**RESOLUTION OF THE VOLUSIA COUNTY METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO)
SUPPORTING THE EXTENSION OF THE RIVER OF LAKES HERITAGE CORRIDOR, A FLORIDA
SCENIC HIGHWAY, TO INCLUDE THE MAYTOWN ROAD CORRIDOR**

WHEREAS, the Florida Scenic Highway designation protects and showcases the natural, scenic, recreational, historical, cultural and archeological resources, helps establish community vision, enhances the travel experience, promotes tourism and economic development and provides education and history appreciation by telling Florida's story; and

WHEREAS, the River of Lakes Heritage Corridor, a 120 mile route extending through Volusia County, was designated a Florida Scenic Highway in February 2009; and

WHEREAS, the River of Lakes Heritage Corridor provides the citizens of, and visitors to, Volusia County with a route that showcases the natural and historic beauty of our community; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia County MPO recognizes that the Maytown Road Corridor, which extends from the River of Lakes Heritage Corridor Scenic Highway at SR 415 in Osteen, Florida, to the City of Oak Hill, Florida, includes a rich tapestry of history, culture, and natural beauty very much like that found along previously designated sections of the River of Lakes Heritage Corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Volusia County MPO further recognizes that the Maytown Road Corridor continues the story of "Old Florida" told along that previously designated corridor, and

WHEREAS, the Volusia County MPO supports the preservation and showcasing of the special natural, scenic, recreational, historical, cultural and archaeological resources of this corridor and to provide for the safe and efficient movement of vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of the Volusia County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) that the:

1. Volusia County MPO supports the extension of the River of Lakes Heritage Corridor Scenic Highway to include the Maytown Road Corridor from SR 415 in Osteen, Florida, to the City of Oak Hill, Florida; and
2. The Chairperson of the MPO, or her designee, is hereby authorized and directed to transmit this resolution to the following:
 - (a) the Governor, State of Florida;
 - (b) the Secretary of Transportation, State of Florida;
 - (c) the Secretary of the Department of Environmental Protection;

- (d) the Secretary of FDOT District V;
- (e) the Division of Resource & Management, Department of Community Affairs;
- (f) the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council; and
- (g) the members of the Central Florida MPO Alliance
