I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum

The meeting of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (VTPO) Citizens' Advisory Committee (CAC) was called to order at 1:34 p.m. by Chairman Peter C. Hauser. The roll was called and it was determined that a quorum was present.

- II. <u>Consent Agenda</u>
 - A. Approval of May 17, 2011 CAC Meeting Minutes
 - B. <u>Review and Approval of Resolution 2011-13 Amending the FY 2010/11 2014/15</u> <u>Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)</u>
 - C. <u>Cancellation of July CAC Meeting</u>
 - MOTION: Mr. Kinsley moved to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by Mr. D'Antonio and carried unanimously.
- III. Action Items
 - A. Nomination and Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman
 - MOTION: Mr. Hauser moved to nominate Mr. D'Antonio to the position of CAC Chairman. The nomination was seconded by Mr. Ball and carried unanimously.
 - MOTION: Mr. Storke moved to nominate Mr. Kinsley to the position of CAC Vice Chairman. The nomination was seconded by Mr. Wandelt and carried unanimously.
 - B. <u>Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2011-14 Adopting the</u> <u>Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2011/12 to FY 2015/16</u>

Mr. Keeth gave a brief history of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), followed by an explanation by Mr. Welzenbach of its purpose.

MOTION: Mr. Storke moved to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-14 adopting the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2011/12 to FY 2015/16. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kinsley and carried unanimously. C. <u>Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2011-15 Reaffirming the Volusia</u> <u>TPOs Policy for the Establishment and Maintenance of its Project Priority Listings</u>

Mr. Welzenbach explained that each year the TPO provides a list of projects to FDOT, who then programs them into their next Work Program. Currently, the process laid out in Resolution 2011-15 consists of identifying a list of projects which are prioritized by the committees and remain on the priority list until built. He stated that there was wording in Resolution 2011-15 that should be changed to more accurately reflect what actually occurs. He suggested rewording item #2 to state that projects remain in the current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are <u>completed</u> and drop out of the work program. Currently, there a number of projects on the SIS list that are fully funded for construction, but not yet completed, and therefore, they remain on the list until completed.

MOTION: Mr. Wandelt moved to recommend approval of changing the wording of Resolution 2011-15, item 2, to state that projects remain in the current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are <u>completed</u> and dropped out of the work program (substitute "completed" for "fully funded through the construction phase"). The motion was seconded by Ms. Deyette and carried unanimously.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that there was one more change recommended to the resolution; the removal of the entire parenthetical note at the end of item #9 which states that the State of Florida will match transit projects. He explained that the note is redundant and inaccurate since the State of Florida matches 100% with toll revenue credits. He went on to explain toll revenue credits.

- MOTION: Mr. D'Antonio moved to recommend the deletion of the entire parenthetical note on Resolution 2011-15 at the end of item #9. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wandelt and carried unanimously.
- MOTION: Ms. Collard moved to recommend substituting the words "fully funded through the construction phase" in items 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 with the word "completed". The motion was seconded by Mr. Storke and carried unanimously.
- MOTION: Ms. Elliott moved to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-15 reaffirming the Volusia TPOs policy for the establishment and maintenance of its Project Priority Listings as amended. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kinsley and carried unanimously.

D. <u>Review and Approval of Resolution 2011-16 Adopting the FY 2011/12 Project Priority</u> <u>Listings</u>

Mr. Welzenbach stated that a change to Resolution 2011-16 had been recommended by the TIP Subcommittee; moving project #6, US 17 widening (2 lanes to 4 lanes) from Ponce de Leon Boulevard to SR 40, from the Non-SIS List to the SIS List. Mr. Welzenbach noted that SIS funding may be cut in the future and it the project is kept on the SIS List it is not likely to be funded; if it is placed on the Non-SIS List it could be funded in the next year or two.

Discussion continued.

MOTION: Ms. Elliott moved to recommend moving the US 17 widening (2 lanes to 4 lanes) from Ponce de Leon Boulevard to SR 40 and the US 17 PD&E from SR 40 to Putnam County line to the Non-SIS Priority List. The motion was seconded by Mr. Friend and carried unanimously.

Mr. Welzenbach explained the additional changes that were being recommended. The first change being the removal of the first two line items (unranked studies) from the ITS/Traffic Operations/Safety Tier "B" List (one study has already been completed and the LED signal replacement is compiled of many projects for study). The second change is to move project #1, the SR 400 (Beville Road) - SR 5A (Nova Road) Mast Arm Installation to Tier "C" because there has not been a cost estimate or study. Also being recommended is to move project #15, SR 44 - Kepler Road Turn Lane to Tier "C". He asked staff if there was a cost estimate for the project.

Mr. Keeth replied that the cost estimate had been provided by FDOT in the application.

Mr. Friedel elaborated stating that the original agreement between Volusia County and FDOT was the county would apply for the project; however, it had not been decided who would do the work. The project has had utility and right-of-way issues so it could not be placed into the current work program.

Mr. Welzenbach commented that the TPO Board has a policy that any cost overruns are the responsibility of the local government. If FDOT is comfortable with the cost estimate provided, the project can remain on the "B" List, otherwise, he recommends that it be moved to the "C" List.

Ms. Booker noted that Volusia County, FDOT and DeLand were working with a developer to come up with funding to move forward. The county has a proposal at one or more of the corners to put in a non-residential development; it is very

preliminary. The project is on the verge of being started and she requested that the project remain on the "B" List.

Mr. Welzenbach explained that if there were cost overruns, the local government would be responsible.

Ms. Booker stated that she would want to wait to see what the TCC recommends. She added that she could not speak on behalf of the county and noted that the cost estimate was continuously changing.

Mr. Friend asked where the cost estimate came from.

Mr. Keeth replied that he thought it came from a state DOT representative but would have to confirm that.

Ms. Booker stated that if the estimate had been included as part of the application it came from FDOT. She stated that she would like to leave the project on the "B" List. She added that if there are overruns she is hoping that the City of DeLand and the development community will pitch in to help.

Mr. Welzenbach added that two other projects, SR 44 @ Woodward Avenue left turn lane and SR 600 @ Williamson Boulevard right turn lane, had no cost estimates and should be moved from the "B" List to the "C" List.

MOTION: Mr. Storke moved to recommend that items # 1, 16 and 17 be moved to the "C" List. The motion was seconded by Mr. Blais.

Mr. D'Antonio stated that he would like to see what can be done about project #1, the mast arm installation at Beville Road and Nova Road. There is already construction going on at that location. He asked what it meant for the project if it was placed on the "C" List.

Mr. Welzenbach replied that either FDOT or Volusia County would have to come up with an analysis of the intersection. Originally, the project had been funded but it was later discovered that the funding was not enough and there was no additional money to put towards it. The project could move up if FDOT decides to pursue it.

The motion to move projects # 1, 16 and 17 to the "C" List carried unanimously.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that item #2, the Mary Avenue Streetscape, was on the "B" List but should be moved to the "A" List because it is funded.

- MOTION: Ms. Deyette moved to approve moving project #2, Mary Avenue Streetscape, from the "B" List to the "A" List. The motion was seconded by Ms. Elliott and carried unanimously.
- MOTION: Ms. Elliott moved to accept the Project Priority Listings as amended and to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-16 adopting the FY 2011/12 Project Priority Listings. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kinsley, which carried unanimously.
- E. <u>Review and Approval of Resolution 2011-17 Supporting the Federal Transportation</u> <u>Enhancement Program, the Recreational Trails Program and Safe Routes to Schools</u> <u>Program</u>

Mr. Welzenbach explained that this resolution came out of concern from the TPO Board over comments that the Chairman of the House Infrastructure Committee, Mr. John Mica, and the Florida Secretary of Transportation, Mr. Ananth Prasad, made to the effect that times being as tough as they are, the focus of transportation dollars should be on where they are most needed. Their opinions are that the Enhancement, Recreational Trails and Safe Routes to Schools programs are not where the money is most needed. The TPO Board directed Mr. Welzenbach to draft a resolution showing TPO support of these programs.

MOTION: Mr. Galphin moved to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-17 supporting the Federal Transportation Enhancement Program, the Recreational Trails Program and Safe Routes to Schools Program. The motion was seconded by Mr. Friend.

Brief discussion ensued.

The motion carried unanimously.

- IV. <u>Presentation, Status Reports, and Discussion Items</u>
 - A. <u>Review and Presentation on the SR 40 PD&E Study</u>

Ms. Mary McGehee, FDOT, stated that she was the project manager for the study and introduced the consultant, Mr. Jack Freeman, Kittlelson & Associates. Mr. Freeman gave a PowerPoint presentation on the SR 40 PD&E Study. The presentation gave an overview of the PD&E study process, the project and the project schedule. Public involvement would be beginning early and be ongoing. He announced that the first public meeting/workshop would be on July 21, 2011, 5:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. at Faith Lutheran Church in Ormond Beach. He added that a project website, www.SR40pde.com, would be up and running by the end of June. The project is expected to be completed in May 2012. Mr. Hauser stated that the Tomoka River Bridge would be difficult to widen due to the conservation area. He asked when it would be finished.

Mr. Freeman replied that the bridges had been rehabilitated 10-15 years ago and the current inspection reports show that they are suitable for widening. It will be necessary to coordinate with the state agencies to get the environmental permits, but currently there is no funding for design or construction.

Mr. Hauser inquired about new bicycle & pedestrian facilities.

Mr. Freeman responded that they would be looking at putting pedestrian facilities in as part of the bridge widening or possibly constructing them separately on the 12-foot trail; either way, the facilities are in the plans.

Mr. Ball stated that Mr. Freeman had mentioned that the PD&E study was not following the federal process; he asked if that would prohibit it from receiving federal funding.

Ms. McGehee explained that the project is following the federal process but it is not eligible for federal funding for future widening.

Mr. Freeman noted that funding would have to come from state or private money.

Mr. Blais asked if Wal-Mart would ever move.

Mr. Freeman replied that he did not know the answer to that but noted that what is needed for that particular intersection would be addressed as part of the study. He added that there have been plans to widen the north approach.

B. <u>FDOT Reports</u>

Mr. Friedel gave the FDOT report.

Discussion ensued on the difference between concrete vs. asphalt surfaces.

C. <u>Volusia County Construction Report</u>

Ms. Booker gave the Volusia County construction report.

V. <u>Staff Comments</u>

Mr. Welzenbach announced that there would be a workshop on SunRail on June 28, 2011, beginning at 6:45 a.m. in the TPO conference room. He added that there would

be a federal certification public hearing following the June TPO Board meeting. He gave an overview of federal certification process.

Mr. Blais asked when the Dunn Avenue overpass would be ready for the ribbon cutting.

Ms. Booker replied that the overpass was expected to be completed by the end of the month. She added that she had invited the TPO Chairperson to the ceremony.

VI. <u>CAC Member Comments</u>

Mr. Friend commented that he understood that many staff members want to be able to justify a tax increase. He stated that the Long Range Transportation Plan that was adopted by the TPO was fully funded and cost feasible. The county's five-year road program was also fully funded and cost feasible. He added that it was not appropriate for staff to imply that these projects would not be able to done without a tax increase.

Mr. Welzenbach recommended that Mr. Friend look at the LRTP; there is a ½-cent sales tax included in the plan and that is what makes it cost feasible.

Mr. Friend replied that if the bus transportation portion of the plan was removed the remainder would be entirely cost feasible without the inclusion of the tax.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the official federal document that is the TPOs 2035 LRTP includes a ½-cent sales tax as a revenue stream.

Mr. Friend stated that he had asked for clarification at the LRTP Subcommittee meeting that the \$600 million for the road program was completely cost feasible without any increase to the sales tax. What necessitated the increase in sales tax was the addition of the busses. He noted that the minutes from that meeting back him up.

Discussion ensued.

Mr. Friend asked if the ½-cent sales tax was needed to fund the \$684 million dollars in road projects that was approved in the LRTP.

Mr. Welzenbach replied that the LRTP was cost feasible with the ½-cent sales tax.

I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum

The meeting of the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (VTPO) Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) was called to order at 3:02 p.m. by Chairman William McCord. The roll was called and it was determined that a quorum was present.

II. <u>Consent Agenda</u>

A. <u>Approval of May 17, 2011 TCC Meeting Minutes</u>

Mr. Cheney pulled item B of the Consent Agenda for discussion.

Chairman McCord stated that Mr. Robert Smith had been present at the May TCC meeting and the minutes should be amended to reflect that.

[Note: Mr. Robert Smith was listed as present; however, referrals to Mr. Smith were clarified as to which Mr. Smith, Mr. J. Smith or Mr. R. Smith]

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to approve Consent Agenda items A and C. The motion was seconded by Mr. Findell and carried unanimously.

B. <u>Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2011-13 Amending the FY 2010/11 –</u> 2014/15 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Cheney stated that on page 19 the River to Sea Loop Trail limits were incorrect. He explained that the county had been talking to Brevard County and the correct limits were from US 1 to Park Avenue. There is no trail on Maytown Road and if the Sea Loop Trail is going to be a loop, ending it in midair does not make sense. The county's trail will either end at Park Avenue or, at minimum, the sidewalks on SR 442. Mr. Cheney requested that the project limits be changed to reflect that. He added that Brevard County and Volusia County, in their discussion had indicated that as a minimum the trail should go to SR 442 where there are sidewalks to connect to the East Central Florida Regional Rail Trail; the county is also working with the City of Edgewater to extend the East Central Florida Regional Rail Trail on Park Avenue to their government facilities and park. He noted that the project was in the study stage and the project limits should be right.

Mr. Paradise asked if the change was acceptable to all parties involved.

Mr. Cheney replied that it had been his experience that if a TPO is working and coordinating together and a local jurisdiction requests limit changes, they are generally amenable to doing so when it makes sense.

Chairman McCord stated that he had no objection to allowing the TPO staff to work out the limits on the project.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that he had no objections and added that originally the Sea Loop Trail was going to be on the FEC right-of-away which would then be split and go to Edgewater. The county does not want to pursue that right now because there is not enough money to build or maintain it. Brevard County independently came up with another route going up US 1 and hooking to the spur at Maytown Road (which currently does not exist and there is no money to build). However, there is an initiative by the City of Edgewater to have the SR 442 crossing, east of Pioneer Trail, as the kick-off point to connect to Park Avenue.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend the limits on the River to Sea Loop Trail be changed to Park Avenue in Edgewater, instead of Maytown Road. The motion was seconded by Mr. Ferrell and carried unanimously.

Mr. Ferrell, referring to the deletion of project # 4301801 – SR 400/SR 5A Mast Arm Installation, asked if removing it from the list would prevent it from being considered for future construction and design.

Mr. Welzenbach commented that staff was discussing moving that project to the C list, as unfunded. Eighty-thousand dollars had been programmed back in November 2010, but it was insufficient and FDOT cannot find any additional funds at this time; therefore, it has to be pulled out of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of Consent Agenda Item B, Resolution 2011-13 amending the FY 2010/11 – 2014/15 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Ms. Henrikson seconded the motion.

Mr. Ferrell stated that he understood why the project was being deleted but the SR 400/SR 5A Mast Arm Installation was under design by FDOT through another source of funding.

Mr. Welzenbach asked if there would be a cost estimate for the project since FDOT was designing it.

Mr. Friedel stated that there was no issue with the cost on that project; it was an issue of being able to do the work in the year it was programmed. The project is one that Volusia County had applied for on behalf of FDOT, but it was never decided from the department's perspective who would be doing the work. In November 2010, with the influx of projects, FDOT tried to partner with the local agencies to do as many LAP projects as possible; the SR 400/SR 5A Mast Arm Installation project was not one of them due to a lack of staff. He noted that he had never heard that the estimates were wrong; it was moved out due to a shortage of staff.

Mr. Ferrell stated that Metric Engineering had just received the work order to design the intersection.

Mr. Cheney asked if it was a pushbutton project.

Mr. Ferrell replied that it was being designed though one of the traffic operations continuing service contracts; URS is doing the survey. He added that he did not know if it was being done as a pushbutton design.

Mr. Welzenbach asked if the state was designing it in-house.

Mr. Ferrell stated that he wanted to make sure the project did not disappear. If the design (as a full-blown miscellaneous design, not pushbutton) gets done but there is no money to build, he wants to be sure that it will it still be eligible for construction.

Chairman McCord commented that it would depend on whether it was on the "B" List or the "C" List.

Mr. Welzenbach noted that this would be discussed when the committee got the Priority List agenda item.

The motion to recommend approval of Consent Agenda Item B, Resolution 2011-13 amending the FY 2010/11 – 2014/15 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) carried unanimously.

C. <u>Cancellation of July TCC Meeting</u>

This item was previously approved.

- III. Action Items
 - A. <u>Nomination and Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman</u>

Mr. Welzenbach explained that traditionally, the Vice Chairman moves up to the position of Chairman and the person that did not show up at the meeting is elected to be Vice Chairman.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney nominated Mr. Paradise as the Chairman and Mr. Lear as Vice Chairman of the TCC.

There were no further nominations and the nominations were closed.

Mr. J. Smith seconded the nominations which carried unanimously.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the new positions take effect July 1, 2011.

B. <u>Review and Approval of Resolution 2011-14 Adopting the Transportation Improvement</u> <u>Program (TIP) for FY 2011/12 to FY 2015/16</u>

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-14 adopting the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2011/12 to FY 2015/16. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kerr and carried unanimously.

C. <u>Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2011-15 Reaffirming the Volusia TPOs</u> Policy for the Establishment and Maintenance of its Project Priority Listings

Mr. Welzenbach stated that TPO staff was recommending two modifications to the resolution. The first change is rewording items 2-7 to state that projects remain in the current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are <u>completed</u> and drop out of the work program. The second recommendation is to delete the entire parenthetical note on Resolution 2011-15, at the end of item 9, because it no longer applies because FDOT matches with toll revenue credits.

Mr. Paradise asked what the goal of resolution was.

Mr. Welzenbach explained that it reaffirms the TPOs policy for the Priority Lists.

Mr. Cheney asked if the other change was to item #5, replacing the number three with the number eight.

Mr. Welzenbach replied that the change to item #5 took place last year and should not have been highlighted. Only two changes were being recommended.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-15 reaffirming the Volusia TPOs policy for the establishment and maintenance of its Project Priority Listings as amended. The motion was seconded by Mr. Paradise and carried unanimously.

D. <u>Review and Approval of Resolution 2011-16 Adopting the FY 2011/12 Project Priority</u> <u>Listings</u>

Mr. Welzenbach stated that there were changes being recommended to this resolution as well. On page 37, there are two projects on the SIS Priority List dealing with US 17; project #6: the US 17 widening (2 lanes to 4 lanes) from Ponce de Leon Boulevard to SR 40; and #11: US 17 PD&E from SR 40 to Putnam County. Even though US 17 is a SIS facility, most likely it will not receive any money. The two projects can be put on the Non-SIS List and the US 17 widening (2 lanes to 4) from Ponce de Leon Blvd to SR 40 project, will be funded by the state through DDR funds. He added that the CAC recommended moving the two projects to the Non-SIS list.

Chairman McCord asked if the projects could be put back on the SIS list if funds became available.

Mr. Welzenbach responded that it was not likely to happen since the Legislature raided the documentary stamp fund of \$186 million dollars.

Mr. Harowski asked if the theory behind the SIS list was that those facilities would get priority for improvements over roads.

Mr. Welzenbach replied yes.

Mr. Harowski recommended that the projects remain on the SIS list so they would continue to be a priority.

Mr. Cheney agreed that they should be retained on the SIS list, but added that they should also be placed on the Non-SIS, thereby keeping them on both lists.

Mr. Paradise asked if other projects would be jeopardized if the two US 17 projects were placed on the Non-SIS list.

Mr. Welzenbach replied that the projects would compete with each other.

Discussion continued.

Mr. Friedel clarified that the SIS list was funded separately from the Non-SIS list. One SIS list is compiled from all the counties and Central Office decides where they will allocate specific SIS funding. The Non-SIS projects are eligible to be funded with DDR and DS funding. He noted that on the SIS list, the US 17 projects are behind a number of high cost projects and therefore, it is unlikely that they would be funded in the next 10 or 15 years. If the projects are moved to the Non-SIS list, they would be at the top of the list and are likely to be funded in the next year or two. He stressed that it was not a good decision to put them on both lists.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of the SIS Priority List as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. J. Smith.

Discussion ensued.

The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the US 17 widening project was on the Non-SIS list and staff recommends adding the US 17 PD&E study to it as well.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of the Non-SIS Priority List with the addition of the US 17 PD&E study, from Barberville to the Putnam County Line. The motion was seconded by Mr. J. Smith.

Chairman McCord asked where the study would be placed on the list.

Mr. Welzenbach replied at the bottom - #12.

Discussion continued regarding how the motion should be stated, as one motion or each project separately.

Mr. Cheney stated that the I-95 Interchange modifications at US 1 were no longer a DRI. He asked if the project only included ramp modifications and what its status was.

Mr. Goss replied that the project was for ramp modifications and he agreed that the project description should be changed from widening to ramp modifications.

Mr. Cheney stated that the US 92 widening project, from four to six lanes, was currently being funded for design as a capacity project. It is not intersection improvement project; it is on the ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety List as an intersection only. The ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety list typically includes minor intersection improvements, not capacity projects, which are on the Non SIS List. He recommended that the project remain on the Non-SIS list, and be removed from the ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety List.

Mr. Welzenbach recapped the two changes: changing the description of project #5, I-95 @ US 1/SR 5, to indicate that it is a ramp modification; the addition of Project # 12, US 17 PD&E study, from Barberville to the Putnam County Line.

AMENDED MOTION: Mr. Cheney amended his original motion to change the project type of the I-95 @ US 1/SR 5 project from a widening to a ramp modification and adopt the Non-SIS List. Mr. J. Smith concurred with the amendment to the motion. The motion carried with Mr. Harowski voting in opposition.

Chairman McCord drew the TCC members attention to the XU ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety Priority Project List.

Mr. Welzenbach explained the difference between the "A" List, "B" List and "C" List.

Mr. Cheney asked what the policy was for the "A" List.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the "A" List projects have one or more phases already programmed. The "B" List projects are ready to be programmed and there is a letter of commitment from the local agency but it has not gone through the gaming cycle at FDOT.

Mr. Cheney asked how FDOT knew not to fund a "B" List project which does not have a letter of commitment to move forward.

Mr. Welzenbach noted that when the TPO gets a letter of commitment, FDOT is notified.

Mr. Cheney asked how the public and elected officials would know that everything was received.

Mr. Welzenbach responded that another column could be added to the list.

Mr. Cheney agreed that doing that would resolve his concerns.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the "A" List included the SR 600 widening (#9) project but it is actually part of the project on the Non-SIS List.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of Tier "A" as amended to remove Project #9, SR 600 widening from the "A" List noting it is on the Non-SIS List as funded. Mr. J. Smith seconded the motion.

Discussion continued regarding project #4, SR 5A (Nova Road) @ US 92 (International Speedway Boulevard) on the "A" List. No changes were made to the project.

Mr. Keeth suggested moving Mary Avenue to the "A" List.

Mr. Welzenbach added that Mary Avenue was funded as a streetscape and added that there were two applications, one for the streetscape and one for the design under ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety.

AMENDED MOTION: Mr. Cheney amended his motion to include moving the Mary Avenue project from the "B" list to the "A" list. Mr. J. Smith concurred with the amendment and it carried unanimously.

Moving on to the ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety "B" List, Mr. Welzenbach commented that staff was recommending a number of changes. The first two projects on the "B" List should be removed because they were studies and had been completed. In addition, anything related to the LED Replacement project would be looked at on a case-by-case basis. No one had come forth with an application to do the countywide signal traffic preemption for emergency vehicles; the study has been done but there are no projects and as such, should be removed from the list.

Mr. Cheney agreed with removing the signal preemption project but disagreed with the recommendation regarding the LED Signal Replacement; projects #7 and #8 should be moved to the top under the LED signal replacement.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the "B" List was for projects awaiting local commitment and done on a first come, first served basis.

Mr. Ferrell asked if the column for ranking could be removed, to which Mr. Welzenbach agreed.

Discussion continued on the "B" List.

Mr. Friedel stated that FDOT goes by the way the projects are ranked; the top of the list is considered first. The "B" List projects can qualify for other types of funding, not just XU funds.

Mr. Welzenbach urged FDOT that if they were aware of any money that was available, to come to the TCC for a recommendation on which project should receive the funds.

Mr. Cheney stated that it would be helpful if a date was added to the column which indicates whether there is a letter of financial commitment. Doing that would allow projects to be ranked as they come in.

Mr. Welzenbach agreed.

Mr. Ferrell commented that if the projects were going to be scored, that is how they should be ranked.

Mr. Welzenbach suggested keeping rank with the project score, but also including a column that identifies whether a letter of commitment has been received.

Mr. Cheney added that the rank could be the tiebreaker unless there are multiple projects by a jurisdiction and they are priority ranked.

Mr. Holmes noted that DeLand had submitted a commitment letter for the LED Signal Replacement project but it was not noted on the priority list.

Mr. Welzenbach said he would update the project.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that the Nova Road/SR 400 project (#1 on "B" List) had no cost estimate or funding commitment and therefore, it should be moved to the "C" List.

Mr. Ferrell asked if that also applied to projects #16 and #17.

Mr. Welzenbach replied yes. He asked Mr. Cheney if the cost estimate for project #15 was correct.

Mr. Cheney stated they had not yet come up with the cost estimate.

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Mr. Cheney recommended moving the project to the "C" List until the county could verify the estimate.

Mr. Welzenbach clarified that the bottom three projects as well as the #1 project would be moved to the "C" List and Mary Avenue would be moved to the "A" List.

Mr. Cheney asked about project #10, the traffic sign replacement (higher reflectivity); it is a maintenance project. He asked when maintenance projects were allowed on priority lists.

Discussion ensued regarding the definition of maintenance activities required to comply with federal changes.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of the "B" List, with the first two line items removed and projects 1, 15, 16, and 17 moved to the "C" List. Mr. Ferrell seconded the motion.

Mr. Welzenbach clarified that if the TCC members voted for the motion, they were, by default, approving maintenance projects as being eligible for XU Set-Aside Funds for ITS/Traffic Ops/Safety projects.

AMENDED MOTION: Mr. Cheney modified his motion to permit maintenance activities (one time only) because the project is required to comply with a new federal mandate. Mr. Ferrell concurred with the amendment.

Chairman McCord noted that he was not comfortable with the motion.

The motion carried with 8 "yes" votes and 6 "no" votes.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of the "C" List, with the additions previously noted. Mr. Ferrell seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Discussion ensued on the Enhancement List.

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of the Enhancement Priority List. Mr. Ferrell seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Discussion on the Lantern Park Bridge project on the Bicycle/Pedestrian Priority List ensued. It was noted that the project would be discussed at the TPO Board meeting. Mr. Welzenbach stated that he would be approaching South Daytona to explain that the bridge was not a bicycle/pedestrian project and therefore, should not be on the bicycle/pedestrian list.

Mr. Cheney requested that the Orange Avenue Bridge stay on the list.

E. <u>Review and Approval of Resolution 2011-17 Supporting the Federal Transportation</u> <u>Enhancement Program, the Recreational Trails Program and Safe Routes to Schools Program</u>

MOTION: Mr. Cheney moved to recommend approval of Resolution 2011-17 supporting the Federal Transportation Enhancement Program, the Recreational Trails Program and Safe Routes to Schools Program. The motion was seconded by Ms. Henrikson.

Mr. Cheney asked if the resolution could be sent to the Chairman of the House and Senate Transportation Subcommittees, as well as the U.S. House and Senate Delegation.

Mr. Welzenbach agreed.

Chairman McCord read into the record an additional "whereas" statement he wanted to have included in the resolution:

WHEREAS, The Volusia Transportation Planning Organization and participating local governments have identified, prioritized and programmed numerous projects relying on these dedicated funding sources and programs and converting funding for these programs to a generic block grant program could seriously jeopardize the project priorities and funding for these projects

AMENDED MOTION: Mr. Cheney modified his motion to include the additional whereas statement submitted by Chairman McCord. Ms. Henrikson seconded the amendment which carried unanimously.

IV. <u>Presentation, Status Reports, and Discussion Items</u>

A. <u>Review and Presentation on the SR 40 PD&E Study</u>

Ms. Mary McGehee, FDOT, stated that she was the project manager for the study and introduced the consultant, Mr. Jack Freeman, Kittlelson & Associates. Mr. Freeman gave a PowerPoint presentation on the SR 40 PD&E Study. The presentation gave an overview of the PD&E study process, the project and the project schedule. Public involvement would begin early and be ongoing. He announced that the first public meeting/workshop would be on July 21, 2011, 5:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. at Faith Lutheran Church in Ormond Beach. He added that a project website, www.SR40pde.com, would be up and running by the end of June. The project is expected to be completed in May 2012.

B. <u>Presentation on FDOT District 5 Sidewalk Gap Analysis</u>

Mr. Ed Kestory, FDOT, gave a PowerPoint presentation on the gap analysis process, scoping process and funding methods.

C. <u>FDOT Reports</u>

Mr. Friedel gave the FDOT report.

D. <u>Volusia County Construction Report</u>

Ms. Booker gave the Volusia County construction report.

V. <u>Staff Comments</u>

Mr. Welzenbach announced that there would be a workshop on SunRail on June 28, 2011, beginning at 6:45 a.m. in the TPO conference room. He added that there would be a federal certification public hearing following the June TPO Board meeting.

VI. <u>TCC Member Comments</u>

Mr. Cheney noted that the 2010 annual average daily traffic counts had been sent out via email. He added that county legal staff had resurrected the trucking ordinance and would be meeting with all the cities to do an interlocal agreement.

Mr. Ferrell asked Mr. Friedel for an update on the TCSP to be emailed to the local governments.

Mr. Friedel replied that either he or Ms. Horne-Harley would send something out.

Chairman McCord mentioned that there had been a number of railroad crossings added to the TIP and suggested compiling an inventory of them to send to the locals that are affected by the FEC and CSX lines. He added that it may be a good idea to meet and discuss the growth management legislation and its impact.

Mr. Welzenbach stated that there was a meeting on growth management scheduled in Orlampa.

Chairman McCord thanked the members for the opportunity to serve as the TCC Chairman.

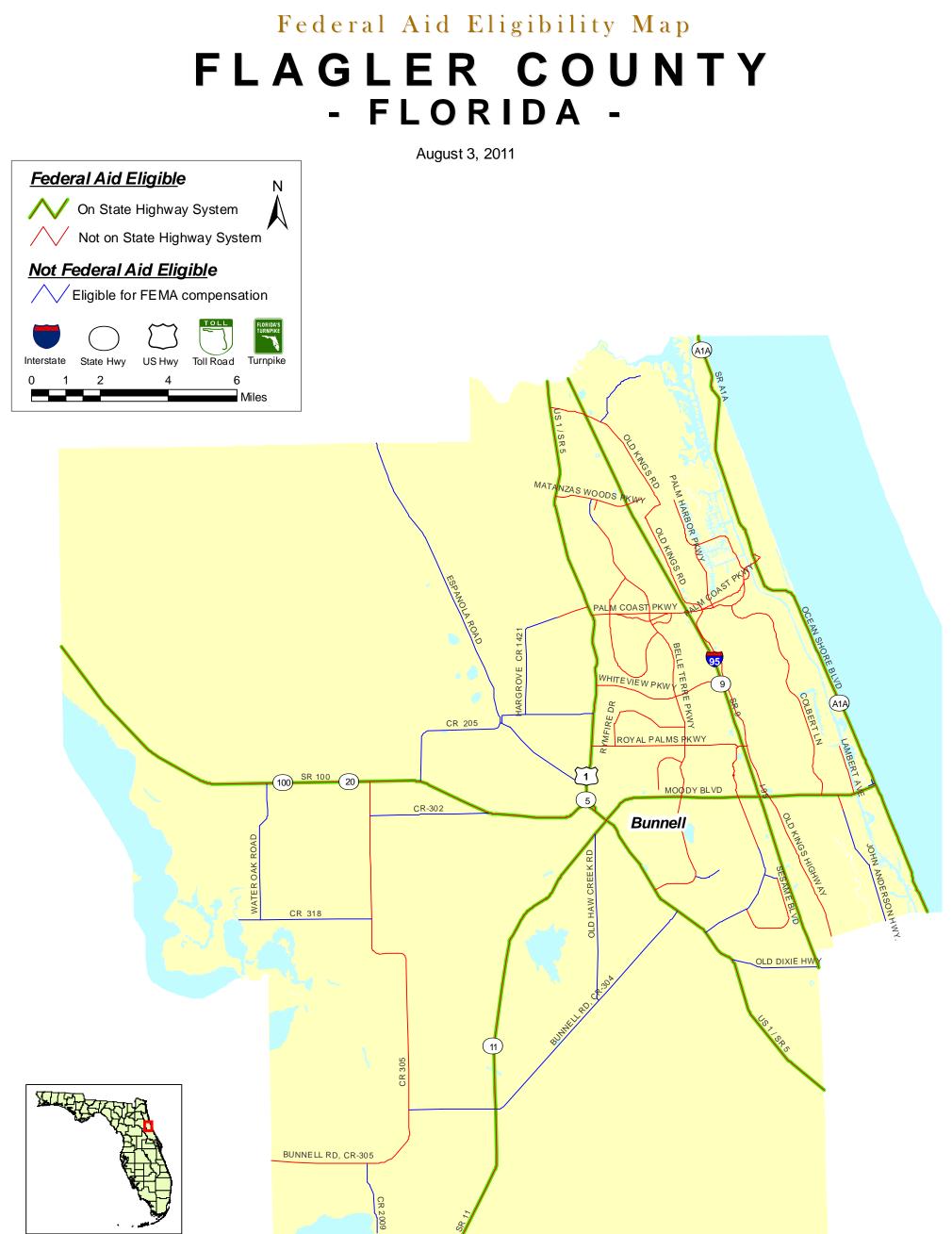

B. PRESENTATION IDENTIFYING KEY COMPONENTS OF THE TEN-YEAR MAJOR UPDATE TO VOTRAN'S FY 2012 - 2021 TRANSIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN (TDP)

Background Information:

Votran, in coordination with the Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), is working to develop the 2012/2021 Transit Development Plan (TDP) Major Update.

The TDP is a 10-year plan required by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to qualify for state Public Transit Block Grant Program funding, which helps to fund transit services in Volusia County. This plan calls for a description of each transit agency's vision for public transportation over a 10-year time frame and sets the transit vision for the area. The TDP includes an assessment of the current operating environment for the transit system, the existing service being provided, an evaluation of existing and current transit needs in the area, and a plan to prioritize and implement future projects and services based on available and projected funding.

The transit agency's progress toward implementing the plan is reviewed annually through an annual progress report submitted to the FDOT. Every five years, the TDP must be updated to ensure the plan is keeping pace with changes in the community and transit system. This TDP major update is due to FDOT by Sept. 1.

Votran has engaged Tindale-Oliver & Associates, Inc. to assist in the development of the major update of this TDP. Information concerning the TDP can be viewed at: www.votran.org/tdp.htm

- US 92 Resurface 12.6 miles from Kepler Road to the end of concrete pavement (FM No. 4220241/2) and convert flashing beacon to full signal at West Parkway intersection (FM No. 423864). Superior Construction Company Southeast was awarded the \$13,651,579 contract January 19. Work began March 21.

Near Future Construction

1. **SR 5A** (**Nova Road**) - Convert intersection with US 1 to a standard "T" intersection and construct dual left turn lanes from Nova Road to northbound US 1 in Ormond Beach (FM No. 425665). Bids are to be received in October. The estimated cost is \$300,000.
