**Background:** Votran, the county's public transit service, began in 1975 to serve the Daytona Beach area. As Volusia continued to urbanize, population growth supported an expansion of service. Today, Votran service is available countywide. Ridership in fiscal year 2011-12 approached 3.9 million boardings, the fifth consecutive year of growth (fixed route ridership increased nearly 6 percent). Votran's adopted budget is approximately \$20 million and is funded by federal and state grants, fares and \$7.4 million from the county's general tax fund.

## **Votran fast facts:**

- Annual operating budget 2012-13 -- \$20 million
  Expenses: Personnel \$11.8 million; operations \$8.2 million
  Revenues operating: Federal \$4.8 million; state \$3.1 million; fares \$2.8 million; county general fund \$7.4 million; \$1.6 million carry over; \$452,000 advertising/miscellaneous
- Fleet 55 buses, four trolleys, 44 paratransit vehicles
- Miles per year 2011-12 6.1 million
- Employees 143 operators, 28 mechanics, 57 support staff (all McDonald Transit employees)
- Passengers in 2011-12 3.6 million fixed route; paratransit 278,000; trolley 39,000
- Fares \$1.25 one-way; \$3 all-day pass (seniors, youths, persons with disabilities half-fare price); paratransit \$2.50 one-way
- Daytime service Monday Saturday 6 a.m. 7 p.m.; Daytona Beach core area night service from 7 p.m. midnight and Sunday service from 6 a.m. 7 p.m.
