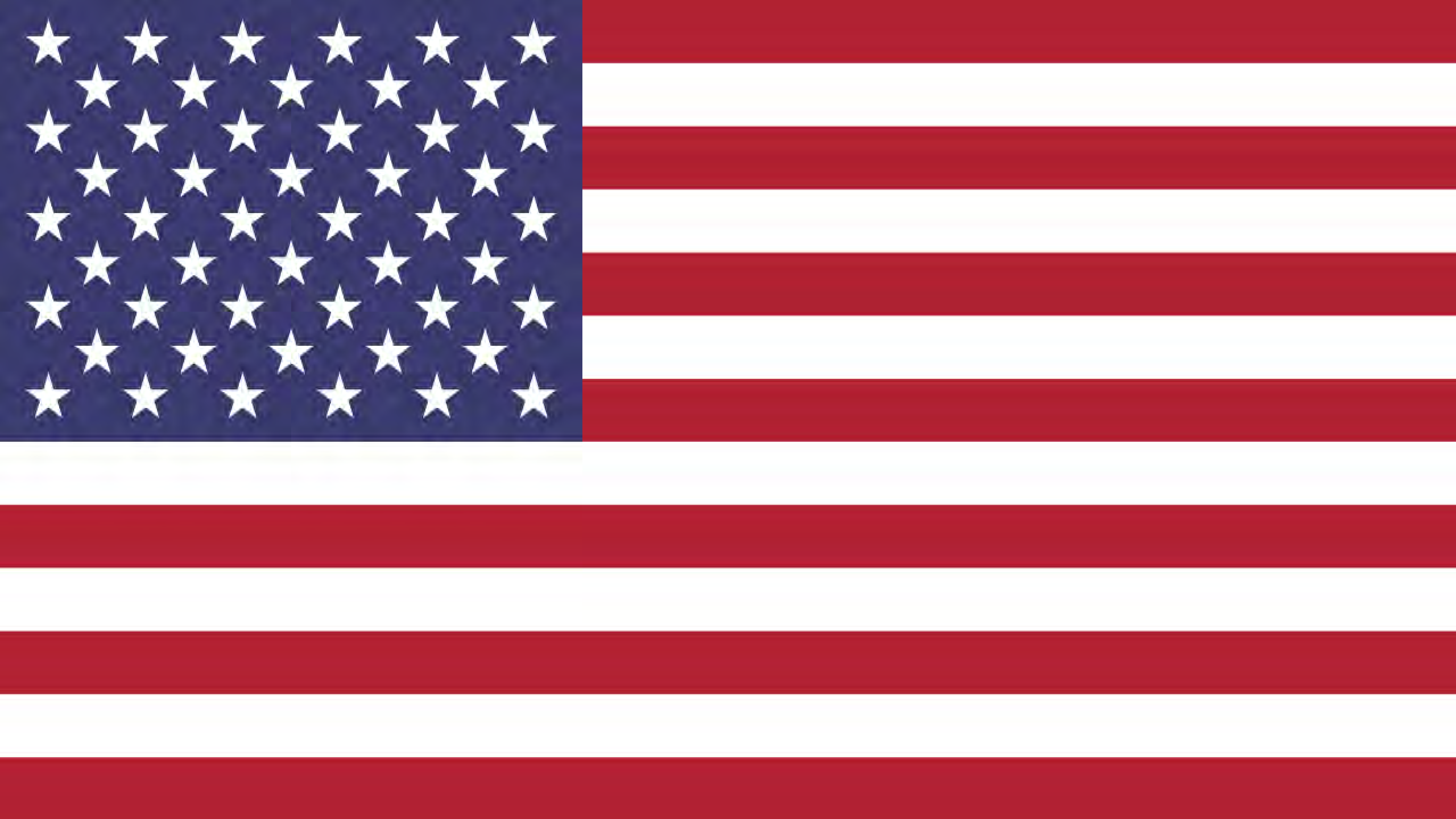

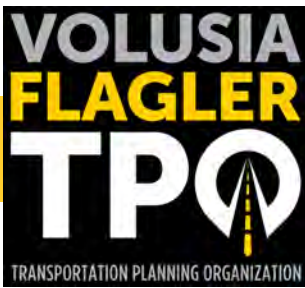

**RE: Letter of Support for the Nationally Significant Multimodal Freight & Highway Projects (INFRA) Grant - Interstate 4 (I-4) North Capacity Improvements**

Dear Secretary Duffy,

On behalf of the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), I am pleased to offer our strong support for the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) application for federal INFRA grant funding for the **I-4 North Capacity Improvements** in Seminole and Volusia Counties, Florida.

Interstate 4 (I-4) is one of Florida's most vital transportation corridors, serving as a primary east-west artery for regional commuters, interstate freight movement, and access to major economic centers throughout Central Florida. The project segment north of S.R. 434 represents a critical extension of the I-4 Ultimate improvements and is essential to preserving system continuity, enhancing travel time reliability, and supporting long-term regional growth.

The proposed project will deliver substantial operational and safety benefits by adding capacity, improving traffic flow, and alleviating congestion along this heavily traveled corridor. These improvements are especially important as Central Florida continues to experience significant population and employment growth, placing increasing demand on an already constrained facility. By enhancing travel reliability and reducing delay, the project will provide tangible benefits to both daily commuters and commercial users.

Equally important, the project will strengthen freight efficiency by improving travel time reliability for the movement of goods across Central Florida. As a key component of both the regional and statewide freight network, I-4 supports major distribution activity and provides critical connectivity to ports, logistics hubs, and world-renowned tourism destinations that drive Florida's economy. The project will also enhance access to truck parking facilities, further reinforcing the corridor's role as a backbone of freight mobility.

The I-4 North Capacity Improvements Project is nationally significant in both scope and impact. It will generate long-term economic benefits, improve system performance, and enhance quality of life for residents, businesses, and visitors across the region and beyond. With broad-based

community and stakeholder support, the I-4 North Project is FDOT’s highest statewide priority, reflecting its essential role in reducing congestion, enhancing economic competitiveness, and improving regional connectivity.

For these reasons, the Volusia-Flagler TPO respectfully urges your favorable consideration of FDOT’s INFRA grant application.

Thank you for your continued leadership and commitment to advancing critical infrastructure investments that strengthen our nation’s transportation system.

**WHEREAS**, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and Flagler County; and

**WHEREAS**, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

**WHEREAS**, the Volusia-Flagler TPO shall annually endorse and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required by 23 C.F.R. 450.300 through 450.324, among which is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

**WHEREAS**, the construction-phase highway projects funded in the Transportation Improvement Program have been identified as needed projects in the Volusia-Flagler 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan and all other projects contained within the Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the Volusia-Flagler 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Volusia-Flagler TPO that the:

1. FY 2026/27 to FY 2030/31 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is hereby endorsed and adopted as an accurate representation of the area's priorities developed through a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive planning process in accordance with applicable state and federal requirements; and
2. Chairperson of the Volusia-Flagler TPO (or their designee) is hereby authorized and directed to submit the FY 2026/27 to FY 2030/31 TIP to the:
  - a. Florida Department of Transportation;
  - b. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and the
  - c. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation).

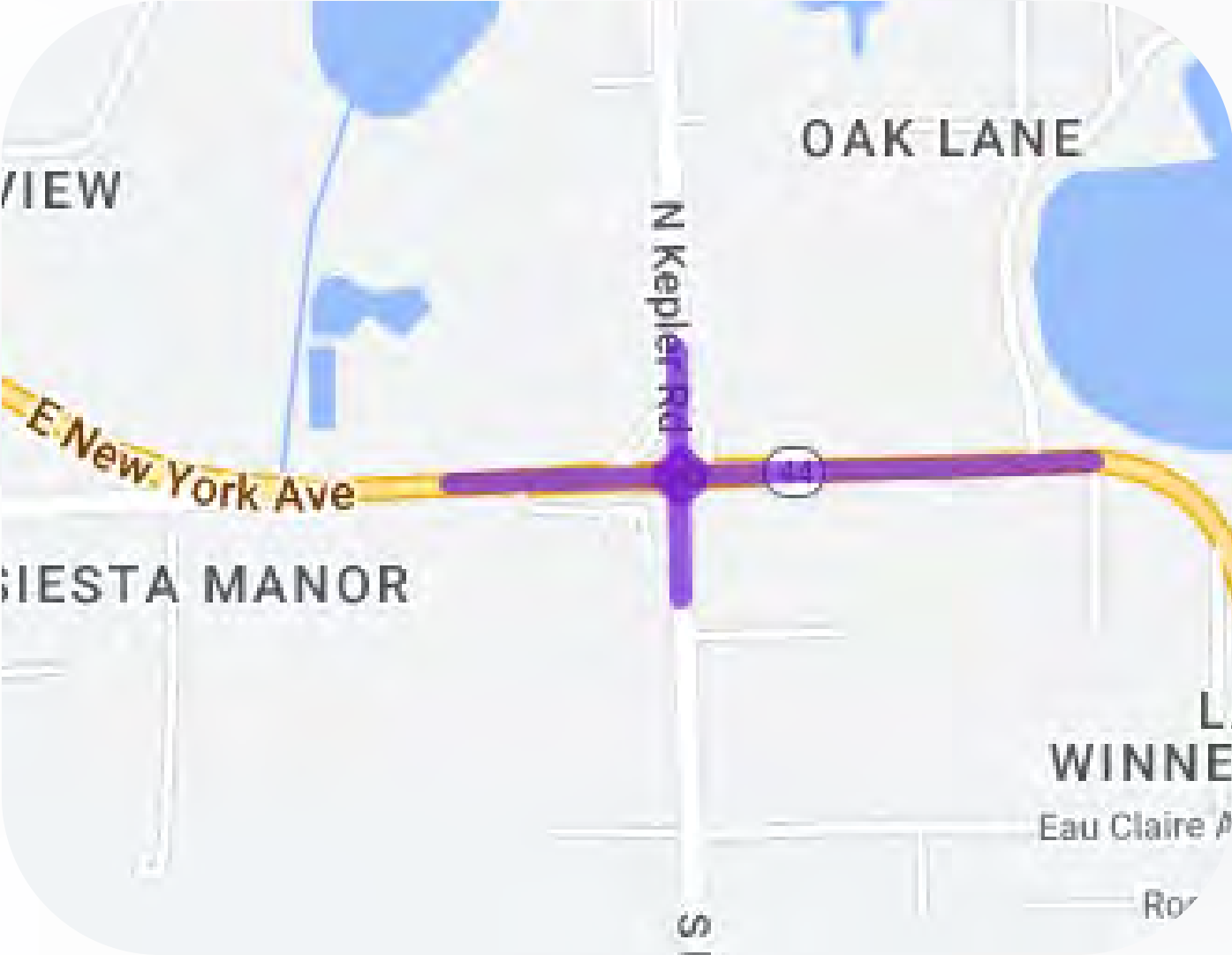

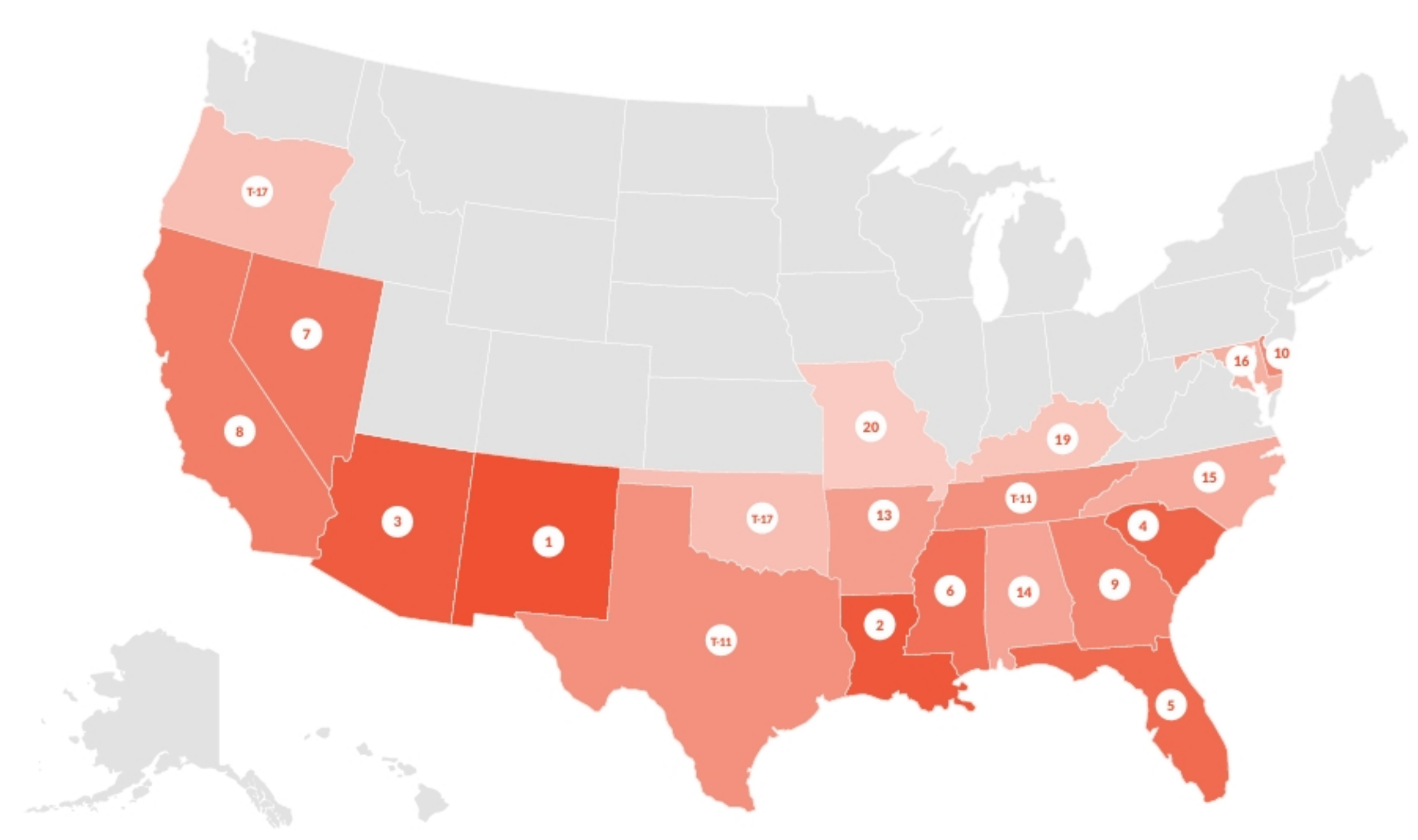

The group enjoyed learning about ways to stay safe on their bicycles, the laws they must follow, and the proper way to fit helmets.



## MOTORCYCLE SAFETY AWARENESS MONTH

On May 5<sup>th</sup>, TPO staff members, Melanie Pruneau and Pamela Blankenship assisted the Florida Motorcycle Safety Coalition in placing motorcycle awareness signs in areas where crashes involving motorcycles have occurred. Signs were placed by the TPO at locations in Port Orange and by other volunteers throughout the state of Florida.

**FACT:** In 2025, Florida recorded 581 motorcyclist fatalities, representing 20% of all traffic fatalities in the state. Unfortunately, Florida ranks #1 in the nation for motorcyclist fatalities.





### Impact Teen Drivers Train the Trainers

Car crashes are the number one killer of young people in America, and most of these crashes are 100% preventable based on the choices made inside the car. Impact Teen Drivers' evidence-based programs outline the dangers of reckless and distracted driving and the importance of good decision making behind the wheel. The programs are designed to meaningfully change attitudes and behaviors on the road, for drivers and passengers. On May 13<sup>th</sup>, the TPO's Community Outreach Coordinator participated in Impact Teen Drivers' *Train the Trainers* held at the Daytona Beach International Airport. This training enables attendees to facilitate the programs, one of which is titled *What Do You Consider Lethal?* This program is both interactive and research-driven, and challenges teens to think critically about risk, responsibility, and the power of their choices behind the wheel and beyond.
