## I. <u>Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance</u>

The roll was called and it was determined that a quorum was present.

A moment of silence was observed in remembrance of 9/11 victims.

## II. Public Comment/Participation

Mr. Big John, press, stated he requested an item be placed on the agenda several months ago; however, Chairperson Post told him the Volusia County Council is forbidding her from bringing new service forward from this group. He is changing his focus to the TDLCB members as he does not feel he should be stonewalled on this issue. He owns a car and is able to go wherever he needs to go whenever he wants; however, the citizens this group represents do not have that ability and depend on Votran and Votran Gold; he has appointed himself to represent them. He wants to know why the process cannot be started for new bus service to the Tanger Outlet Mall and Tomoka Town Center where there are thousands of jobs and thousands of people who want to go there. He would like to move this forward and asked for assistance.

Mr. Colon replied that new service requires a lot of planning. Votran has to figure out what areas it can cover and must come up with the funds; over \$1 million. He is sure Votran is working on a solution but it takes time and planning.

Mr. Big John commented if they are working on something they should tell us; this is government and they should be transparent. He stated he will be at the next TDLCB meeting and at that point he will have no option but to publicize members' names; only Ms. Burgess-Hall spoke out at the last meeting regarding this issue. Something needs to get moving on this and taking no action is unacceptable.

Chairperson Post asked Mr. Rob Stephens, Votran General Manager, what the nearest bus stop is to the Tanger Outlet Mall.

Mr. Stephens replied it is approximately a mile.

Chairperson Post stated she would like to know the closest stops north and south on Williamson Boulevard and east and west on LPGA Boulevard.

Mr. Alvarez replied he would find out.

Mr. Stephens stated that this service request remains in the Transit Development Plan (TDP) and in Votran's planning documents.

Chairperson Post stated this issue is not being stonewalled; that is a highly misrepresented statement. She understands the need for this service which is why we are revamping this board;

to have the people that use the system come and talk about what we need to do. In regards to the Volusia County Council not having movement on this issue, the Council has given the direction for this year to stop building out and review the existing service in a number of different areas; housing, public safety, Votran, etc. We need to ensure the current provided service is sufficient for those that use it and it is where it needs to be before adding more. One area she is working on are the bus stops that have had benches removed and/or have no shelter; after walking to the stop riders must stand in high grass in the heat with no seat. These are the people that are mobile and does not count those that are in wheelchairs or otherwise disabled. For example, some of these stops are along Jimmy Ann Drive and Mason Avenue which is where the people the TDLCB represents are using the service. She has had discussions with Votran and she is working with the city and county to get those stops funded and taken care. This is more of a priority than providing service to Sam's Club for people to shop; she is looking at the low income areas where people need to get to work and where they need to go and are unable to. It is a misrepresentation that she and the Council do not care just because the Council is not specifically working to get one bus stop to the Tanger Outlet Mall.

Mr. Big John replied he believes he is being stonewalled and stated he spoke with Volusia County Council Chair Kelley about this issue and he was going to discuss it at a Council meeting. That has not happened yet so he will contact Chair Kelley again.

Ms. Nancy Burgess-Hall, Halifax Council for the Blind, announced each year in October, consumer organizations that work with the visually impaired and associate organizations that work with the mobility impaired host awareness activities regarding the White Cane Law. They have expanded that to include pedestrian and bicycle safety. She announced a telephone meeting will be held tonight at 6:30 pm. She challenged members to contact Mr. Hall or Ms. Lipovsky who are both on the committee; they are planning an event to walk to the Tanger Outlet Mall. The closest, safest bus stop is at the Daytona Beach Police Station on Valor Boulevard which is approximately one mile away. There are some sections without sidewalks but most of the way does have sidewalks. They are challenging those in a decision making capacity to board Votran Route 11 at the transfer plaza, ride to the police station and walk to the Tanger Outlet Mall. They will be discussing possible dates tonight. In defense of the Volusia County Council and Votran, the cities are also at fault; they are inviting development into areas that are not serviced by Votran

## IV. <u>Discussion Items and Presentations</u>

## A. <u>Presentation and Discussion of the Easterseals Autism Center of Excellence</u>

(Handout)

Chairperson Post introduced TDLCB member, Ms. Beverly Johnson, President and CEO of Easterseals, to give the presentation. She spoke about the way Votran's transportation disadvantage services effect, impact and assist the clients at the Autism Center of Excellence.

Ms. Johnson gave a PowerPoint presentation on Easterseals; she stated they are located on Dunn Avenue and they have a bus stop in front of their office. She explained what services Easterseals provides and announced they are celebrating 100 years of service nationally and 69 years locally. She stated they diagnose autism from 18 months of age up to 18 years and are the only evidence-based diagnostic center in the county. She explained they serve families with young children, adults and seniors. They partner with the Volusia County Health Department to have a "loan closet" where clients can borrow for free durable medical equipment such as wheelchairs, walkers, hospital beds, etc.; you do not have to be an Easterseals client to access the equipment. She reviewed their funding and stated that all monies raised stay within our service area. Most clients use Votran and Votran Gold to get to the center; some clients also use Uber, Lyft, taxis and the charter school students are transported by Volusia County school buses. All of their clients are well supported by Votran and Votran services; they are able to assist clients with bus fares via grants.

Ms. Gahagan commended Easterseals for the work they do and asked if they have a contract with Uber or Lyft as they are not cheap to use.

Ms. Johnson replied no; they assist with Votran if someone has a need. Some of their clients choose Uber or Lyft as an option but that is not something Easterseals supports.

Mr. Hall asked her to explain the Easterseals Project Action.

Ms. Johnson replied that is not something this Easterseals affiliate is doing; it could be Easterseals Florida which is in the neighboring counties. She does not know much about it.

Mr. Hall commented that it is a great advocacy program that deals with transportation and pedestrian safety.

Ms. Biro stated Votran has been using Easterseals Project Action for training; they have free publications and training for taxi drivers, motor coach drivers and bus drivers. It is part of the national Easterseals. It is mostly training for transportation related issues.

## B. Presentation and Discussion of SunRail Service

(Handout)

Mr. Riley Carson, Marketing Coordinator and Interpreter for SunRail, gave a PowerPoint presentation on SunRail service. SunRail's primary purpose is to serve as traffic relief for I-4; they are a commuter rail system that connects communities. He gave a synopsis of SunRail operations and the hours of service. They also run trains for special events when they have city approval and funding. There are 16 SunRail stations across four counties; Volusia, Seminole, Orange and Osceola Counties. The southern expansion of four stations in Osceola and Orange Counties opened this past July. He gave a description of the trains and stated they are ADA and wheelchair accessible. He reviewed the website and app which explains all the SunRail connections. He explained the ticket system and fare costs; both one-way and round trip tickets are available for purchase. Disabled citizens that are certified from Votran or Lynx receive a 50% discount on fares. A SunRail card can be purchased that is similar to the Sun Pass for toll roads which never expires. He announced there are instructional videos available on the website and YouTube on how to ride the train. SunRail staff will accompany any groups that need assistance boarding and they are willing to speak to groups that want more information.

Mr. Gross asked if there is an estimated date for when the DeLand station will be completed.

Mr. Carson replied he does not have an answer but it was discussed at the last SunRail Commission meeting; nothing has contractually changed. Future expansion is still being planned.

Mr. Gross explained he is asking because a lot of veterans have a hard time getting to Lake Nona versus using Votran to get to the Daytona Beach or DeLand offices. He asked what station is closest to Lake Nona.

Mr. Carson replied he does not have the exact location but can get that for him.

Mr. Colon stated the closest station to Lake Nona is Meadow Woods which is close to SR 417 which takes you to Lake Nona.

Chairperson Post pointed out that there is Votran service to the DeBary station. Mr. Carson replied it is Votran route 31 to DeLand and routes 32 and 33 to Deltona.

## C. Presentation and Discussion of the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

Ms. Nicoulin introduced Mr. Jim Wood, Kimley-Horn and Associates, to give the presentation on the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). The LRTP is a 25-year transportation plan that is updated every five years and identifies strategies for transportation needs for the future as well as funding sources.

Mr. Wood gave a PowerPoint presentation and introduced his team. He reviewed the major milestones and the schedule of deliverables. The adoption package will be presented in June 2020 which will include the cost feasible plan and an open public hearing will be held; the plan will be adopted in September 2020. He reviewed the public involvement schedule and stated there will also be ongoing public involvement activities that TPO staff will be doing. One of the most important parts of the LRTP is to show how the projects in the cost feasible plan will be funded.

Ms. Boswell commented Volusia County has recently completed a community health needs assessment and asked if any goals, objectives or performance measures of the LRTP aligning with idea of community health and economic disparity; people that are struggling financially are sometimes unable to get to a job due to a lack of transportation.

Mr. Wood replied yes; they want to address those type of issues and it will be part of how they shape the goals.

## D. Presentation and Discussion of the Draft TDLCB Grievance Procedures

Mr. Harris stated the draft Grievance Procedures are provided in the agenda packet and will be an action item for adoption in November. The Changes are denoted by deletions are stricken in red and additions are underlined in green. He reviewed the changes including changing the quorum for the Grievance Committee from five to three.

#### V. Staff Comments

## → Central Florida Mobility Week

Chairperson Post announced the Central Florida Mobility Week will be held October 25 through November 1, 2019. A flyer is provided in the agenda.

## → TDLCB Marketing Activities

Ms. Blankenship stated the Easterseals flyer included in the agenda was developed to send to our contacts, the media and TDLCB members to solicit interest in the TDLCB and encourage people to attend the meetings. A letter was also sent to all TDLCB members regarding the importance of participating and attending the meetings and requesting they appoint alternates if they are unable to attend. A newsletter will also be created and sent out after each meeting.

## **VI.** TDLCB Member Comments

Mr. Alvarez reminded members that beginning in January 2020, the TDLCB meeting schedule will change to meet once per quarter and we will need to make sure we align the meetings correctly for time sensitive documents such as the AOR and AER.

Mr. Hall reminded members of tonight's telephone meeting regarding White Cane Pedestrian Awareness; it is at 6:30 pm. The phone number is 515-604-9860 and the passcode is 521745. He encouraged members to participate and noted the activities they plan will be based on ideas generated there. White Cane Awareness is the whole month of October and they are looking at doing a number of activities.

## VII. TDLCB Chairperson Comments

Chairperson Post stated Ms. Blankenship has done an amazing job of emphasizing outreach and getting the message out about the TDLCB. If members have not received the letter yet it reiterates the importance of the TDLCB and members' involvement.

#### A. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF CAREERSOURCE FLAGLER VOLUSIA

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

CareerSource Flagler/Volusia has offices located in Orange City, Daytona Beach and Palm Coast. All three Centers provide services to individuals seeking employment as well as businesses looking to hire.

Services offered to the job seeker include assistance with job search utilizing the Employ Florida System, which is the system employers use to post their job openings. Individuals can use the Online Training Hub to complete workshops on resume writing, interviewing skills, and how to navigate a job fair. If individuals need assistance with any of the workshops, staff is available to assist.

For individuals looking for training opportunities, a scholarship process is in place where CareerSource can possibly assist with some of the costs for tuition, books, or materials. As long as eligibility requirements are met and the training is on the list and the school, assistance may be provided up to \$7,500.

In addition to job seekers, CareerSource works with customers referred by the Department of Children and Families and individuals who have disabilities. For these customers, CareerSource can assist with transportation in the form of a gas card or a monthly bus pass. The goal is to assist all customers coming through our doors to find employment so they can become self-sufficient.

Services offered to businesses include assistance with recruiting events, posting jobs in Employ Florida, assisting with off-setting costs for hiring new employees through on the Job Training, and Customized Training to assist with upgrading current employees' skills needed for their jobs.

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# TDLCB Meeting Recap September 11, 2019

# FY 2018/19 AOR & AER Approval

The TDLCB approved the FY 2018/19 Annual Operating Report (AOR) and the Annual Expenditure Report (AER). The AOR includes operating and financial data and the AER includes expenditures of local and direct funding for transportation services.

## **SunRail Presentation**

Mr. Riley Carson, SunRail, gave a presentation on the benefits and use of SunRail. SunRail is ADA accessible, from the parking lots to the available flip-up seats to accommodate wheelchairs.

# TDLCB Grievance Procedures

The TDLCB Grievance Procedures are updated on an annual basis and guide the TDLCB in handling grievances brought before the Grievance Committee. Proposed updates to the procedures were reviewed.



# 2045 TPO Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

Mr. Jim Wood, Kittleson & Associates, Consultant for the TPO's 2045 LRTP, gave a presentation on the major milestones in the schedule and key components for the plan. He highlighted the public involvement schedule and various tasks that would occur throughout the process as well as the next steps.

# Presentation on the Transportation Needs of Easterseals and the Autism Center of Excellence

Ms. Beverly Johnson, President and CEO of Easterseals of Northeast Central Florida and the Autism Center of Excellence, gave a presentation to the TDLCB at their regularly scheduled meeting on September 11, 2019.

The Easterseals Autism Center of Excellence brings together a team of professionals to provide access to early diagnostic and functional assessments, a variety of treatment alternatives, support and education for families. It is the only evidencebased diagnostic center in Volusia County. Some of their other services include charter schools, child development centers, a loan closet for durable medical equipment, case management and disability services.

The center is serviced by Votran which has a bus stop directly outside the building. Votran is the most used method of transportation among the center's clients and employees. Votran Gold Service, which provides transportation to disabled individuals who are unable to utilize fixed route services, services the center. Ride share programs are also used such as Uber and Lyft as well as taxis. Volusia Schools County provides transportation via buses to the agency's charter schools.
