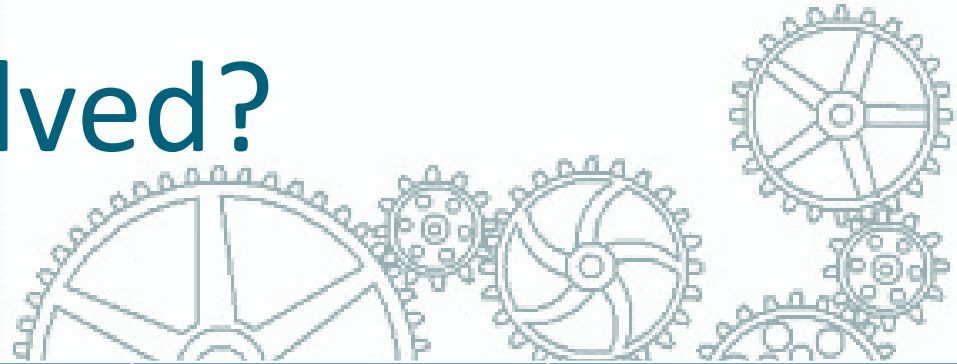


The River to Sea TPO “Call for Projects”

More importantly, how do we get those transportation projects completed?

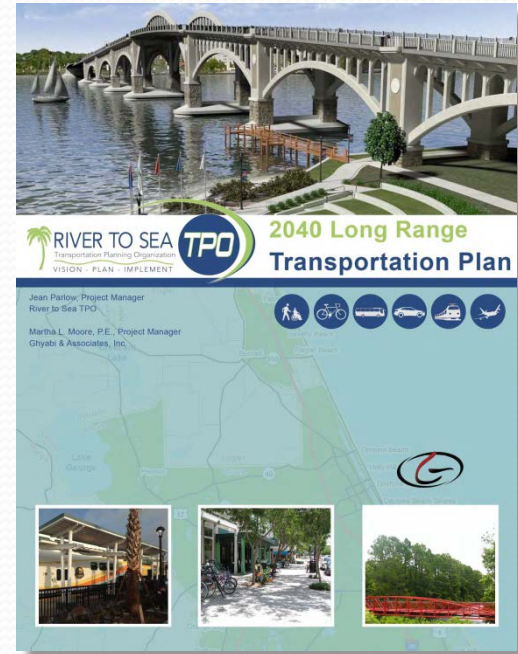

Ports (Air & Sea)	FDOT	Federal	Master Plans

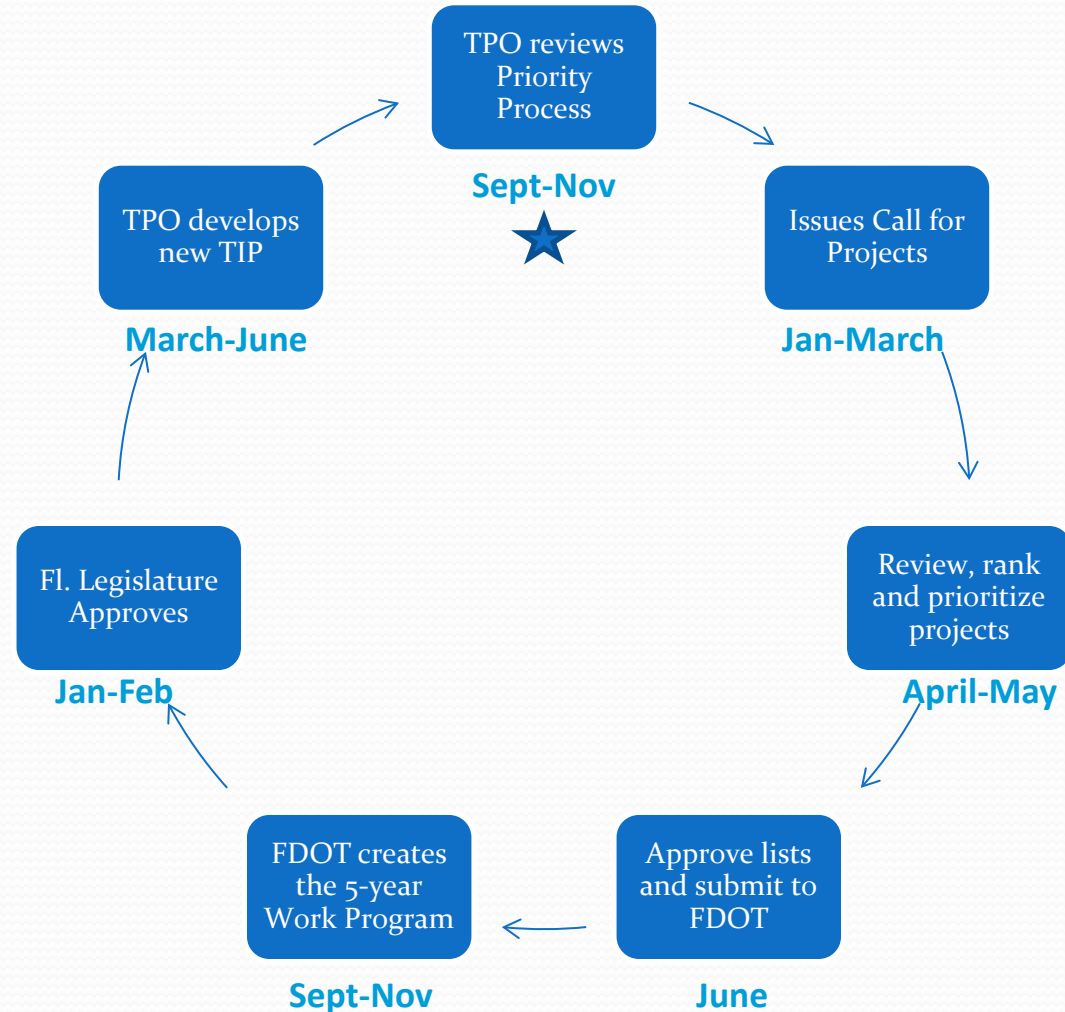
Role of the TPO

- Provide local input for transportation decisions using state & federal funding.
- Ensure expenditures for transportation projects and programs are based on a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive (“3-C”) planning process.



Transportation Priority Process

- 3 TPO resolutions provide guidance
 - Delineates local match and project cost increases
 - Establishes project categories and ranking
 - Allocates TPO Set-aside funding (SU)
- 3 project applications allow for annual submission of new projects
 - Traffic Operations (safety, technology)
 - Bicycle & Pedestrian (trails)
 - Planning Studies
