WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and portions of Flagler County inclusive of the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia-Flagler TPO shall annually endorse and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required by 23 C.F.R. 450.300 through 450.324, among which is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, the construction-phase highway projects funded in the Transportation Improvement Program have been identified as needed projects in the Volusia-Flagler TPO's Connect 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan and all other projects contained within the Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the Volusia-Flagler TPO's Connect 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Volusia-Flagler TPO that the:

- 1. FY 2025/26 to FY 2029/30 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is hereby endorsed and adopted as an accurate representation of the area's priorities developed through a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive planning process in accordance with applicable state and federal requirements; and
- 2. Chairperson of the Volusia-Flagler TPO (or their designee) is hereby authorized and directed to submit the FY 2025/26 to FY 2029/30 TIP to the:
 - a. Florida Department of Transportation;
 - b. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and the

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CRASH TRENDS (2019 - 2023)









Smart Driving College Challenge


The Volusia Flagler Transportation Organization (VFTPO) launched a Smart Driving College Challenge in the months of February and March of 2025. This educational campaign was meant to reward safe drivers who attend one of the four Volusia County colleges with prizes between \$25 and \$250. The challenge was run through a mobile application where participants can track their individual journeys in the car and be scored for safety.



Operation Best Foot Forward is a pedestrian safety initiative with the goal that more drivers yield and stop for pedestrians in marked crosswalks. The goal of the initiative is accomplished through implementation of the "three E's" of community education, low-cost engineering, and high-visibility enforcement.


In Volusia County, high-traffic crosswalks in the City of DeBary and the City of Ormond Beach served as project sites for the operation. Volusia County Sheriffs were present issuing moving and non-moving violations and warnings for those who did not stop for crossing pedestrians. Flagier County plans on deploying the same initiative in 2025 at a variety of high-traffic intersections.

The Volusia County Sheriff's Office was awarded the Enforcement Award at the Central Florida Safety Summit in May of 2025 for their Best Foot Forward Operation efforts at the crossing of Ocean Shore Blvd. and Tom Renick Park. Their efforts increased driver's rate of stopping for pedestrians to 42%, up from the original 19%.



RESOLUTION OF THE VOLUSIA-FLAGLER TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION ADOPTING THE VISION ZERO COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY ACTION PLAN

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Volusia County and portions of Flagler County inclusive of the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the goal of a Vision Zero Comprehensive Safety Action Plan is to develop a holistic, well-defined strategy to prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries in the Volusia and Flagler County Region; and

This project developed from a 2020 intersection safety study and is intended to help reduce the number and severity of crashes at the intersection of U.S. 17-92 (Volusia Avenue) and Enterprise Road. Improvements include replacing the free-flow right turn lane from westbound Enterprise Road to northbound U.S. 17-92 with two dedicated right turn lanes onto U.S. 17-92 that are under signal control. A new right turn lane is proposed along northbound U.S. 17-92 into the shopping plaza.

The project also will reconstruct and upgrade the traffic and pedestrian signals at the intersection, enhance intersection lighting and make necessary drainage improvements. New sidewalk is to be constructed on the northeast side of the intersection, and pedestrian curb ramps will be upgraded to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is constructing a two-lane roundabout at the intersection of State Road (S.R.) 44 (E. New York Avenue) and Kepler Road in DeLand, Volusia County, to enhance safety and improve the flow of traffic.

Once completed, the roundabout will replace the existing signalized intersection. The roundabout will also have two travel lanes in each direction with right turn bypass lanes at three of the four road connections, a concrete apron to accommodate large trucks, and landscaping in the center island.

Pedestrian safety enhancements include new sidewalks and crosswalks equipped with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at the roundabout approaches. Each RRFB will include flashing yellow LED lights to increase drivers' awareness of pedestrians crossing at the roundabout. S.R. 44 will also be resurfaced from approximately 800 feet west of Kepler Road to Talisman Road. Kepler Road will be resurfaced from 650 feet south of S.R. 44 to 1,250 feet north of S.R. 44. Additionally, a center bi-directional turn lane will be added along S.R. 44 from east of Kepler Road to Lake Winnemissett Drive.



In addition to repaving this segment of S.R. 40, the travel lanes along this segment of Granada Boulevard will be slightly narrowed to ten feet and subtle changes in the roadway alignment will be introduced to encourage slower driving speeds. Pedestrian safety improvements include a new mid-block pedestrian crossing between Vining Court and Bovard Avenue. Upgrades will also be made to existing crossings at Washington Street and west of Beach Street.

The mid-block crossings located west of Beach Street and between Vining Court and Bovard Avenue will be slightly elevated to be level with the sidewalk and will include in-road lighting to further alert motorists of people crossing the roadway and encourage reduced speeds.

All three crossings will be equipped with a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) and overhead lighting to increase driver awareness and visibility of pedestrians. A PHB is an overhead traffic device that remains dark until a pedestrian activates the beacon, signaling for drivers to come to a stop and for pedestrians to cross. Audible pedestrian signals and detectible warning pads will also be installed at each crossing to provide accessibility for the visually impaired.

Intersection lighting will be upgraded, and new mast arm poles will be installed at the Ridgewood Avenue and S.R. A1A traffic signals. New bicycle lanes next to turn lanes, called keyholes, minor drainage improvements, median modifications, and a new directional median to reduce left-turn conflicts at Washington Street will also be included. Existing sidewalks and on-street parking will remain.

- Forest Park Street from CR 90 to SR 100 Design phase underway. Plans finalization and permitting anticipated to conclude in July 2026.
- Flagler Central Commerce Parkway Connector Project Construction substantial completion in July 2025 with construction concluding in August 2025.
- Old Haw Creek Road Construction underway. Anticipated completion in August 2025. Construction is anticipated to be complete ahead of schedule.
- CR 205 Resurfacing Project Required design update being finalized in preparation of construction contractor procurement. Construction anticipated to commence in second quarter 2025.

Construction timing will depend on the bids that are received within two project performance periods for 2025 and Spring 2026.
- Beach Reach 3 The Professional Services Agreement with Moffatt & Nichol was approved by the Board on April 21, 2025. Field work for permitting studies has begun and will continue through the Summer.
- Hammock Dunes Dune Restoration project An interim dune restoration project will be constructed between Varn Park and Jungle Hut Park which will begin June 3, 2025. The project is jointly funded between FDEP, Flagler County, and Hammock Dunes Owners Association. Authorization for the project is under the Hammock Dunes JCP permit and the perpetual easement agreement between Flagler County and Hammock Dunes. The project is expected to be completed by September 1, 2025.

Work Zone Safety With One. Network

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has made significant strides in enhancing road safety by initiating a multi-year collaboration with one.network in June 2022. This pioneering effort launched the statewide Lane Closure Notification System (LCNS), designed to improve safety for drivers and roadway workers. Supported by Governor Ron Desantis' Freedom First Budget, this initiative made Florida the first state in the U.S. to implement such technology.

LCNS aims to improve worker safety by alerting drivers to active work zones and lane closures, helping motorists navigate these areas safely and efficiently. Utilizing advanced GPS and mapping technologies, the system provides real-time notifications through popular GPS apps and services. The system integrates seamlessly with existing navigation apps, offering hands-free alerts to enhance driver experience and safety.

Key benefits of LCNS include reduced work zone crashes, improved worker safety, real-time tracking of lane closures, and better travel time reliability. This ongoing initiative stands as the first statewide deployment of worker-managed safety information sharing in the United States, showcasing an innovative approach to work zone safety.



Florida Department of Transportation Invests in Aerospace

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has made significant investments in the future of aerospace with Project Hinton and Project Kuiper.

Project Hinton began as an undisclosed Cape Canaveral infrastructure project but has now been unveiled as a SpaceX initiative. In partnership with the Space Florida Board of Directors, FDOT approved up to \$50 million in state funding through the Spaceport Improvement Program for a high-volume production facility, high bay, and related infrastructure. An additional \$15 million was for utility enhancements. In exchange for this investment, SpaceX has pledged \$1.8 billion in capital investment, along with the creation of high paying jobs.

The project is a large-scale capital improvement project at the Cape Canaveral Spaceport, focusing on infrastructure upgrades to support heavy-lift rocket launches, increasing the volume and mass of payloads sent to orbit. With close ties to SpaceX's Starship program, the improvements will shift the focus of the headquarters

to Starship launch and landing operations, further solidifying the company's intention to revolutionize space travel. Similarly, Amazon's Project Kuiper is advancing technology by developing a low Earth orbit satellite network, aiming to provide fast, reliable, and affordable internet connections to underserved communities around the world. In April 2023, Amazon and Space Florida announced the expansion of Project Kuiper to Florida, with investments of \$3.2 million from FDOT's Spaceport Improvement Program. On April 28, 2025, an Atlas 5 expendable launch system deployed the first operational Project Kuiper satellites for Amazon, signifying the first step in the journey to launch the rest of their low Earth orbit constellation.

Together, these projects highlight Florida's pivotal role in advancing aerospace technology and infrastructure. With support from FDOT and Space Florida, ambitious projects can be achieved, creating high-paying jobs, and positioning the state as a leader in the aerospace industry.

SunRail Celebrates Major Milestone with Approval of PD&E Study for Proposed Sunshine Corridor

In a significant step forward for regional transit, the Central Florida Commuter Rail Commission (CFCRC) on Thursday, April 24, unanimously approved advancing the proposed Sunshine Corridor to the next phase – a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study. This week's historic decision is a major milestone in SunRail's ongoing commitment to improving mobility and connectivity across Central Florida by expanding accessible and efficient transportation.

"The unanimous vote to advance the Sunshine Corridor PD&E Study reflects our shared vision to expand passenger rail to serve even more Central Florida residents and visitors in our area," said CFCRC Chair and Seminole County Commissioner Amy Lockhart. "We're proud to move forward with broad community and private-sector support to explore the full potential of this project."




The Sunshine Corridor is a proposed passenger rail transportation program that would accommodate both an expansion of SunRail commuter rail service and Brightline's intercity passenger rail program in Central Florida. The corridor is proposed to expand existing SunRail service to connect to major destinations including Orlando International Airport, the Orange County Convention Center, South International Drive, and Disney Springs.

The CFCRC-made up of representatives from SunRail's partners (Osceola County, Orange County, Seminole County, Volusia County, and the City of Orlando)—requested that the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) lead the Sunshine Corridor advancement efforts. FDOT will oversee the PD&E Study, which will explore the project's feasibility, cost estimates, environmental considerations, funding strategy, and compliance with federal grant requirements. The study is a key step toward entering the Federal Transit Administration's project development process for federal funding.

"We are excited to start the next phase in the effort to bring the Sunshine Corridor to reality," said FDOT District Five Secretary and SunRail Chief Executive Officer John E. Tyler, P.E. "This will be another transformational project for our region, and we look forward to working closely with the project's public and private partners on the PD&E Study."

odified phased design build (MPDB) is an innovative approach implemented by FDOT that improves contracting efficiency while expediting project timelines to address Florida's evolving infrastructure needs. MPDB has four key components contributing to its success:

- Cost-effective planning
- Innovation
- Collaboration
- Qualitative selection

This contracting method focuses on collaboration while maintaining best

practices from existing contracting methods. The new approach has been implemented into the Moving Interstate 4 (I-4) Forward program, advancing the project's completion date by over a decade as part of the Moving Florida Forward initiative
