I. <u>Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum</u>

The River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Board meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by TPO Chairperson Cloudman. The roll was called, and it was determined a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held as a hybrid with thirteen voting members physically present and two voting members virtually present.

MOTION: A motion was made by Council Member Reinhart to allow members attending virtually to participate and vote. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hartman and carried unanimously.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

III. Public Comment/Participation

There were no public comments.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mayor Chasez to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by Council Member Johansson and carried unanimously.

V. Action Items

A. Review and Approval to Amend the List of Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Projects

Ms. Nicoulin explained the process of amending the List of Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Projects and introduced Mr. Tim Baylie, Director of Volusia County Parks, Recreation, and Culture.

Mr. Tim Baylie gave a PowerPoint presentation on the request for an amendment to the List of Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Projects. He gave a SUN Trail update that included Senate Bill 106 which was signed by the Governor on April 11, 2023. The new bill increased SUN Trail's recurring funding from \$25 million to \$50 million and added \$200 million in non-recurring funds allocated to the SUN Trail program for trails in the SUN Trail network. This allows for the development of trails in the Florida Wildlife Corridor. The bill allows for paved

trails such as asphalt, concrete, or other hard-packed surfaces on disturbed lands in the corridor but that does not include conservation land. He is proposing a wildlife corridor connection to the Coast-to-Coast Trail and the use of articulated concrete in the areas of conservation land.

Mr. Baylie answered board members' questions regarding the paths on the map; where Farmton is; if there were any undisturbed land in the wildlife corridor that would have to be disturbed for the trails in question; if hunting is allowed on any of the land; and how e-bikes fit in with the non-motorized trails.

MOTION: A motion was made by Vice Mayor Sander to approve amending the List of Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Projects. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor O'Conner and carried unanimously.

B. Review and Approval of Resolution 2023-18 Adopting the River to Sea TPO Apportionment Plan

[Handouts provided]

Chairperson Cloudman explained the Apportionment Plan in detail and stated that after each decennial census, the TPO must review the composition of their membership and metropolitan planning area boundaries. Following that, the TPO must submit an Apportionment Plan to the state. At last month's meeting, TPO staff gave a presentation of three scenarios for consideration; after discussion, the TPO Board provided direction to draft an Apportionment Plan that expands the TPO boundaries to cover all of Flagler County, adds an additional Flagler County voting member, splits the Small City Alliance into two groups (one that represents Volusia County small cities and one that represents Flagler County small cities), adds the town of Marineland to the Flagler County Small City Alliance and removes the weighted voting structure such that each seat equals one vote of equal weight.

Ms. Nicoulin noted that all MPOs are currently going through this process, and the Apportionment Plan is required to be submitted to the state by November 14th. She reiterated all that Chairperson Cloudman had mentioned regarding the Apportionment Plan. She gave more details regarding how the Small City Alliance voting rotation works. She noted additional information that was included in the agenda packet.

Commissioner Dance noted that there was unanimous consensus among the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners to include all of Flagler County.

MOTION: A motion was made by Vice Mayor Rogers to approve Resolution 2023-18 adopting the River to Sea TPO Apportionment Plan. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Sander.

Vice Mayor Rogers commented that the Bunnell Commission was in support of including all of Flagler County.

The motion carried unanimously.

VI. <u>Presentations, Status Reports, and Discussion Items</u>

A. Presentation and Discussion of the LPGA Blvd PD&E Study from US 92 to Williamson Blvd

Mr. Mark Trebitz, FDOT, gave a PowerPoint presentation on the LPGA Boulevard Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study, from US 92 to Williamson Boulevard. He reviewed the project's purpose and need. He showed the alternatives that were evaluated, and the corridor improvements being proposed. He also reviewed the Tomoka River Bridge improvements along with many of the I-95 improvements. He noted that the improvements would include three roundabouts and reviewed the benefits of those. He discussed the environmental evaluation and presented the preferred alternative of a signalized turbine interchange.

Ms. Chasez asked why there were no medians or landscaping on the bridges to aid with water drainage. With all the retention ponds in the area, it seems that a landscaped median would assist with water drainage and make it more attractive.

Mr. Trebitz stated that the bridges will only be concrete and will have medians without landscaping. He explained his background and education and stated that it is best not to have landscaping on a bridge due to inspections of the steel and cracked concrete.

Ms. Chasez stated that this bridge looks very massive with concrete, a 26 ½ foot wide median and not a very appealing look. She stated that she understands the use of concrete if it's more common, cost effective and makes it safer.

A number of other board members agreed with adding landscaped medians on the bridge.

Mr. Trebitz stated that he would take the TPO Board's comments back to his team.

Mr. Trebitz answered other questions regarding bigger retention ponds; if there are any wildlife traffic studies under the existing bridge; if the shared use path will be on the east side and west side; are negotiations still going on between the county and the state regarding Peninsula Drive, west of I-95 on LPGA; and are they going to consider a traffic signal in front of the Preserve at LPGA, when the Dunn extension is finished.

B. <u>Presentation and Discussion of VoRide Mobility on Demand Service Provided by Via Transportation D/B/A</u> River North Transit, LLC

Ms. Bobbie King, Volusia County Transit Services Director, introduced Ralf Heseler, Head of the Planning Department for the Transit Services Division that oversees Votran's operations. Mr. Heseler gave a PowerPoint presentation of the VoRide Mobility on Demand Service. He provided in-depth details of the new service to be provided on the west side of Volusia County. He discussed the areas of the intended routes, the benefits, and the hours of operation of the new service. He explained how the service works, provided details of the cost for customers, and discussed plans to expand to other areas of Volusia County in the future.

Mr. Heseler answered TPO Board member questions regarding how far in advance the service needs to be scheduled; the number and type of vehicles that will be used to implement phase I; the determining factors on the length of time before starting additional routes; and the plans to expand east past the New Smyrna Beach-Oak Hill area.

C. Presentation and Discussion of an Amendment to the Connect 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

Ms. Nicoulin discussed the I-95 at the US 1 interchange project in Ormond Beach. She stated that this project is part of the Moving Florida Forward Initiative to fund significant infrastructure projects across the state. She explained the initiative and noted that this project wouldn't have been funded for at least 10-15 years, if not for this initiative. Because the project received funding, the TPO is required to amend its LRTP. This will ensure that the funding identified in that plan matches up with how the funding will be coming to the TPO, including the dollar amounts and the timing of the funding. The TPO will open the proposed amendment up to a 30-day public comment period and bring it back in December for approval.

D. Presentation And Discussion of TPO FY 2022/23 Public Outreach Summary

Ms. Blankenship gave a PowerPoint presentation on the TPO's FY 2022/23 public outreach. She gave statistics on the attendance of all the advisory committees of the TPO; the TPO's website; and social media platforms. She mentioned that the TPO's monthly newsletter goes out to an average of 675 different organizations. Last year, the TPO attended 31 outreach events which is a 29% increase over the previous year. She provided highlights of some of the different outreach events the TPO attended during the last year and noted that the TPO partnered with FDOT for a lot of those events.

Ms. Blankenship answered TPO Board members' questions regarding expanding the TPO's social media presence to Next Door; and encouraging the cities to appoint members to the Advisory Committees.

E. <u>Presentation and Discussion of the River to Sea TPO's Guiding Resolutions and Project Applications for the Call for Projects</u>

Ms. Nicoulin discussed the TPO's Priority Project process in detail. She explained that the call for projects opens at the end of the year and gave examples of the different kinds of projects that can be submitted. She noted that the projects are ranked based on criteria that are established in the applications and that is what populates the Priority Lists which are submitted to FDOT for programming. Following that, the TPO reviews the process to see if there are any changes that need to be made. This year the subcommittees looked at the resolutions and policies that guide this process. She discussed changes to the Bike/Ped Project implementation application and resolutions. The recommended changes would remove the protected status of the top five projects and give the TPO the ability to potentially re-rank some projects. She also added that the TPO requires local governments during this time to submit any projects that they want to be considered for TRIP and SUN Trail funding. The TPO will be bringing these items back at the next meeting for adoption.

F. FDOT Report

Mr. Jonathan Scarfe, FDOT District 5 MPO Liaison Administrator, introduced Ms. Kia Powell, the new MPO Liaison for River to Sea TPO and Ocala/Marion TPO. He mentioned some of the projects in the monthly construction report. He referred board members to www.cflroads.com for the most up-to-date project information. He noted that the current Work Program Public Hearing virtual option began on October 16th and ran through the 20th. Comments will be accepted until November 3rd. He announced that FDOT will provide a presentation on the Work Program at the next TPO Board meeting.

VII. Executive Director's Report

Ms. Nicoulin announced that since the last board meeting, the TPO received notification from FDOT that we were released from special conditions status. She noted that the TPO will continue invoicing the same as we have recently been doing and FDOT will reassess risk during the next certification in the February/March timeframe. She recognized the TPO staff's effort and time in getting the us to where we are now and gave special thanks to Ms. Mariel Lemke, Accounting Manager, for her hard work.

Ms. Nicoulin stated that the TPO has been undergoing an Office of Inspector General (OIG) audit. The last update received was that the draft report was finished and being reviewed in-house. She noted that the TPO received the Federal Certification Review Report that showed no corrective actions, six noteworthy practices, and two recommendations. The FHWA will attend the next TPO Board meeting to give a presentation of the report.

Ms. Nicoulin announced that next month's TPO Board meeting will be held on December 6th at Daytona Beach International Airport in the Dennis McGee room, which is located upstairs.

VIII. River to Sea TPO Board Member Comments

Commissioner Dance announced the Palm Coast Bike Rodeo on November 3rd. He also wanted to know how to start the process of having the Old Dixie Highway and Old Kings Road interchange looked at to include pedestrian accessibility as there is no pedestrian connectivity from Old Kings Road to the Publix.

Ms. Nicoulin stated that she would start that conversation with FDOT and noted that a study on the I-95 corridor is beginning.

Vice Mayor Sander congratulated the TPO staff on clearing the special conditions and he thanked the staff for all the hard work that went into getting the special conditions status lifted.

Vice Mayor Lindlau announced the hiring of a new city manager in Oak Hill and provided their credentials. He also asked for an update on the relocation of the TPO office.

Ms. Nicoulin stated that the office relocation will be discussed at next week's Executive Committee meeting and that the core area is being looked at.

Chairperson Cloudman thanked Mayor Partington for covering last month's TPO meeting in his absence.

A. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2023-19 AMENDING THE CONNECT 2045 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN (LRTP) (ROLL CALL VOTE REQUIRED)

Background Information:

The Florida Department of Transportation is requesting an amendment to the Connect 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) to reflect updated funding for the I-95 at US 1 Interchange project.

This project received funding through the Moving Florida Forward Infrastructure Initiative. Following the completion of the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) phase, all remaining phases for the project; design (PE), right of way acquisition (ROW), and construction (CST), are advanced to more nearterm time frames than originally reflected in the LRTP. To achieve planning consistency and ensure the projects will move forward as scheduled, the updated funding needs to be reflected in the Connect 2045 Cost Feasible Plan. The amendment is further described in the attached FDOT request letter and supporting documentation.

The requested amendment was presented at the October 25, 2023 TPO Board meeting as an information item. Following the meeting and in accordance with the TPO Public Participation Plan, a 30-day public review and comment period was provided. Comments received through November 29, 2023 at 12:00 p.m. are included in the agenda package. Any additional comments received after this date will be provided to the TPO Board as a handout at the December 6, 2023 meeting.

The requested amendment was presented to the Citizens Advisory Committee and the Technical Coordinating Committee as an action item at their November 21, 2023 meetings. Both committees recommended unanimous approval of the amendment.

Dear Ms. Nicoulin:

During the 2023 Legislative Session, Governor DeSantis proposed, and the Florida Legislature then passed the *Moving Florida Forward Infrastructure Initiative*. As part of the initiative, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) identified a selection of critical needs on state-owned roadways. Additionally, FDOT identified previously approved projects with broad community support that only lacked funding to begin construction. Due to Florida's sound fiscal health, \$4 billion from the General Revenue Surplus has been dedicated to the *Moving Florida Forward Infrastructure Initiative* to advance construction on these projects around the state that will address congestion, improve safety, ensure the resiliency of our transportation network, and enhance Florida's supply chain and economic growth.

River to Sea TPO and its regional area will benefit from this initiative with the advancement of the I-95 at US 1 interchange project. As the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) phase nears completion, all remaining phases; design (PE), right of way acquisition (ROW) and construction (CST), are advanced to more near-term time frames than originally reflected in the LRTP.

PE and ROW phases have been moved into the current fiscal year and design is scheduled to begin prior to June 30, 2024. The construction phase has been moved to FY 2027.

Additionally, projects cost estimates have been refined and funding for these project phases has increased more than \$50M and 50% of the project costs currently showing in the LRTP.

To achieve planning consistency and complete the PD&E, and ensure the project will move forward as scheduled, FDOT is requesting River to Sea TPO amend the 2045 LRTP to revise project details for these projects.

As a result of the Moving Florida Forward initiative, project #419772-3 has been advanced and has received additional funding. These changes require a TIP amendment to achieve planning consistency and receive authorization for use of funds.

Project #453318-1 is a safety project added to the TIP. The project will install pedestrian and bike detection equipment to the Main Street bridge and the Knox Memorial bridge over the Halifax River.

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the designated Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) comprised of Volusia County and the urbanized areas of Flagler County including the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, 23 C.F.R. 450.104 provides that the River to Sea TPO shall annually endorse, and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required, among which is the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program projects list of the annual Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) submission; and

WHEREAS, each year the appropriate River to Sea TPO committees, made up of a cross-section of interested citizens and technical staff, are charged with the responsibility of drafting a list of prioritized projects; and

The River to Sea TPO's total Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (SU) funding goals will be made in the following manner: 40% of the total SU funds will be used for Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations focused) Project Priorities, 30% of the total SU funds will be used for Transit Project Priorities, and 30% of the total SU funds will be used for Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian focused) Project Priorities; and
- 2. Other state and federal funds identified in the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan for Local Initiatives will be made available in the following manner: 50% of the funds will be used for Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives (traffic operations focused) Project Priorities and 50% will be used for Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives (bicycle/pedestrian focused) Project Priorities; and
- 3. Mixed projects (defined as a project that is not a stand-alone bicycle or pedestrian project) will only be accepted and ranked in both the bicycle/pedestrian focused and the traffic operations focused project categories if the bicycle/pedestrian cost component of the project is greater than 20% of the total project cost. Projects that do not meet this threshold shall be submitted and ranked in the traffic operations focused category only. The project applications shall include the cost breakdown between the bicycle/pedestrian component and the traffic operations component of the project. When programming mixed projects, funding amounts drawn down from each set-aside category (bicycle/pedestrian focused vs. traffic operations focused) shall be consistent with the cost component of that category; and
- 4. For projects funded in whole or in part with Urban Attributable (SU) funding and/or other state and federal funds obtained through the TPO's Priority Project Process, if the recipient of the funds chooses to display any signs or markers at the project site, said signs or markers shall include language acknowledging the River to Sea TPO, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), and/or other funding partners, as may be applicable, for providing funding for the project. In addition to the language, the sign or marker shall include these agencies' official logos; and
- 5. Additionally, any public pronouncements made by or on behalf of the recipient regarding the project, including press releases, publications, annual reports, video credits, and dedications, shall acknowledge the funding support provided by the TPO, FDOT, FHWA, and FTA; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the designated Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) comprised of Volusia County and the urbanized areas of Flagler County including the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, the FOOT funds projects in the Work Program based on the plans and priorities set by the TPO; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea TPO desires to provide, whenever possible, financial assistance to governmental entities to allow them to pursue transportation projects and programs which are consistent with the TPO's plans and priorities and benefit residents of and visitors to our planning area; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea TPO wants to leverage the state and federal transportation funds programmed on transportation projects in TPO's MPA and ensure a measure of local financial commitment to transportation projects and programs utilizing these funds; and

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the River to Sea TPO that:

- 1. Every governmental entity receiving state and/or federal transportation funds for a project on any of the following Priority Project lists shall provide a local match at a minimum ratio of 10% local funds to 90% state and/or federal funds:
 - a. Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects;
 - b. Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives Projects.

 This match requirement shall not apply to projects on the State Highway System; and
- 2. Every governmental entity receiving state and/or federal transportation funds for a project on the TPO's Priority list of Transportation Planning Studies shall provide a local match at a minimum ratio of 10% local funds to 90% state and/or federal funds; and

- 3. A local match shall not be required for any project on the TPO's Priority Lists of Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Projects, Regionally-Significant Non-SIS Roadway Projects, or Transit Projects, subject to any other funding program requirements that may apply (e.g., Transportation Regional Incentive Program); and
- 4. the River to Sea TPO determines that "local match" shall be defined as non-state/non-federal cash match and/or in-kind services of eligible costs that advance the project in question; and
- 5. notwithstanding the terms prescribed in subparagraph 1 and 2, above, the required local match shall not exceed the ratio required in the current policy of the TPO Board at the time the governmental entity requests funding unless the local government entity commits to a higher local match for the project; and
- 6. the River to Sea TPO reserves the right to waive or adjust the local match requirements if the TPO Board deems there exists sufficient reason or circumstance; and
- 7. the River to Sea TPO defines a cost overrun as an increase in the amount of the cost of any programmed project phase due to a change in scope, project limits or project approach that could have reasonably been foreseen or is the result of an incomplete, insufficient or out of date cost estimate; and
- 8. the River to Sea TPO reaffirms its policy that any cost overruns encountered on a project funded with state and/or federal transportation funds will be the responsibility of the governmental entity identified as the project originator with the following exception: if the project is on the state highway system and the State DOT is the project manager of record then the state shall be responsible for any cost overruns utilizing state dollars; and
- 9. the River to Sea TPO defines a cost increase as an increase in the cost of any programmed project phase due to unforeseen market changes or a change in requirements and/or standards for projects that have current and complete cost estimates; and
- 10. Requests for additional state and/or federal funds must be submitted to the TPO and include a statement of hardship or justification by the governmental entity identified as the project sponsor along with supporting documentation that includes detailed justification of the change in cost; and
- 11. the River to Sea TPO Executive Director may authorize the use of state and/or federal funds to cover some or all of a justified cost increase on any project phase up to and including 50% of the project cost estimate for that phase; and
- 12. the use of state and/or federal funds to cover cost increases exceeding 50% of the project cost estimate for any phase may be authorized only by the River to Sea TPO Board; and
- 13. the policies set forth in this resolution shall remain in effect unless and until they are repealed or amended by the TPO; and

F. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2023-24 REAFFIRMING THE POLICY FOR ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING TRANSPORTATION PRIORITY PROJECTS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Resolution 2023-24 restates the policy for establishing and maintaining the transportation project priorities. This resolution provides specific policy as follows:

- Establishes project categories and rankings
- Defines and sets protected projects
- Defines criteria for re-prioritizing or adding projects
- Requires annual project cost updates
- Requires commitment from project sponsors for Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) eligible projects
- Confirms project prioritization process will support the development of Regional Priority Lists

The following revisions are proposed for this policy:

- Protected categories (projects ranked one through five) have been removed on the Prioritized Florida Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Projects List and the Regionally Significant Non-SIS Projects List.
- One-time updates to cost estimates for construction following the completion of the design phase
- Project sponsors are required to submit a letter of support for any SUN Trail eligible projects that the local government intends to submit for SUN Trail funding during the State's open call for funding.

TPO Staff will provide additional information on the proposed changes. Resolution 2023-24 is provided with this agenda packet for your review and approval.

RESOLUTION 2023-24

RESOLUTION OF THE RIVER TO SEA TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION RESTATING THE POLICY FOR ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING TRANSPORTATION PRIORITY PROJECTS

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes 339.175; 23 U.S.C. 134; and 49 U.S.C. 5303 require that every urbanized area with a population of 50,000 or more, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, shall have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the designated Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) comprised of Volusia County and the urbanized areas of Flagler County including the cities of Flagler Beach, Beverly Beach, and portions of Palm Coast and Bunnell; and

WHEREAS, 23 C.F.R. 450.104 provides that the River to Sea TPO shall annually endorse, and amend as appropriate, the plans and programs required, among which is the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program projects list of the annual Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) submission; and

WHEREAS, each year the appropriate River to Sea TPO committees made up of a cross-section of interested citizens and technical staff are charged with the responsibility of drafting a list of prioritized projects; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the River to Sea TPO to establish project priorities for all areas of the TPO's MPA; and

WHEREAS, the River to Sea TPO reaffirms its commitment to the priority process and related policies; and

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the River to Sea TPO that the following policies are established to prioritize transportation projects throughout the TPO's MPA:

- 1. The project application and evaluation criteria approved by the River to Sea TPO Board shall be used to solicit and evaluate projects for priority ranking in the transportation program categories listed below:
 - a. Florida Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Projects;
 - b. Regionally Significant, Non-SIS Roadway Projects and Major Bridge Projects

- c. Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects;
- d. Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives Projects;
- e. Public Transit Projects; and
- f. Transportation Planning Studies.
- 2. River to Sea TPO projects that were previously ranked and have a Financial Management (FM) number and are in the Florida Department of Transportation Work Program will automatically be prioritized above projects that are not currently in the FDOT Five-Year Work Program;
- 3. Projects which are ranked one through eight on Tier "B" of the Prioritized List of Traffic Operations, Safety, and Local Initiatives Projects are deemed to be protected, and will be ranked in their current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are completed and drop out of the Work Program;
- 4. Projects which are ranked one through three on Tier "B" of the Prioritized List of Bicycle/Pedestrian, Transportation Alternatives, Regional Trails, and Local Initiatives Projects are deemed to be protected, and will be ranked in their current spot or move to the next available higher spot until they are completed and drop out of the Work Program;
- 5. If, at any time, two or more lists of prioritized projects are merged into a new list, every project that was protected prior to the merger shall retain its protected status, and no new or previously unprotected project shall be deemed to be protected unless and until it advances to the protected rank prescribed for the new, merged list;
- 6. The River to Sea TPO will only re-prioritize or add projects when the TPO Board determines:
 a) unusual circumstances support such action, b) the circumstances are not of a recurring nature, c) the circumstances do not result from the actions of the project sponsor, and d) the proposed reprioritization or addition will not be contrary to the public interest;
- 7. Requests to change the priority or to add a project must include a statement of hardship by the requestor along with supporting documentation that includes detailed justification of need and an assessment of the impacts to the programming of prioritized projects;
- 8. It is the responsibility of the River to Sea TPO and FOOT staffs to provide the River to Sea TPO members with current information and data on project status and to assist the members in their efforts to make informed decisions regarding the prioritized projects lists;
- 9. The River to Sea TPO shall, in its discretion, make all decisions regarding the final prioritized project lists that are annually submitted to FDOT;
- 10. Once a project has attained protected status, it should be programmed within 3 years. If it has not been programmed during that time due to inactivity on the part of the project sponsor, then the project will be removed from the list of priority projects. The project sponsor may resubmit the project for open ranking on any subsequent call for projects;

- 11. Per the approved Annual Call for Projects schedule, the project sponsor shall annually submit a letter to the River to Sea TPO affirming their continued support to retain each project on the priority list and provide updated cost estimates for all unfunded phases of each project they sponsor on the Regionally Significant Non-SIS, Tier "A", and Tier "B" project lists. Updated cost estimates for projects or project phases that are currently funded/programmed are considered a request for additional funding and subject to the TPO's cost increase/cost overrun policy. Requests for additional funding shall be submitted to the TPO on the appropriate form. Pending availability of funds, updates to planning level construction costs (CST/CEI) that were programmed prior to completion of the design (PE) phase may be updated one time following the completion of the PE phase without being considered a request for additional funding.
- 12. The letter shall also provide support from the project sponsor for any Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) eligible project(s) which they are ready to advance into the Work Program and TIP and provide a commitment of local matching funds, if required, and any SUN Trail eligible projects which the local government intends to submit for SUN Trail funding during the State's open call for funding. These projects shall be compiled into an unranked TRIP List and unranked SUN Trail list;
- 13. The River to Sea TPO shall use this project prioritization process to support the development of Regional Priority Lists in the areas of Trails, Transit, Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSM&O), and Planning Studies;
- 14. The policies set forth in this resolution shall remain in effect unless and until they are repealed or amended by the TPO; and
- 15. the Chairperson of the River to Sea TPO, (or their designee) is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this resolution to the:
 - a. Florida Department of Transportation (FOOT);
 - Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation); and
 - c. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) (through the Florida Department of Transportation).

H. REVIEW AND APPROVAL TO AMEND THE LIST OF SHARED-USE NON-MOTORIZED (SUN) TRAIL PROJECTS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Flagler County is requesting the addition of two trails to the River to Sea TPO's List of Shared-Use Non-Motorized (SUN) Trail Projects - Tier B, in order to apply for Sun Trail funding during the program's open call for projects, which opened on September 27, 2023, and closes on December 20, 2023. To be considered for funding in the SunTrail program, a project must be included in the local TPO's priority list.

The first proposed trail, the Old Kings Road Trail, will start at the Volusia/Flagler County line and end at the Palm Coast Linear Trail along Palm Coast Parkway.

The second proposed trail, the Old Brick Road Trail, will start at the intersection of the Lehigh Trail and US 1 and end at the Flagler/St. Johns County line. This trail will provide a connection to the Florida Wildlife Corridor.

We request the following two trail alignments in Flagler County to be added to the R2CTPO SUN Trail list of priority projects:


- 1) The Old Kings Road Trail (from Palm Coast Pkwy to Flagler/Volusia County Line) has been recently added to the SUN Trail Network. Development of a multi-use trail along the Old Kings Road corridor has been a priority for Flagler County under its Transportation Alternative Program. The addition of Old Kings Road Trail to the SUN Trail Network will provide further funding opportunities for advancing the planning and implementation for completing the development of the trail and making improvements to the existing trail sections.
- 2) The proposed Old Brick Road Trail (from St. Johns/Flagler County Line to US-1) is within the Florida Wildlife Corridor in Flagler County that would link to the existing Lehigh Trail and the SUN Trail Network at the Old Kings Road Trail. Revitalization of historic Old Brick Road for multi-use trail has been a priority project for Flagler County under its Transportation Alternative Program. The proposed project study would investigate and evaluate alternatives for revitalization of historic Old Brick Road for recreational multi-use trail.



A. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF FDOT'S TENTATIVE FIVE-YEAR WORK PROGRAM FOR FY 2024/25 TO FY 2028/29

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Each year, FDOT develops the Five-Year Work Program in accordance with Section 339.135, Florida Statutes. The Five-Year Work Program is an ongoing process that is used to forecast the funds available and allocate those to transportation system improvements over a five-year period.

The development of this Work Program involves coordination with local governments, including Metropolitan Planning Organizations and other city and county officials. In urbanized areas, Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) have the responsibility to develop transportation plans and prioritize transportation needs. FDOT implements the transportation improvements identified by the TPOs and local governments. During the process, new projects are added, and existing projects may be advanced or deferred based on the updated financial forecast. As a new fifth year is added to the cycle, the current year drops out of the plan and a new Five-Year Work Program is introduced.


The online Work Program Public Hearing for District Five was held virtually October 16 - 20, 2023 with an in-person open house held on October 17, 2023.

IV. PRESENTATIONS, STATUS REPORTS, AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

B. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE RIVER TO SEA TPO FEDERAL CERTIFICATION REVIEW REPORT

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Federal law requires the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to jointly review and certify the metropolitan transportation planning processes of Transportation Management Areas (TMAs) every four years. An urbanized area with 200,000 or more in population is referred to, in federal legislation, as a TMA. This certification review is conducted to highlight best practices, identify opportunities for improvements, and ensure compliance with regulatory requirements.

The Federal Review Team conducted a review of the River to Sea TPO on June 14-15, 2023. This review consisted of a Public Meeting, held on June 14, 2023, to solicit public feedback on the River to Sea TPO and the transportation planning process; and a site visit, conducted June 15, 2023, which consisted of a series of discussions with TPO staff and agency partners. In addition, the review team completed a desk audit that reviewed the documents and practices of the TPO. A public comment period was also open from June 14, 2023 through July 14, 2023 for additional feedback.

In October 2023, the federal review team issued the TMA Federal Certification Report, which identified six Noteworthy Practices, no Corrective Actions, and two Recommendations that would improve the performance of the Organization. Based on the overall findings, the FHWA and FTA jointly certify that the transportation planning process of the River to Sea TPO and the Palm Coast-Daytona Beach-Port Orange TMA substantially meets the Federal planning requirements of 23 CFR 450 Subpart C with certification effective until October 2027.

Federal law requires the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to jointly review and certify the metropolitan transportation planning process for each Transportation Management Area (TMA) every four years. A Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) with an urbanized area of 200,000 or more in population is referred to, in federal legislation, as a TMA. We recently conducted a review of the Palm Coast-Daytona Beach-Port Orange TMA commonly referred to as River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (R2CTPO).

As a part of the TMA certification review process, FHWA and FTA utilized a risk-based approach containing various factors to determine which topic areas required additional evaluation during the certification review. The certification review process is one of several methods used to assess: the quality of a regional metropolitan transportation planning process, compliance with applicable statutes and regulations, as well as the degree of technical assistance needed to enhance the effectiveness of the planning process. This certification review was conducted to highlight best practices, identify opportunities for improvements, and ensure compliance with regulatory requirements.

The review of R2CTPO's planning process included a site visit, conducted by representatives from the FHWA and the FTA on June 14 and 15, 2023. During the site visit, time was spent with the MPO staff, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), and the transit agency to discuss the status of the TPO's "3-C" planning process. Throughout the site visit, opportunities were afforded to local elected/appointed officials and the general public to provide their insights on the R2CTPO's planning process. In addition to assessing the MPO's progress in addressing the findings from the previous certification review, the MPO's current and/or future implementation of the metropolitan transportation planning requirements was also considered.

Enclosed for your consideration is the final TMA Certification Review Report for the Palm Coast-Daytona Beach-Port Orange TMA, which includes documentation of the various components of the FHWA/FTA certification review of R2CTPO. The report provides an overview of the TMA certification review process, summarizes the various discussions from the recent site visit, provides a series of review findings, and issues the FHWA/FTA certification action. In general, the review determined the existence of a "3-C" metropolitan transportation planning process that satisfies the provisions of 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303/5305, and associated Federal requirements. The Federal Review Team identified six (6) noteworthy practices, no corrective actions, and two (2) recommendations to improve the current planning process of R2CTPO.

Based on the overall findings, the FHWA and the FTA jointly certify that the transportation planning process of the Palm Coast-Daytona Beach-Port Orange TMA, which is represented entirely by R2CTPO, substantially meets the federal planning requirements in 23 CFR 450 Subpart C. This certification will remain in effect until October 2027.

C. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE URBAN AREA BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:


Every 10 years, after the Census is completed, updated population numbers determine changes in urban boundaries, which are preliminarily adjusted by the Census Bureau. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and state departments of transportation can determine if further refinements should be made for reasons such as consistency with the approach to transportation planning.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Five reviewed the Census urban boundaries in Volusia and Flagler counties and developed proposed adjustments. This smoothing process considered a range of factors including the existing urban boundary, new growth, and property parcel lines, where applicable.

TPO staff have coordinated with District Five regarding the proposed adjusted urban boundaries that are being presented today for review by local agencies. Following this review, the urban boundaries will be further adjusted, if necessary, and finalized for approval during the January TPO meeting cycle. Following approval, the Volusia and Flagler County maps with adjusted urban boundaries will be signed by the River to Sea TPO Board Chair and the FDOT Secretary for submission to FHWA.

The proposed Urban Area boundary adjustment maps are provided in the agenda package for review. TPO Staff will lead a discussion and provide additional information.

Boundary should be easy to discern.

Boundaries should be simple, without irregularities.

District Five Urban Boundary Dashboard


