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RIVER TO SEA TPO COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY ACTION PLAN

PROJECT NARRATIVE

The Deltona-Daytona Beach-Ormond Beach Metropolitan Statistical Area, which covers Volusia and Flagler Counties, is consistently listed among the most dangerous areas in the nation for bicyclists and pedestrians and this year ranked as the deadliest according to the 2022 Dangerous by Design Report released by Smart Growth America.

The River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (R2CTPO), in partnership with Volusia and Flagler Counties as joint applicants, is committed to affecting change to protect all users of our transportation system by developing a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP) to identify implementable strategies aimed at eliminating fatalities and serious injuries on our roadways. While we continue to make our roads safer through education, project prioritization and programming, we must take further action and work collectively with our 22-member governments, agency partners, community stakeholders, and the public to develop an inclusive safe system approach to roadway safety.

The CSAP will be developed through a collaborative effort and include a community outreach campaign that involves the public and community stakeholders throughout the process to collect diverse input and ensure equitable representation across our communities. An analysis will be conducted to evaluate trends and circumstances specific to our region and identify locations with high rates of fatalities and serious injury crashes. This analysis will be used as the framework to develop the plan which will include a comprehensive set of projects and countermeasures to include both innovative technologies and high-impact strategies that can be implemented in communities throughout our region. The CSAP will also include a review of current policies and guidelines to identify opportunities for enhancements, an assessment of equity impacts of proposed strategies and a method to evaluate progress over time.

The R2CTPO recognizes that the current methods of addressing roadway safety are insufficient; systemic changes are needed to influence change.

RIVER TO SEA TPO COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY ACTION PLAN

BUDGET SUMMARY

The River to Sea TPO and our joint applicant partners, Volusia and Flagler Counties, have identified a \$400,000 budget for the development of the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP). This budget will fund a professional services consultant contract to guide all components of the development and production of the Final CSAP Document. Volusia County and Flagler County have committed to providing the 20% matching funds with Volusia County contributing \$60,000 and Flagler County contributing \$20,000. Both contributions are cash matches and will be used to fund the consultant contract.

The Plan will be developed in accordance with the Action Plan Components identified in the Notice of Funding Opportunity as follows:

- Leadership Commitment & Visioning/Goal Setting Commitment from the River to Sea TPO and our member governments to establish a Vision Zero goal and timeframe.
- Planning Structure Establishment of a working group consisting of technical advisors, agency partners and community stakeholders to oversee the development and implementation of the Action Plan.
- Safety Analysis Analysis of trends and circumstances specific to our region and identifications of locations with high rates of fatalities and serious injury crashes.
- Public Engagement and Collaboration Development of a community outreach campaign that involves the public and community stakeholders throughout the process to ensure equitable representation across our communities.
- Equity Considerations Assessment and analysis of equity impacts of proposed strategies.
- Policy and Process Changes Review of current policies, plans and guidelines to identify opportunities for enhancements and incorporate best practices
- Strategies and Project Selections Development of a comprehensive set of projects and countermeasures.
- Progress and Transparency Develop method to evaluate progress of plan implementation over time and ensure ongoing transparency throughout the plan development.
- Final Plan Documentation Documentation of the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan into final report format.
- Project Administration and TPO Coordination Overall project administration and consultant coordination with the River to Sea TPO.





I am writing this letter on behalf of the St Johns River-to-Sea Loop Alliance, a Florida nonprofit. Our mission is to support active, equitable mobility around the Loop corridor. The Loop is a 260-mile multiuse Florida state SUN (Shared-Use Multiuse) Trail. More than half the Loop's distance lies in the R2CTPO's region of Volusia and Flagler Counties.

The Alliance whole-heartedly supports the River to Sea TPO's application to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. We strongly believe the Safety Action Plan project has the potential to increase active equitable mobility as well as safety for all road users in Volusia and Flagler counties.

A Safety Action Plan that includes a multimodal mobility plan will increase safety for pedestrians, cyclists, transit users, users of mobility aids and all vulnerable road users. By developing a prioritized multimodal network map to connect users of alternate transportation with their destinations, this plan will (over time) not only increase safety for all road users, but it will also reduce traffic congestion and pollution by freeing people to choose alternate means of transportation.

The multimodal mobility plan and map will connect Volusia and Flagler's rich system of existing and planned multiuse trails with safe road routes to communities and important destinations such as schools, workplaces and shopping throughout our two counties. Volusia County estimates 5,000 people use our regional trails every day (1.8 million per year) for transportation, recreation and fitness. Frequently cyclists and pedestrians must travel unsafe roads and highways to get to safe trails.

Through careful data analysis of active mobility routes and gaps as well as fatalities and injuries, the multimodal mobility plan will allow the counties to prioritize and schedule work to improve all modes of transportation in Volusia and Flagler. A Volusia Trail Master Plan is already in development, and additional funding will enable the completion and expansion of the TMP to better connect the two counties and provide a model for other regions.

A prioritized plan to connect walkers, cyclists and users of transit and mobility devices with their destinations will not only make our two counties safer for vulnerable road users, but it also has the potential over time to reduce traffic, congestion, pollution, and other adverse impacts of our motor-vehicle-centric road system to the equity, economy and environment of our region.

The proposed Comprehensive Safety Action Plan project will improve safety and increase active equitable mobility as well as safety for all road users in Volusia and Flagler counties.

Since the River to Sea TPO does not cover all of Flagler County, Signal Four Analytics was used as an alternate source for fatality data in order to map fatalities that occur only within the TPO Boundary between 2016 - 2020. The FARS data is only available on a County-wide basis.

The overall project application includes fatalities for all of Volusia and Flagler Counties based on FARS data.
