

RESOLUTION OF THE VOLUSIA-FLAGLER TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION (TPO)
REAFFIRMING THE POLICY FOR THE ALLOCATION OF SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK
GRANT (STBG) PROGRAM URBAN ATTRIBUTABLE (SU) FUNDING AND OTHER STATE AND
FEDERAL FUNDS IDENTIFIED IN THE VOLUSIA-FLAGLER 2050 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION
PLAN (LRTP)

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that every urbanized area with a population of 50,000 or more, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, shall have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the designated Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) comprised of Volusia County and the urbanized areas of Flagler County including the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, 23 C.F.R. 450.104 provides that the Volusia-Flagler TPO shall annually endorse, and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required, among which is the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program projects list of the annual Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) submission; and

WHEREAS, each year the appropriate Volusia-Flagler TPO committees, made up of a cross-section of interested citizens and technical staff, are charged with the responsibility of drafting a list of prioritized projects; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Volusia-Flagler TPO to establish project priorities that are equitable for all areas within the Volusia-Flagler TPO's planning boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia-Flagler TPO reaffirms its commitment to the priority process and related policies.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Volusia-Flagler TPO that:

1. The Volusia-Flagler TPO's total Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (SU) funding goals will be made in the following manner: 40% of the total SU funds will be used for Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives

(traffic operations focused) Project Priorities, 30% of the total SU funds will be used for Transit Project Priorities, and 30% of the total SU funds will be used for Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian focused) Project Priorities; and

- Other state and federal funds identified in the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan for Local Initiatives will be made available in the following manner: 50% of the funds will be used for Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations focused) Project Priorities and 50% will be used for Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian focused) Project Priorities; and
- 3. Mixed projects (defined as a project that is not a stand-alone bicycle or pedestrian project) will only be accepted and ranked in both the bicycle/pedestrian focused and the traffic operations focused project categories if the bicycle/pedestrian cost component of the project is greater than 20% of the total project cost. Projects that do not meet this threshold shall be submitted and ranked in the traffic operations focused category only. The project applications shall include the cost breakdown between the bicycle/pedestrian component and the traffic operations component of the project. When programming mixed projects, funding amounts drawn down from each set-aside category (bicycle/pedestrian focused vs. traffic operations focused) shall be consistent with the cost component of that category; and
- 4. For projects funded in whole or in part with Urban Attributable (SU) funding and/or other state and federal funds obtained through the TPO's Priority Project Process, if the recipient of the funds chooses to display any signs or markers at the project site, said signs or markers shall include language acknowledging the Volusia-Flagler TPO, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), and/or other funding partners, as may be applicable, for providing funding for the project. In addition to the language, the sign or marker shall include these agencies' official logos; and
- 5. Additionally, any public pronouncements made by or on behalf of the recipient regarding the project, including press releases, publications, annual reports, video credits, and dedications shall acknowledge the funding support provided by the TPO, FDOT, FHWA, and FTA; and
- 6. Any remaining Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (SU) funds in the current fiscal year should first be allocated to eligible projects within the same project category Priority List (bicycle/pedestrian focused or traffic operations focused). If no projects are eligible within the same category the remaining funds may be reallocated for other projects on the Priority List or to cover project cost increases consistent with Resolution 2025-18; and
- 7. The policies set forth in this resolution shall remain in effect unless and until they are repealed or amended by the TPO; and

- 8. The Chairperson of the Volusia-Flagler TPO (or their designee) is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this resolution to the:

 - Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) (through the Florida Department c. of Transportation).

RESOLUTION OF THE VOLUSIA-FLAGLER TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION (TPO) REAFFIRMING THE LOCAL MATCH REQUIREMENTS PLACED ON MEMBER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FOR PROJECTS PRIORITIZED FOR FUNDING BY THE TPO

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the designated Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) comprised of Volusia County and the urbanized areas of Flagler County including the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, the FDOT funds projects in the Work Program based on the plans and priorities set by the TPO; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia-Flagler TPO desires to provide, whenever possible, financial assistance to governmental entities to allow them to pursue transportation projects and programs that are consistent with the TPO's plans and priorities and benefit residents of and visitors to our planning area; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia-Flagler TPO wants to leverage the state and federal transportation funds programmed on transportation projects in the TPO's MPA and ensure a measure of local financial commitment to transportation projects and programs utilizing these funds.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Volusia-Flagler TPO that:

- 1. Every governmental entity receiving state and/or federal transportation funds for a project on any of the following Priority Project Lists shall provide a local match at a minimum ratio of 10% local funds to 90% state and/or federal funds:
 - a. Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects;
 - b. Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives Projects.

This match requirement shall not apply to projects on the State Highway System; and

- 2. Every governmental entity receiving state and/or federal transportation funds for a project on the TPO's Priority List of Transportation Planning Studies shall provide a local match at a minimum ratio of 10% local funds to 90% state and/or federal funds; and
- 3. A local match shall not be required for any project on the TPO's Priority Lists of Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Projects, Regionally-Significant Non-SIS Roadway Projects, or Transit

- Projects, subject to any other funding program requirements that may apply (e.g., Transportation Regional Incentive Program); and
- The Volusia-Flagler TPO determines that "local match" shall be defined as non-state/nonfederal cash match and/or in-kind services of eligible costs that advance the project in question; and
- 5. Notwithstanding the terms prescribed in subparagraphs 1 and 2, above, the required local match shall not exceed the ratio required in the current policy of the TPO Board at the time the governmental entity requests funding unless the local governmental entity commits to a higher local match for the project; and
- 6. The Volusia-Flagler TPO reserves the right to waive or adjust the local match requirements if the TPO Board deems there exists sufficient reason or circumstance; and
- 7. The Volusia-Flagler TPO defines a cost overrun as an increase in the amount of the cost of any programmed project phase due to a change in scope, project limits, or project approach that could have reasonably been foreseen or is the result of an incomplete, insufficient, or out of date cost estimate; and
- 8. The Volusia-Flagler TPO reaffirms its policy that any cost overruns encountered on a project funded with state and/or federal transportation funds will be the responsibility of the governmental entity identified as the project originator with the following exception: if the project is on the state highway system and the State DOT is the project manager of record then the state shall be responsible for any cost overruns utilizing state dollars; and
- The Volusia-Flagler TPO defines a cost increase as an increase in the cost of any programmed project phase due to unforeseen market changes or a change in requirements and/or standards for projects that have current and complete cost estimates; and
- 10. Requests for additional state and/or federal funds must be submitted to the TPO and include a statement of hardship or justification by the governmental entity identified as the project sponsor along with supporting documentation that includes detailed justification of the change in cost; and
- 11. The Volusia-Flagler TPO Executive Director may authorize the use of state and/or federal funds to cover some or all of a justified cost increase on any project phase up to and including 50% of the project cost estimate for that phase; and
- 12. The use of state and/or federal funds to cover cost increases exceeding 50% of the project cost estimate for any phase may be authorized only by the Volusia-Flagler TPO Board; and
- 13. The policies set forth in this resolution shall remain in effect unless and until they are repealed or amended by the TPO; and
- 14. The Chairperson of the Volusia-Flagler TPO (or their designee) is hereby authorized and directed to submit this resolution to the:
 - a. Florida Department of Transportation;
 - b. Federal Transit Administration (through the Florida Department of Transportation);

- c. Federal Highway Administration (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and
- d. Councils, Commissions, and Managers of the TPO Member Local Governments.

RESOLUTION OF THE VOLUSIA-FLAGLER TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION REAFFIRMING THE POLICY FOR ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING TRANSPORTATION PRIORITY PROJECTS

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that every urbanized area with a population of 50,000 or more, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, shall have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, DBA the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the designated Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) comprised of Volusia County and the urbanized areas of Flagler County including the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, 23 C.F.R. 450.104 provides that the Volusia-Flagler TPO shall annually endorse, and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required, among which is the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG) projects list of the annual Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) submission; and

WHEREAS, each year the appropriate Volusia-Flagler TPO committees made up of a cross-section of interested citizens and technical staff are charged with the responsibility of drafting a list of prioritized projects; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Volusia-Flagler TPO to establish project priorities for all areas of the TPO's MPA; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia-Flagler TPO reaffirms its commitment to the priority process and related policies.

Now, Therefore, Be IT Resolved by the Volusia-Flagler TPO that the following policies are established to prioritize transportation projects throughout the TPO's MPA:

- The project application and evaluation criteria approved by the Volusia-Flagler TPO Board shall be used to solicit and evaluate projects for priority ranking in the transportation program categories listed below:
 - a. Florida Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Projects;

- b. Regionally Significant, Non-SIS Roadway Projects and Major Bridge Projects;
- c. Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects;
- d. Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives Projects;
- e. Public Transit Projects; and
- f. Transportation Planning Studies.
- 2. Volusia-Flagler TPO projects that were previously ranked and have a Financial Management (FM) number and are in the Florida Department of Transportation Work Program will automatically be prioritized above projects that are not currently in the FDOT Five-Year Work Program; and
- 3. Projects which are ranked one through eight on Tier "B" of the Prioritized List of Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects are deemed to be protected, and will be ranked in their current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are completed and drop out of the Work Program; and
- 4. Projects which are ranked one through three on Tier "B" of the Prioritized List of Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives Projects are deemed to be protected, and will be ranked in their current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are completed and drop out of the Work Program; and
- 5. If, at any time, two or more lists of prioritized projects are merged into a new list, every project that was protected prior to the merger shall retain its protected status, and no new or previously unprotected project shall be deemed to be protected unless and until it advances to the protected rank prescribed for the new merged list; and
- 6. The Volusia-Flagler TPO will only re-prioritize or add projects when the TPO Board determines a) unusual circumstances support such action, b) the circumstances are not of a recurring nature, c) the circumstances do not result from the actions of the project sponsor, and d) the proposed reprioritization or addition will not be contrary to the public interest; and
- 7. Requests to change the priority or to add a project must include a statement of hardship by the requestor along with supporting documentation that includes detailed justification of need and an assessment of the impacts to the programming of prioritized projects; and
- 8. It is the responsibility of the Volusia-Flagler TPO and FDOT staff to provide the Volusia-Flagler TPO members with current information and data on project status and to assist the members in their efforts to make informed decisions regarding the prioritized projects lists; and

- 9. The Volusia-Flagler TPO shall, in its discretion, make all decisions regarding the final prioritized project lists that are annually submitted to FDOT; and
- Once a project has attained protected status, it should be programmed within 3 years. If it has not been programmed during that time due to inactivity on the part of the project sponsor, then the project will be removed from the list of priority projects. The project sponsor may resubmit the project for open ranking on any subsequent call for projects; and
- 11. Per the approved Annual Call for Projects schedule, the project sponsor shall annually submit a letter to the Volusia-Flagler TPO affirming their continued support to retain each project on the priority list and provide updated cost estimates for all unfunded phases of each project they sponsor on the Regionally Significant Non-SIS, Tier "A" and Tier "B" project lists. Updated cost estimates for projects or project phases that are currently funded/programmed are considered a request for additional funding and subject to the TPO's cost increase/cost overrun policy. Requests for additional funding shall be submitted to the TPO on the appropriate form. Pending availability of funds, updates to planning level construction costs (CST/CEI) that were programmed prior to the completion of the design (PE) phase may be updated one time following the completion of the PE phase without being considered a request for additional funding; and
- 12. The letter shall also provide support from the project sponsor for any Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) eligible project(s) which they are ready to advance into the Work Program and TIP and provide a commitment of local matching funds, if required, and any SUN Trail eligible projects which the local government intends to submit for SUN Trail funding during the state's open call for funding. These projects shall be compiled into an unranked TRIP list and unranked SUN Trail list; and
- 13. The Volusia-Flagler TPO shall use this project prioritization process to support the development of Regional Priority Lists in the areas of Trails, Transit, Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSM&O), and Planning Studies; and
- 14. The policies set forth in this resolution shall remain in effect unless and until they are repealed or amended by the TPO; and
- 15. the Chairperson of the Volusia-Flagler TPO, (or their designee) is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this resolution to the:
 - a. Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT); and
 - b. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and
 - c. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation).

The Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is now accepting applications for projects to be added to our List of Priority Projects. These applications will be used by the TPO to qualify and prioritize proposed transportation-related projects for feasibility study and/or implementation using federal and/or state transportation funding.

The deadline for submitting project applications is 4:00 p.m. on Friday, February 27, 2026.

Only applications for transportation-related projects in the following Priority Project categories will be considered at this time:

- Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations focused) Projects
- Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives (bicycle and pedestrian focused) Projects
- Transportation Planning Studies
- Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Eligible Projects (letter of support only)
- Shared Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail projects (letter of support only)

<u>Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects and Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives</u> Projects

All state and/or federal funded projects that are not on the State Highway System (SHS) require a 10% local match for the feasibility study.

All state and/or federal funded projects that are not on the State Highway System (SHS) require a minimum 10% local match for project implementation.

Local Initiatives projects address complete streets retrofits, roundabouts, major technology improvements, climate change adaptation, aesthetics, and other improvements that support the goals of the Long Range Transportation Plan. Local initiative projects that focus on traffic operations will use the *Traffic Operations, Safety & Local Initiatives Project Application*; those that focus on bicyclists and pedestrians shall use the *Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives Project Application*.

The process for reviewing and ranking Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives projects and Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives projects is as follows:

- 1. For each proposed project, the Applying Agency (project sponsor) will submit a completed Volusia-Flagler TPO Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Project Funding Application or Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives Project Funding Application. The application will indicate whether the Applying Agency is requesting a feasibility study or project implementation. The Volusia-Flagler TPO will accept an application for project implementation (design, right-of-way, construction) only if the proposed project has undergone a feasibility study or if a feasibility study will not be required.
- 2. Volusia-Flagler TPO staff will screen applications to ensure that they are complete and include only eligible improvements/activities.
- 3. Project applications for <u>feasibility studies</u>:
 - a. Applying Agency (project sponsor) will submit an official letter to the Volusia-Flagler TPO certifying that the project is supported by the Applying Agency and agreeing to pay its required local share (10%) of the cost for a required feasibility study.
 - b. Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives projects will be preliminarily ranked by the TIP Subcommittee; Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives Project Applications will be preliminarily ranked by the BPAC Project Review Subcommittee. The Volusia-Flagler TPO Board will approve a final ranking of all projects.
 - c. The Volusia-Flagler TPO's consultant will perform a feasibility study on each proposed project in ranked order as funding becomes available. The Volusia-Flagler TPO will pay 90% of the study cost; the Applying Agency will be responsible for the remaining 10% (cash match).
- 4. Projects applications for <u>project implementation</u> (feasibility study or equivalent has been completed):
 - a. Applying Agency (project sponsor) will submit an application for project implementation, including the FDOT Project Information Application Form, and an official letter agreeing to provide the required local match for state and/or federal funds programmed on the project, and agreeing to pay for any cost overruns.
 - b. Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Project Applications will be preliminarily ranked by the TIP Subcommittee; Bicycle/Pedestrian and B/P Local Initiatives Project Applications will be preliminarily ranked by the BPAC Project Review Subcommittee. The Volusia-Flagler TPO Board will approve a final ranking of all projects.
 - c. The Volusia-Flagler TPO will coordinate with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to program the projects in FDOT's Work Program and the TPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in the order of priority set by the Volusia-Flagler TPO Board.

Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Eligible Projects

For projects to be listed on the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Eligible Projects list, project sponsors shall submit a letter of support listing any TRIP eligible projects(s) which are ready to advance into the TPO's Transportation Improvement Program and FDOT's Work Program and provide a commitment of local matching funds, if required.

Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Eligible Projects

For projects to be listed on the Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Projects list, project sponsors shall submit a letter of support listing any SUN Trail projects(s) which are SUN Trail eligible and are anticipated to be submitted for SUN Trail funding during the Program's Call for Projects.

Updated Cost Estimates and Letter of Continuing Support

Project Sponsors shall submit a letter for any currently ranked project affirming their continued support to retain each project on the priority list and provide updated cost estimates for all unfunded phases of each project they sponsor on the Regionally Significant Non-SIS, Tier "A", and Tier "B" project lists. This letter must be submitted to the Volusia-Flagler TPO on or before 4:00 p.m. on Friday, February 27, 2025.

The Volusia-Flagler TPO supports:

Funding Priorities:

- Increased transportation investments:
 - Analyze potential **new revenue sources** needed to preserve the transportation system
 - Develop a **resilient network** of transportation infrastructure
 - Establish **flexible and predictable funding** for transit projects
 - Stabilize funding levels for the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP)
 - Allow Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) and State Transportation Trust Fund (STTF) dollars to be used on local road improvements that are needed to support the SIS or state facility
 - **Equitable contributions** from all roadway users to support transportation

 - Increase funding and technical assistance to support the planning and implementation of smart cities, automated vehicle pilot projects, and other technology innovations
 - Establish laws that address the malicious and intentional interference of the proper functioning of transportation vehicles and systems
 - Continue promotion of interoperable and multi-modal smartcard technology that is compatible, universal, and accessible for use by all other smartcard technology systems
 - Support and funding for the regulation and infrastructure modifications needed to safely and effectively manage the expansion of micro-mobility devices
 - Require public electric vehicle support equipment (EVSE) to be open to all users regardless of membership to a specific charging network





- Examines current and projected public transportation and mobility needs for 2026-2035.
- Meets Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) requirements to qualify for Public Transit Block Grant funding on an annual basis.
- Builds on existing transportation and comprehensive plans.
- Provides a Strategic Plan for Flagler County that addresses projected population and economic growth.
- Identifies and prioritizes public transportation improvements.
- Develops a financial plan that is both cost-constrained and unconstrained.
- Offers an opportunity for public engagement from a variety of community residents and stakeholders – YOU HELP MAKE THE PLAN!





Flagler County Public Transportation (FCPT)




- 1. FCPT is the public transportation provider in Flagler County.
- 2. FCPT provides pre-scheduled, demand response services that operate door-to-door for those who qualify (ADA or Transportation Disadvantaged service).
- 3. Current service focuses on the disabled, elderly, or low-income residents with limited mobility options.
- 4. FCPT has a 27-vehicle fleet and is based out of the Flagler County Government Services building in Bunnell.
- 5. FCPT does not currently offer any fixed route or same-day scheduled service for the general public in Flagler County.

 Fiscal Year Ridership continues to grow and rebound toward prepandemic levels.








The TDP will look at existing and projected conditions in Flagler County for 2026-35 and examine the challenges and opportunities that may impact transit service needs. Questions to consider:

Flagler County Population Growth







- County population in 2025 estimated at 140,714 (2025 BEBR estimate) – a 47% increase since the 2010 Census (95,696)
- Population is most concentrated in Palm Coast, Bunnell, & Unincorporated areas near I-95
- Population is projected at over 200,000 by 2050 (Medium BEBR estimates)

- Over 65 population will continue to grow in the next ten years









Other Transit Dependent Populations




Previous Transit Development Plan (TDP) Findings

Previous TDP's (2022-24) found that Flagler County would benefit from additional public transportation services:

- Addition of more daily trips, weekday evening hours, and Saturday service to existing FCPT service
- Additional of new fixed routes:
 - Route 1 (Blue Route) Moody Corridor service connecting Bunnell to Flagler Beach
 - Route 2 (Red Route) Bunnell, Palm Coast & Belle Terre Parkway
- New Same-Day/On-Demand Service areas in/around Bunnell, Palm Coast, Flagler Beach
- Enhanced bus stops and a transfer center


