




# CHANGES IN VRU REQUIREMENTS

### **Previously**

Bike & Pedestrian Safety Peer Assessment

Voluntary and Occasional

### Currently

Mandatory self-assessment

Initially an addendum to SHSP

Required prior to each future SHSP

Identification of highest priority areas, considering demographics of crash locations

Mandatory consultation with locals in high-priority areas



# Four Basic Requirements

Meetings of boards or commissions must be open to the public

Reasonable notice of such meetings must be given

Meeting minutes must be taken

# **SUNSHINE LAW PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Sunshine Law is to ensure that decisions by public bodies are made in an open forum accessible to members of the public.

Myers v. News-Press Publishing Company. Inc., 514 So.2d 408 (Fla. 2nd DCA 1987).

"Decisions" are official actions which may include, but are not limited to:

- \* Recommendations
- \* Discussions
- \* Deliberations

# Florida Sunshine Law

**PUBLIC MEETINGS:** (F.S. 286.011)

"All meetings of any board or commission of any state agency or authority or of any agency or authority of any county, municipal corporation...at which official acts are to be taken."

# **Florida Sunshine Law** WHAT IS A MEETING:

1. Any gathering, formal or informal, of two or more members of the same body to discuss some matter on which it is foreseeable that action will be taken by the body at some future point

2. Discussions and deliberations, as well as formal action taken by a body (Interactive communication)

3. No requirement that a quorum be present



# River to Sea TPO Board and Advisory Committees

Advisory Boards (committees) created pursuant to law or ordinance or otherwise established by public agencies are subject to the Sunshine Law

This applies equally to elected or appointed boards or commissions



# Florida Sunshine Law

Discussions between two or more members about topics that might come up for action must take place in a public meeting setting

 No discussions about potential action items in person, by phone, by email, by text messages, on social media, or by any other means of communication

# DO NOT USE "REPLY ALL"

Must declare conflicts of interest

# **Florida Sunshine Law**

While an individual board member is not prohibited from discussing board business with staff or a non-board member, these individuals may not be used as a liaison to communicate information between board members. For example, a board member cannot ask staff to poll the other board members to determine their views on a board issue.



# Florida Sunshine Law Penalties

Any member of a board, commission, committee, or agency who **knowingly violates** the Sunshine Law is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree:

- Persons convicted of this may be sentenced to jail for up to 60 days and/or fined up to \$500
- An unintentional violation in a noncriminal infraction punishable by a fine of not more than \$500



#### **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is conducting a maintenance project for the segment of Nova Road / State Road (S.R.) 5A from Flomich Street to U.S.1, a distance of approximately 3.91 miles. Maintenance projects provide FDOT an opportunity to resurface a roadway and make other minor improvements. The goal of this maintenance project is to rehabilitate the pavement while incorporating proposed safety improvements that can be implemented within the existing right of way.

As part of this effort, the Nova Road Coalition was formed to study the corridor, identify issues, and engage the local community in identifying solutions that improve safety for all users. With a focus on the key segment from south of Granada Boulevard (S.R. 40) to north of Wilmette Avenue, a distance of approximately 0.5 miles, the coalition is evaluating a variety of factors including safety, speed management, and pedestrian and bicyclist mobility to identify improvements that can be incorporated into this maintenance project.

### Alternative 1 - Wider Sidewalk and Landscape Buffer

#### **Key Elements**

- Reduces the number of travel lanes from 6 to 4
- Replaces center turn lane with a landscaped median that includes openings and turn lanes at specific locations
- Widens sidewalks to 8 feet on each side of Nova Road and adds landscaped buffers to separate the sidewalks from the roadway
- Adds a pedestrian hybrid beacon (PHB), which is an overhead traffic device designed to help pedestrians safely cross the road

#### Alternative 2 - Separated Bicycle Lane

#### **Key Elements**

- Reduces the number of travel lanes from 6 to 4
- Replaces center turn lane with a landscaped median that includes openings and turn lanes at specific locations
- Adds bicycle lanes on each side of Nova Road with a separator between the bicycle lanes and roadway
- Adds a pedestrian hybrid beacon (PHB), which is an overhead traffic device designed to help pedestrians safely cross the road

#### CyclingSavvy hosted by FDOT District Five Office of Safety

### **Day 1 - October 4, 2023 - Deland – 830am to 1130am** \*All participants will attend this session. \*

*Train Your Bike* - These bike handling sessions are conducted in a parking lot. It consists of a set of progressive drills designed to increase a students' control and comfort handling their bikes in various situations. Many Florida adult cycling injuries to not involve a motor vehicle. Crashes with fixed objects, pavement hazards, pedestrian, animals or other cyclists could be avoided with better bike-handling skills.

#### **Day 1 - October 4, 2023 - Deland – 1pm to 4pm** \*All participants will attend this session. \*

*Truth and Techniques* - This classroom session familiarizes students with bicycle-specific laws, traffic dynamics and problem-solving strategies, including new e-bike specific topics. Extensive use of video and animations will help students visualize the materials presented. Students will discover that bicycle drivers are equal road users, with the right and ability to control their space. Bicycling is very safe and with a few simple techniques, bicycling can be virtually conflict free.

**Day 2 & 3 - October 5 & 6 2023 - Orlando – 830am to noon** \*Participants will attend one session – either Thursday or Friday. \*

*On-Road Tour Experience* – An experiential tour of your city's roads. The course includes some of the most intimidating road features (intersections, interchanges, merges, etc.) a cyclist might find in their travels. The students travel as a group, stopping to survey and discuss each exercise location. After observing the feature, discussing the traffic dynamics and the best strategy for safe and easy passage, the students will ride through individually and regroup at a nearby location.
