funds to the area. Two of the priority project lists – the Strategic Intermodal System projects (SIS) and the Regionally Significant and Non-SIS Roadway projects list reflect projects listed in the TPO's current Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), Connect 2045 which was adopted in September of 2020.

Three of the lists – the Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations-focused) projects; Bicycle/Pedestrian and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian-focused) projects; and Transportation Planning Studies – are updated annually with the "Call for Projects". Project applications submitted to the TPO in these categories are reviewed and ranked by the respective subcommittees based on the criteria developed through the subcommittees and approved by the Volusia-Flagler TPO Board. The Shared Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Projects list contains projects that are populated by the State's SUN Trail Program priorities. The Transit Projects list contains regional transit projects. The TPO defers to VoTran or Flagler County Public Transportation to determine transit project priorities.

The Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Eligible Projects list contains projects that local governments have identified are ready to advance into the Work Program should funding become available, and have committed to the local match requirement, if required.

The draft 2026 Lists of Priority Projects (LOPP) reflect changes as a result of updates to the status of projects already on the lists (e.g., completed phase(s), updated cost estimates, etc.), as well as the incorporation of new projects received and ranked through the Annual Call for Projects. A summarized list of changes comparing the 2025 adopted list to the 2026 draft list is provided in the agenda package along with the revised draft 2026 LOPP.

The Draft LOPP was reviewed and recommended for approval by the BPAC, CAC and TCC this month and was available for public review and comment through June 22, 2026.

NEW SMYRNA BEACH LIBRARY OUTREACH

On May 9th, the TPO joined families and the TPO Chair/South Daytona Councilman Eric Sander to teach kids and adults about bicycle safety and then fit them for new bicycle helmets. The group enjoyed learning about ways to stay safe on their bicycles, the laws they must follow, and the proper way to fit helmets.



MOTORCYCLE SAFETY AWARENESS MONTH

On May 5th, TPO staff members, Melanie Pruneau and Pamela Blankenship assisted the Florida Motorcycle Safety Coalition in placing motorcycle awareness signs in areas where crashes involving motorcycles have occurred. Signs were placed by the TPO at locations in Port Orange and by other volunteers throughout the state of Florida.

FACT: In 2025, Florida recorded 581 motorcyclist fatalities, representing 20% of all traffic fatalities in the state. Unfortunately, Florida ranks #1 in the nation for motorcyclist fatalities.





Impact Teen Drivers Train the Trainers

Car crashes are the number one killer of young people in America, and most of these crashes are 100% preventable based on the choices made inside the car. Impact Teen Drivers' evidence-based programs outline the dangers of reckless and distracted driving and the importance of good decision making behind the wheel. The programs are designed to meaningfully change attitudes and behaviors on the road, for drivers and passengers. On May 13th, the TPO's Community Outreach Coordinator participated in Impact Teen Drivers' *Train the Trainers* held at the Daytona Beach International Airport. This training enables attendees to facilitate the programs, one of which is titled *What Do You Consider Lethal?* This program is both interactive and research-driven, and challenges teens to think critically about risk, responsibility, and the power of their choices behind the wheel and beyond. Flagler County Design & Construction Projects Report

May 2026

Road & Bridge Program

- Walnut Avenue Paving Project – Design and permitting phase is complete and has been accepted by FDOT. Project closeout underway.
- Jungle Hut Road from A1A to beach access – FDOT complete review of 100% design and issued formal acceptance of plan submittal. Plans finalization and permitting are complete as of March 2026.
- Forest Park Street from CR 90 to SR 100 – 90% design plans under review.
- CR 205 Resurfacing Project – Required design update was finalized in preparation of construction contractor procurement. Funding Agreement was approved by the BOCC on December 15, 2025. Project was advertised for Bid as 26-ITB-005 on OpenGov.com with bids received on May 20, 2026. Bid Award is anticipated on July 13, 2026. Construction is anticipated to begin in September 2026 with Final Completion anticipated in March 2027. Staff coordinating with FDOT regarding possible Supplemental Agreement to reconcile funding amounts and minor scope adjustment.
- CR 304 Resurfacing Project (CR 305 to SR-11) – Design Plans update and permit activities are anticipated to begin in the 3rd quarter 2026. Construction is anticipated to commence in the 2nd quarter 2027.
- First Avenue Phase 2 Drainage – Design and permitting phase is complete. Construction procurement to begin in 2nd quarter of 2026 with construction anticipated to commence in 4th quarter of 2026.

Sidewalk & Trail Program

- Bulow Creek Headwaters Regional Park – Planning phase is underway A second public meeting was held on February 3, 2026. Presentation of the final master plan to BOCC and public use approval was received on May 18, 2026. Submittal of the Final Plan and Report is anticipated by end of June 2026 which will conclude the planning phase. Project will begin to transition into design and permitting phase in Summer 2026.
- Trailhead for GST & Lehigh Trail – Coordination with the Department’s CSC is underway and is being coordinated with planned Eco-Discovery Center. Design phase is anticipated to begin in the third quarter 2026.



- Old Kings Road South Trail (SR100 to County Line) – Design began in July 2025. Design is progressing towards 90% submittal. Public Open House was held on April 24, 2026, 4:00-6:00 pm in the Commission Chambers. Completion of design and permitting is anticipated by November 2026.

Vertical CIP Program

- Fire Rescue Station 51 – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on November 19, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on December 8, 2025, 11am-12pm. Contractor continues with construction.
- Fire Rescue Administration Station 50 – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on October 8, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 13, 2025, 10-11am. Contractor continues with construction.
- SMA Integrated Stabilization Unit – Construction Notice to Proceed was issued on October 22, 2025. Groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 18, 2025, 1-2pm. Contractor continues with construction.
- Eco-Discovery Center – Design kick-off meeting held on January 26, 2026. Design-Builder issued Conceptual Design and is currently working on 30% Design submittal.
- Multipurpose Emergency Preparedness Project – Task Work Order Four was issued to Design Build Team. This is the final Task Work Order needed to complete construction of all remaining work by June 30, 2026. Contractor continues with construction.

Stormwater Master Plan Program

- MalaCompra Canal Restoration and Resiliency – Design and Permitting phases are underway. Conceptual design phase was completed. Project completion is anticipated in July 2027.

Beach Management Plan Program

- Beach Reach 2 (North 7th St to Varn Park) – The project is fully permitted. Invitation to bid was released on March 5, 2026 and four bids were received May 7. The lowest bid was Weeks Marine at \$39,105,290. Conditions included in the bid documents allows the County to reduce the quantity of sand while keeping the unit price. A 17% reduction from



the advertised 1.8 million cubic yards (MCY) of sand to 1.494 MCY would allow a not-to-exceed contract in the amount of \$34 million. The project an received bids were presented to the Board of County Commissioners on June 1 and the Board has until August 5th to decide to execute a contract before the bids expire. If approved, construction would likely begin in November. The contract will specify that the dredge project must be complete within 365 days from Notice to Proceed, but the actual construction should last 4 – 6 months.

- Beach Reach 3 (Varn Park to Washington Oaks) – The Professional Services Agreement with Moffatt & Nichol was approved by the BOCC on April 21, 2025. Field work for permitting studies continues and project design activities are actively underway. Hardbottom mapping has been delayed pending favorable water clarity anticipated between June 15 and July 15, 2026. The completion of the hardbottom survey will be useful for planning and permitting, but existing data indicates the extent of protected habitat will prevent pumping sand onto the beach from offshore and limit design options.
- Hammock Dunes Emergency Dune Restoration Project (Varn Park to Jungle Hut Park) – Completed as of November 2025.
- Ocean Hammock/Hammock Beach and Golf Resort Emergency Dune Restoration Project (Jungle Hut Park to MalaCompra Park) – Completed in December 2025.
- FEMA Category G Dune Restoration Project (MalaCompra Park to Washington Oaks, and Washinton Oaks to Marineland)– Completed April 2026.
