

Bicycle Safety Awareness Month



May is National Youth Traffic Safety Month. Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death for teens, with nearly 2,500 young people killed in crashes last year. Mile-for-mile, teens are involved in three times as many fatal crashes as all other drivers, says the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. An average of six teens die every day in traffic crashes throughout the U.S. It is important to remember that parents play a crucial role in encouraging their teens to drive safely.
