#### A. PRESENTATION ON PROPOSED VOTRAN FARE INCREASE

#### **Background Information:**

In the upcoming budget year, Votran faces a projected increase of \$840,000 to the general fund subsidy to bridge the gap of the projected budget shortfall. By FY 2015, an additional \$2 million is forecasted to be added to the general fund. Revenue generated by a fare increase would help to offset part of this funding challenge. Currently, the fixed-route cash fare is \$1.25 and the day pass is \$3.00. These amounts are lower than the statewide average of other Florida transit systems. Votran's current fare structure has been in place since January 2007.

Votran staff will address this item.

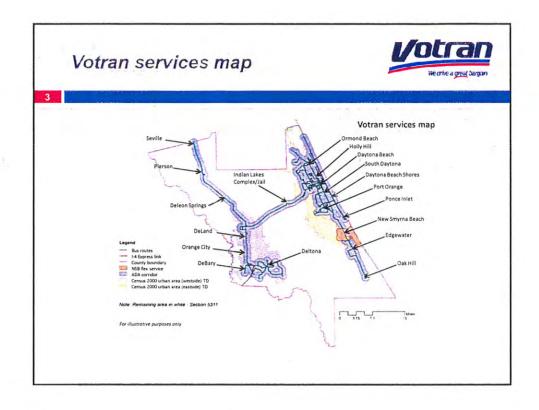


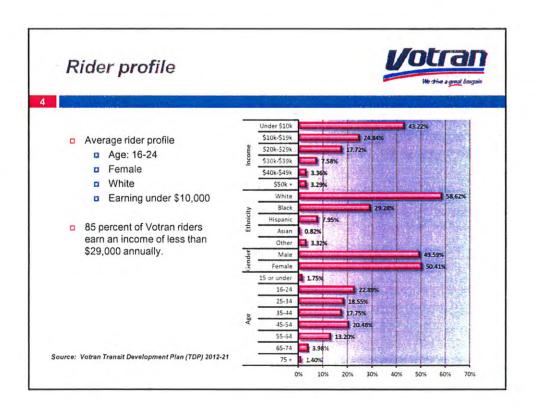
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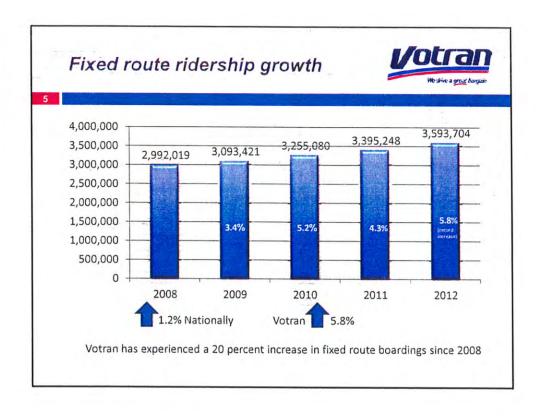


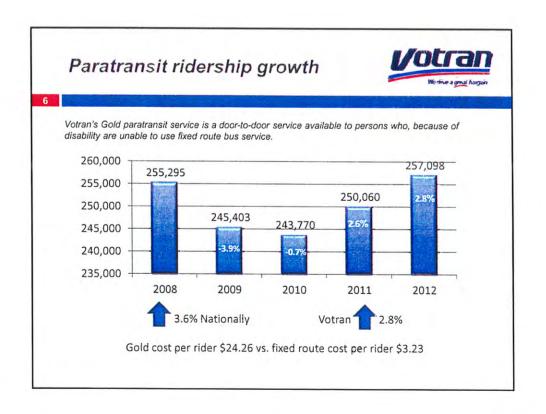
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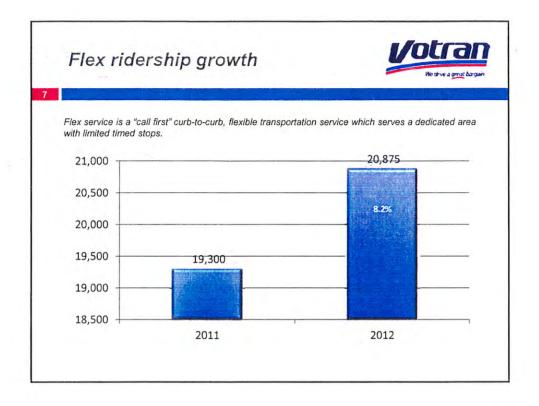
- March 2013 Volusia County Council conducted a mini-budget workshop where the projected 2014 budget was discussed including the anticipation of a funding shortfall.
- May 2013 Volusia County Council reviewed Votran saving initiatives, the possibility of a fare increase, and other cost saving options including service cuts. Council members identified the need to invite municipal support for Votran.
- June 2013 Municipalities participated in a funding workshop presentation and discussion.
- July 2013 County Council members gave instruction for Votran to begin public participation for possible a fare increase to be effective February 2014.
- The last Votran fare increase was January 2007.











## Cost saving measures implemented



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- No debt and no unfunded liabilities
- Eligible operating expenses are capitalized saving \$1 million annually
- Votran no longer coordinates Medicaid transportation
- Route 24 (west-Pierson) daily trips reduced from six to three
- New Smyrna Beach flex service reduced operating cost by 30 percent
- Wages and step increases frozen (consistent with county direction)
- Employee health insurance switched to new carrier saving \$500,000 annually

## Cost saving measures implemented (cont.)



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- Fuel use reduced from 875,352 gallons in 2007 to 797,419 gallons in 2012
  - □ In 2007 the average cost per gallon was \$2.58
  - □ In 2012 less fuel was used, but the average cost per gallon was \$3.51
- Seeking partnerships to assist in funding services (example: trolley partnership)
- HVAC roof project saves \$16,000 from general fund annually
- Westside facility lease will save an estimated \$35,785 from general fund annually
- Restructured holiday service

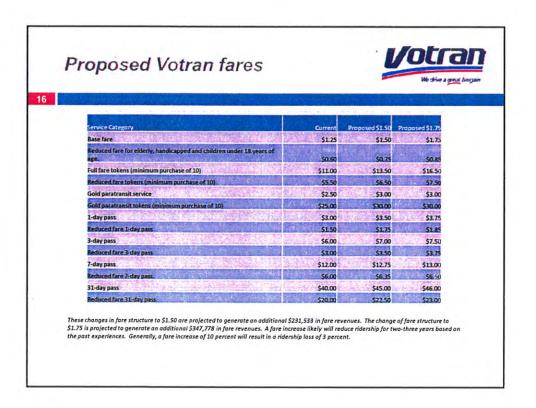
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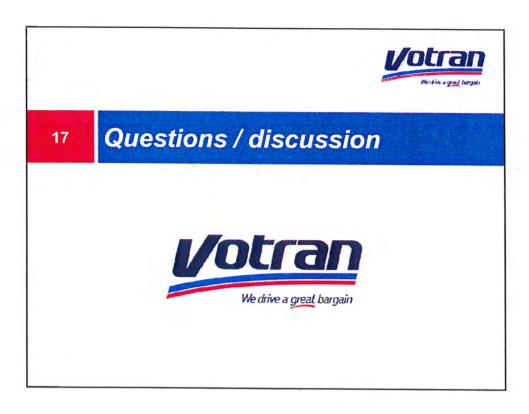

- 6) Garfield Ave. & New Hampshire Ave. Sidewalks (DeLand)

#### **Under Construction:**

- 1) Tymber Creek Rd (from SR 40 to Peruvian Way)
- 2) Saxon Blvd. Medians/ six laning (Enterprise Rd. to I-4)
- 3) Enterprise Road Sidewalk (from Debary Ave. to Deltona Middle School)

#### **Near Construction Projects:**

- Spring to Spring Trail (Blue Springs Park to Detroit Terrace) Design/Build of RR Bridge. Includes trail and trail head construction. Construction should start 3<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2013.

- 9) Pioneer Trail Curve Realignment at Turnbull Bay Rd. Construction funded in f.y. 2013/2014

- 1) Veterans Memorial Bridge (Orange Ave.) Construction LAP funding is in f.y. 2014/2015.
- 2) Turnbull Bay Bridge The Construction LAP funding is in f.y. 2013/2014.
